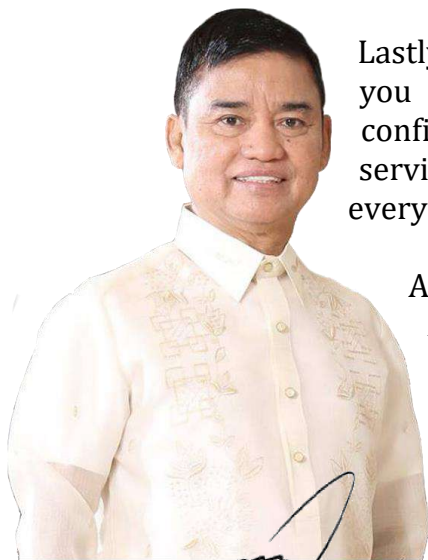

The **2024 Civil Registration Report** provides a detailed account of the activities and performance of the Local Civil Registry Office (LCRO) of Muntinlupa City for the year 2024. It presents data on the registration of vital events—including births, marriages, deaths, and other legal documents—in compliance with **Republic Act No. 3753** (Civil Registry Law) and the standards set by the **Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA)**.

This report aims to promote transparency and accountability by informing local government officials, partner agencies, and the public about the LCRO’s service delivery and operational outcomes.

# LIVE BIRTH REGISTRATION

Live birth is the complete expulsion of a product of conception from its mother, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, which the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or definite movement of voluntary muscles, whether or not the umbilical cord has been cut off or the placenta is still attached; each product of such birth is considered alive.

*-AO 1 series of 1993, IRR of ACT NO. 3753 also known as "Civil Registry Law"*

A vital record that documents the birth of a person.

**Timely registration:**

*Within 30 days from the date of birth*

**Payment :**

*For Married couples – Free registration*

*Delayed registration – P150*

**For Not Married couples:**

*Admission of paternity – P120*

*Affidavit to Use the Surname of the Father – P200*

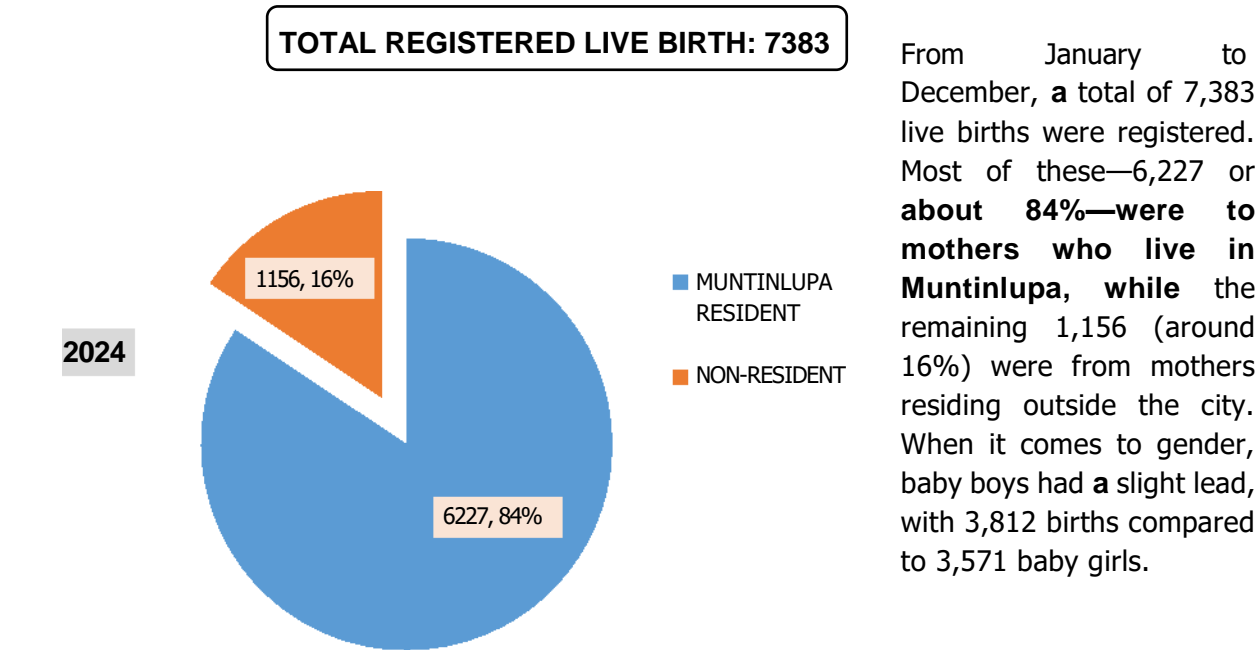

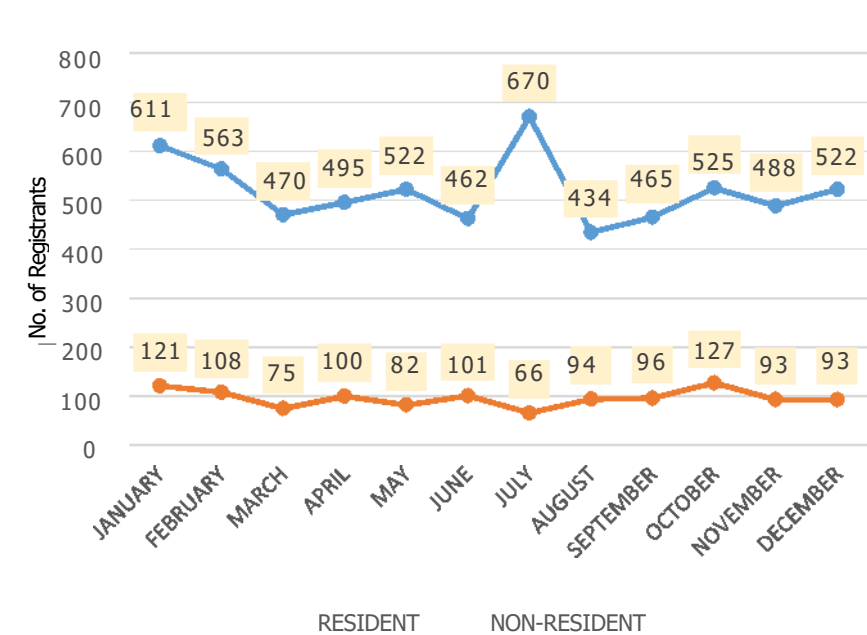


Figure 1.2 Line Chart of 2024 Birth Registrations by Residency and Month

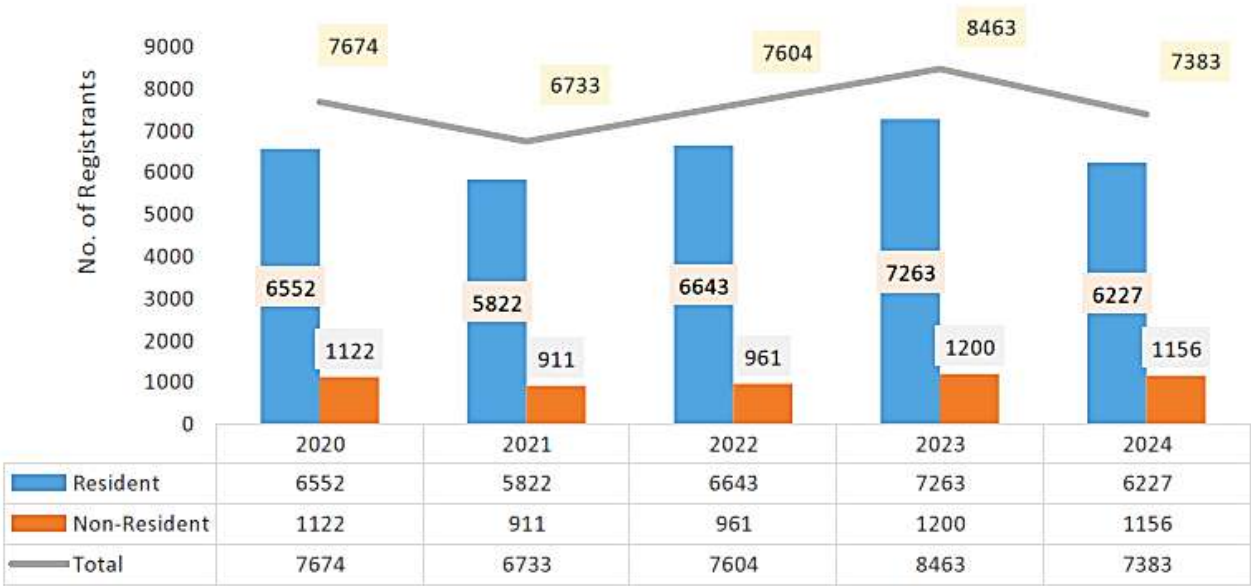


Figure 1.3 Line Chart of 2020-2024 Birth Registrations by Residency

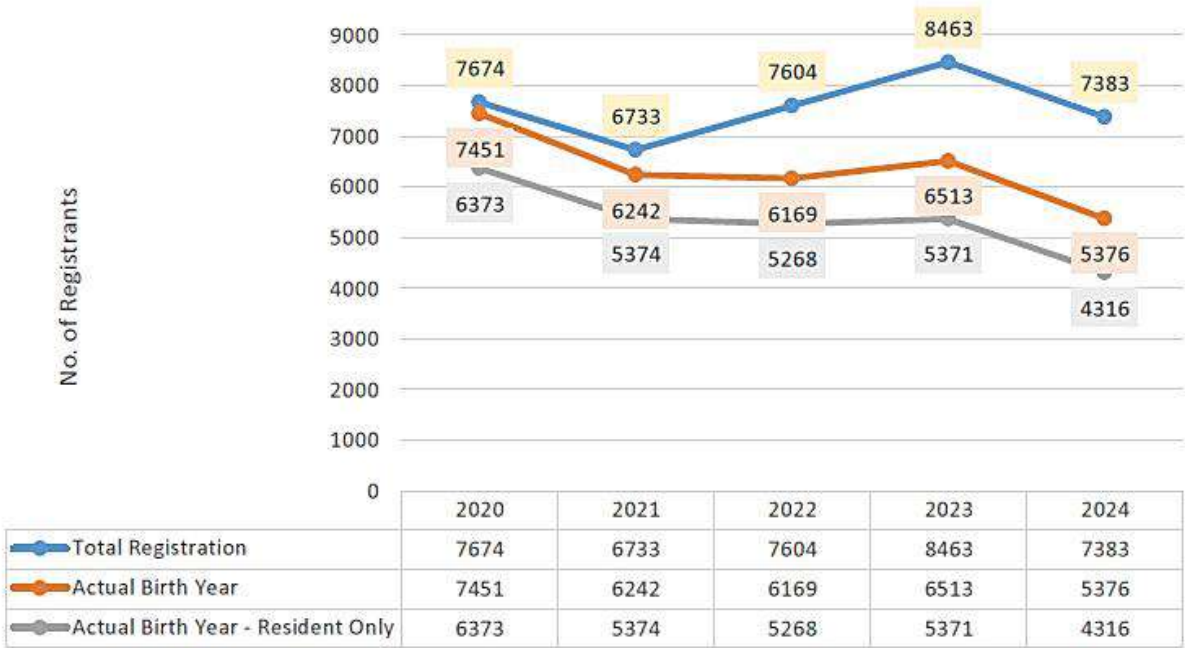


Figure 1.4 Line Chart of 2020 - 2024 Civil Birth Registrations, Actual Birth Occurrences and Residency

Figure 1.4 compares the total number of birth registrations with the actual birth year of the registrants. As shown in the chart, the numbers don't always match up. For example, in 2020, there were 7,674 registrations, but only 7,451 of those were for babies born in that year. The gap is likely due to late registrations or delays in reporting.

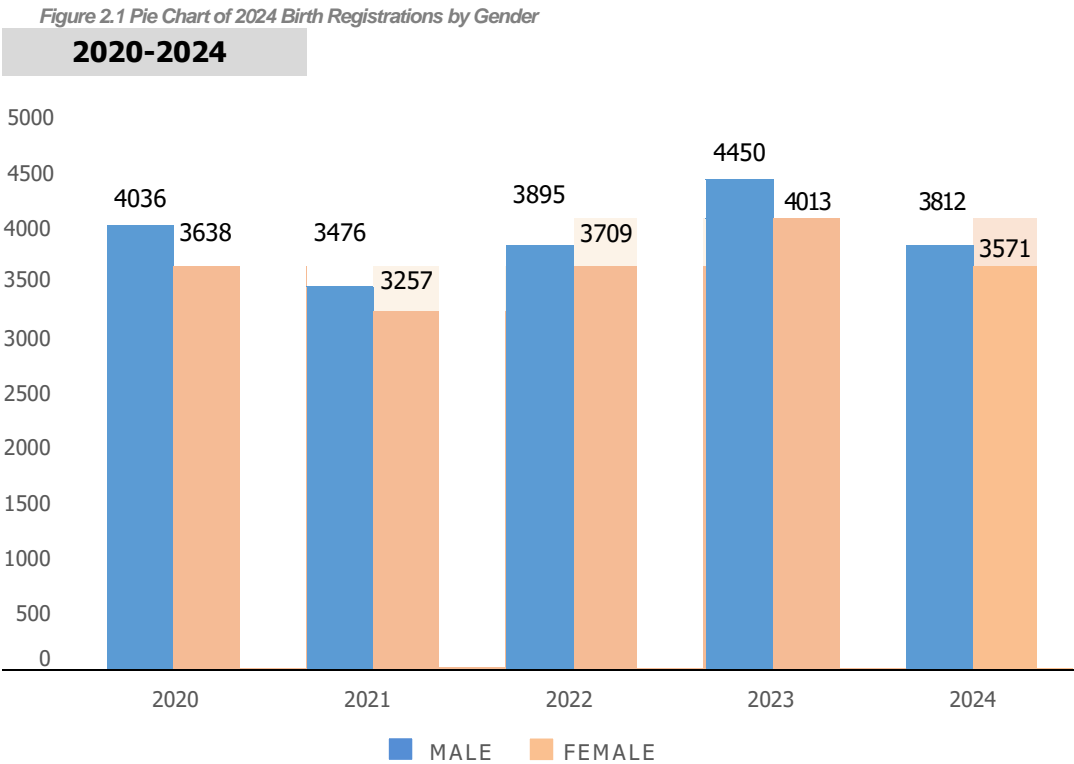
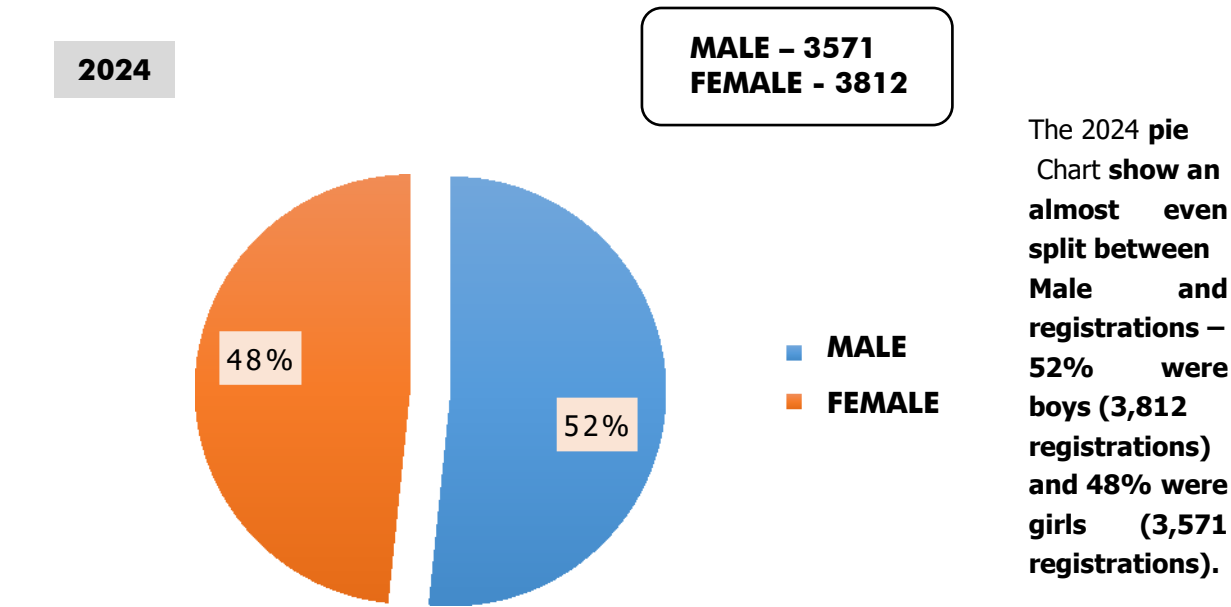


Figure 2.2 Bar Graph of 2020 - 2024 Birth Registrations by Gender

**Figure 2.2**, which covers the years 2020 to 2024, shows that male and female birth registrations have remained fairly close each year, with only slight variations. In 2020 and 2023, more boys were registered than girls, while in 2021, 2022, and 2024, girls slightly outnumbered boys.

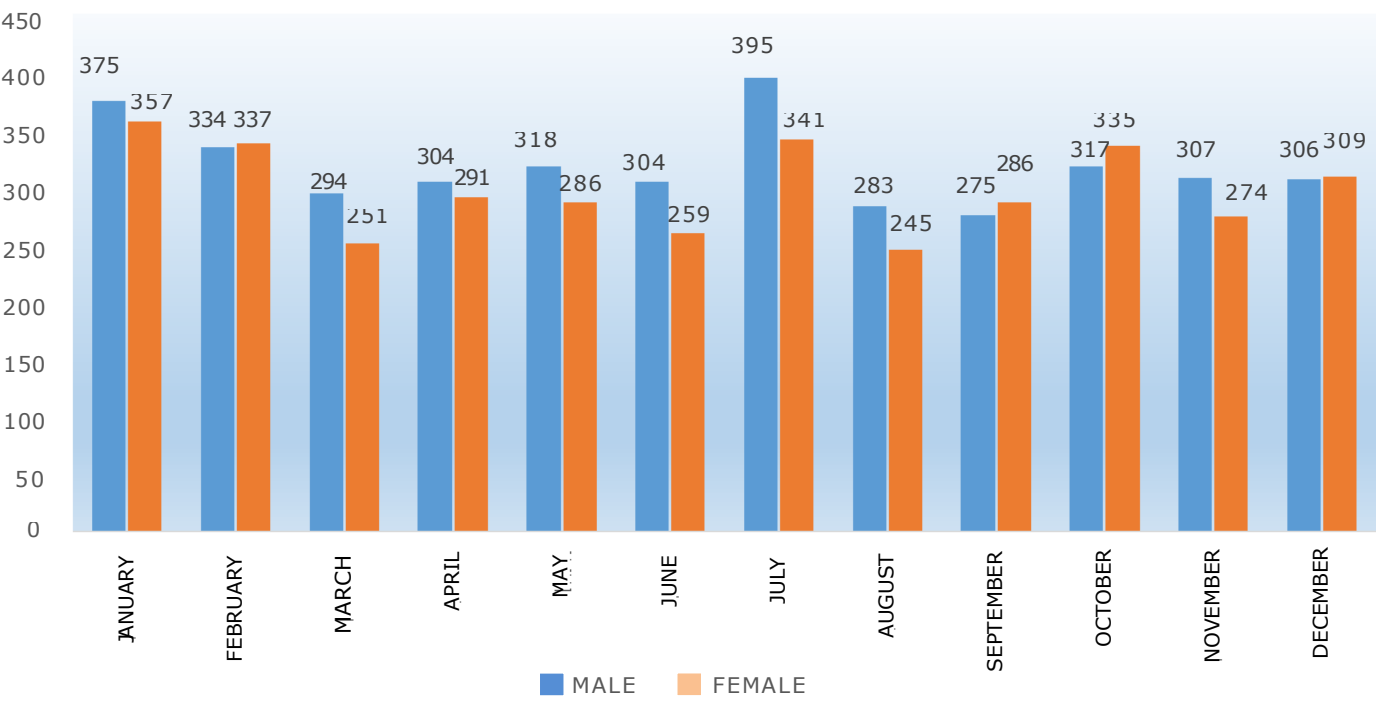


Figure 2.3 Bar Graph of 2020 - 2024 Birth Registrations by Gender

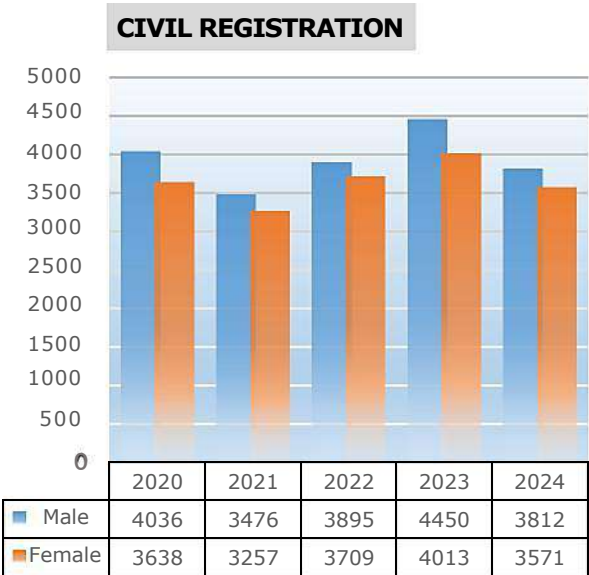


Figure 2.4 2020- 2024 Civil (Birth) Registration by Gender

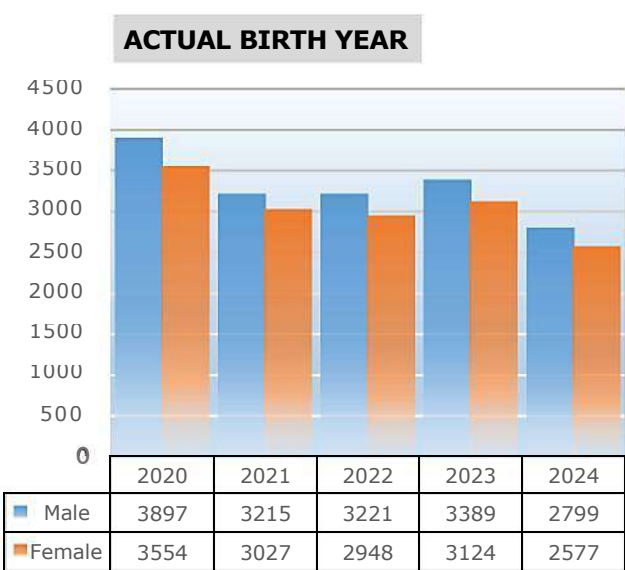


Figure 2.5 2020- 2024 Actual Registration by Gender

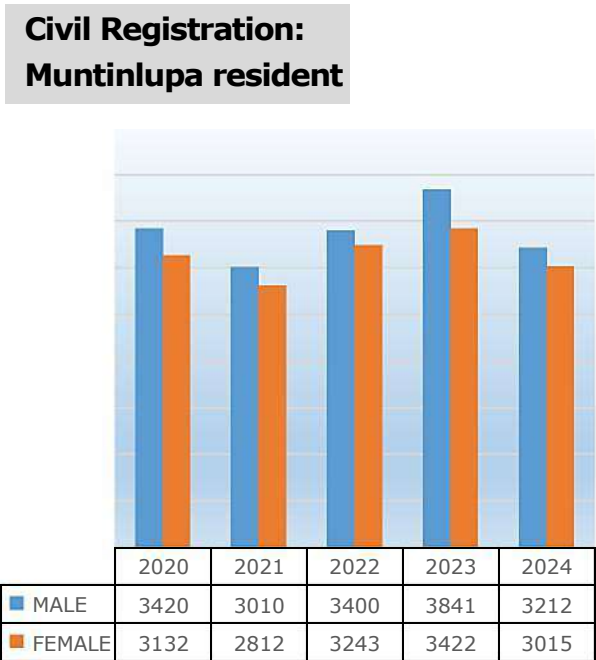


Figure 2.6 2020 - 2024 Civil Registration – Muntinlupa Resident

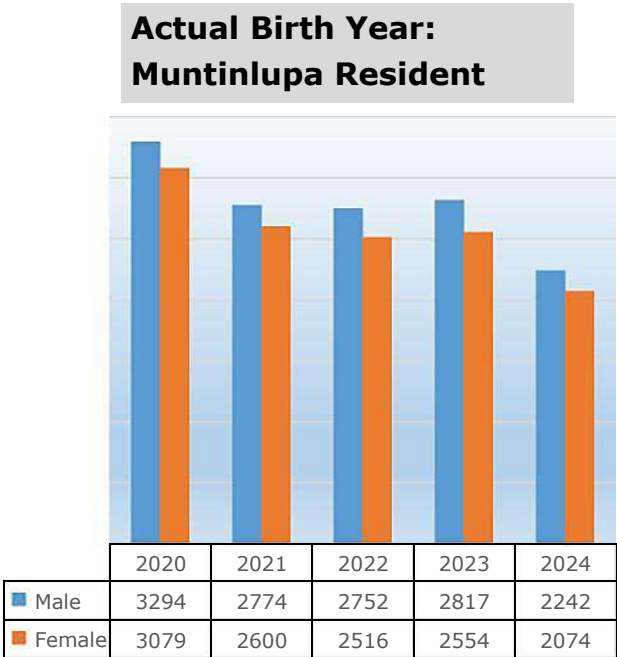


Figure 2.7.2020 - 2024 Actual Birth - Muntinlupa Resident

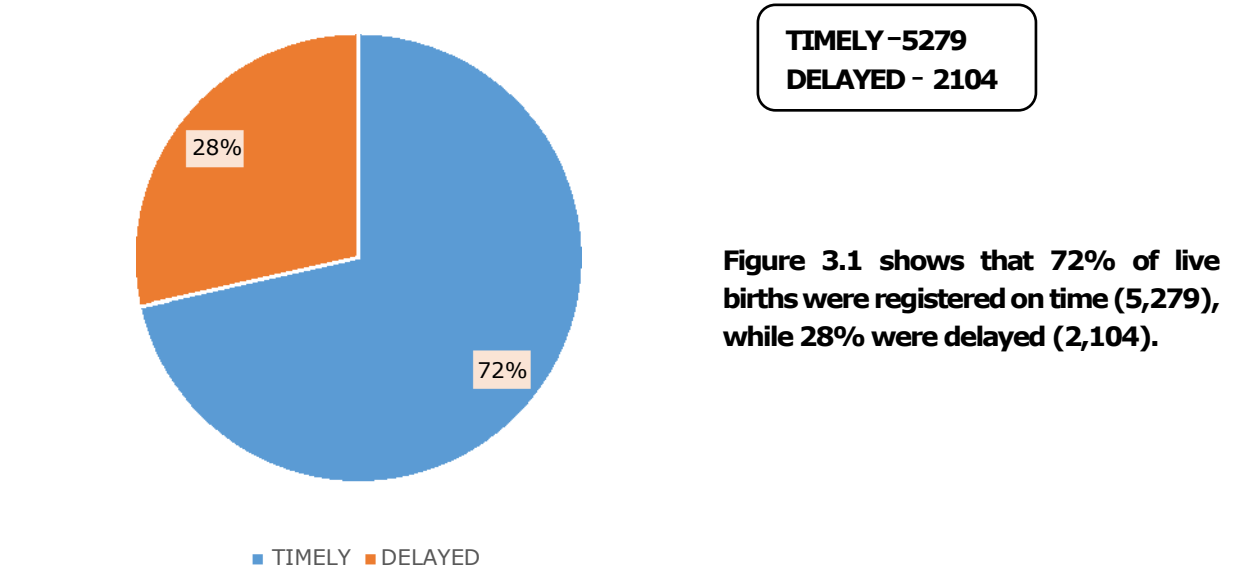


Figure 3.1 Pie Chart of 2024 Birth Registrations by Filing Status

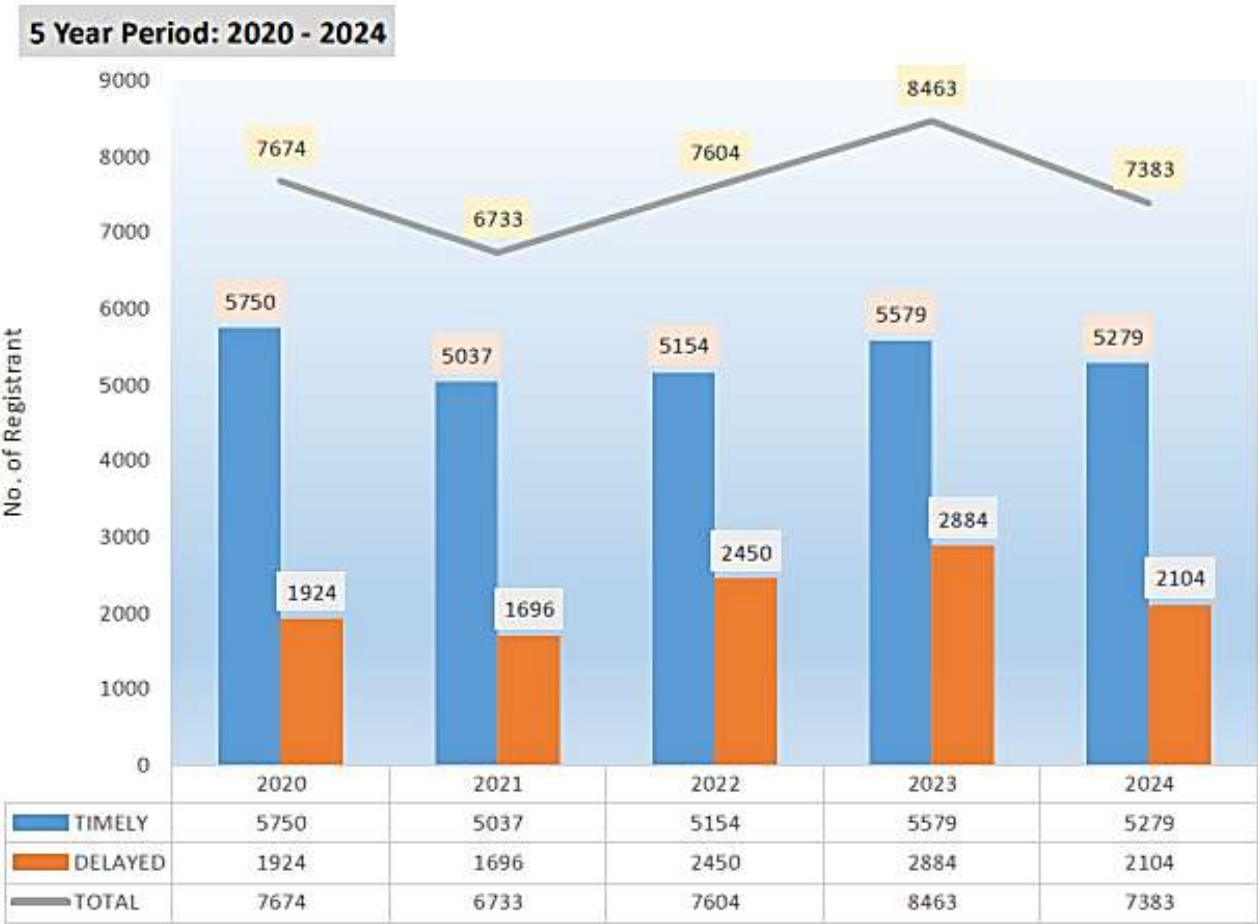


Figure 3.2 Bar Graph of 2024 Birth Registrations by Filing Status

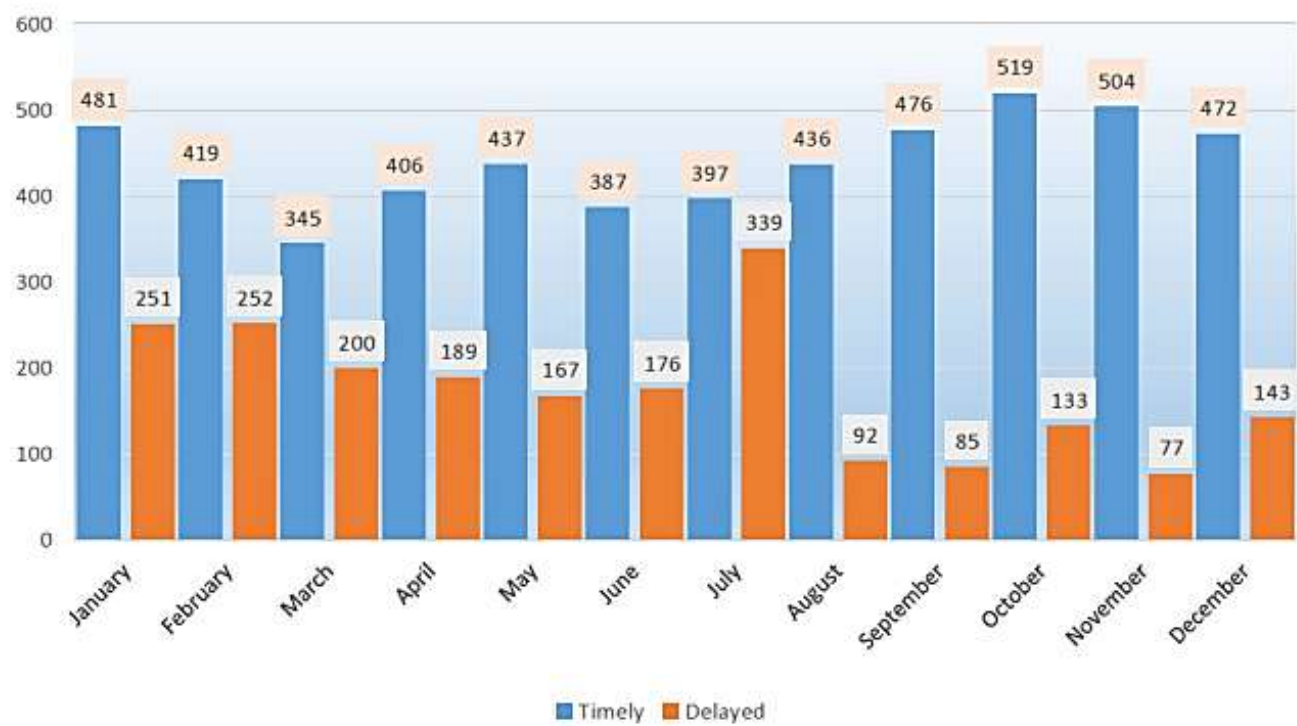


Figure 3.3 Bar Graph of 2024 Birth Registrations by Timeliness

**Looking** at the monthly breakdown for 2024 in the lower bar chart, timely registrations consistently outnumbered delayed ones throughout the year. **Interestingly, the number of delayed registrations dropped noticeably from August to December compared to the earlier months. This could point to an improvement in how quickly births were registered during the latter part of the year.**

Number of Late Registrations By Year of Birth

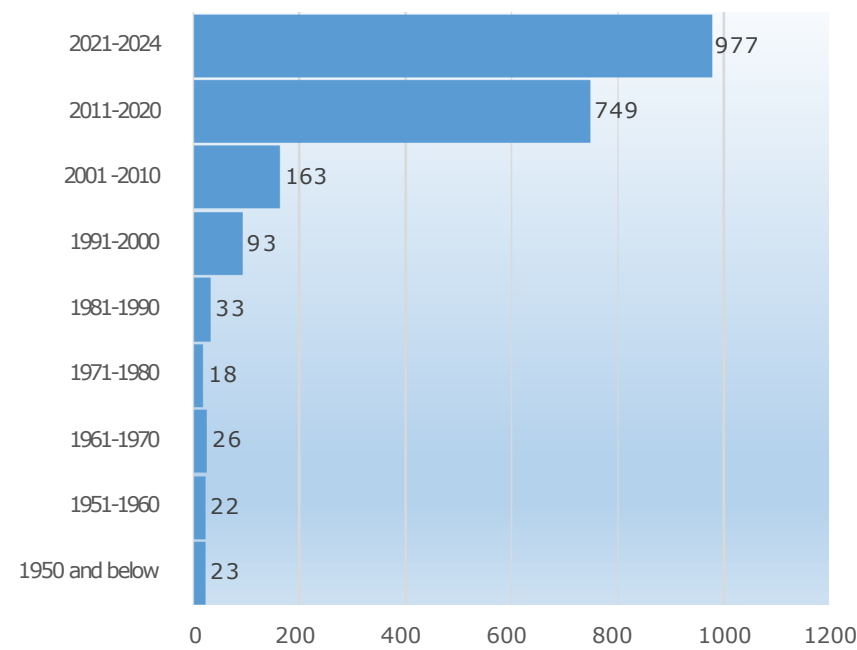


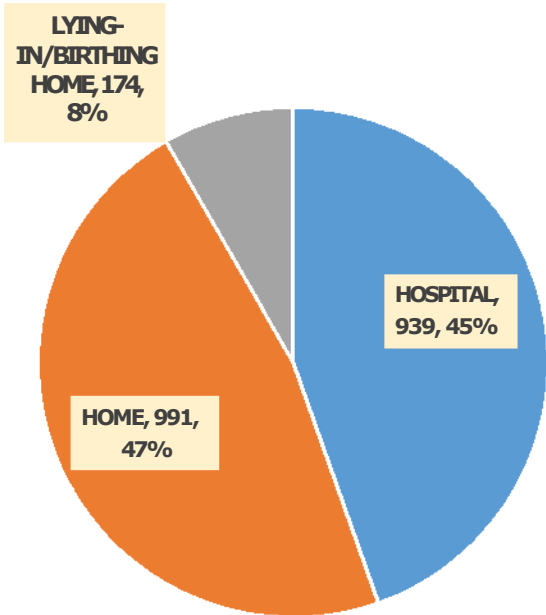
Figure 3.5 Bar Graph of 2024 Birth Registrations by Birth Year

**Most delayed registrations fall within the 1 to 5-year-old group, making up 44.15% of all delayed cases. The 6 to 17-year-olds come next with 27%, followed by children under 1 year old at 14.5%. Adults aged 18 to 59 account for about 11.7%, while the smallest share of delays—2.66%—is among those 60 and older. When we look at gender, delayed registrations are fairly balanced, with slightly more females (1,075) than males (1,029). However, the gender split varies somewhat across different age groups.**

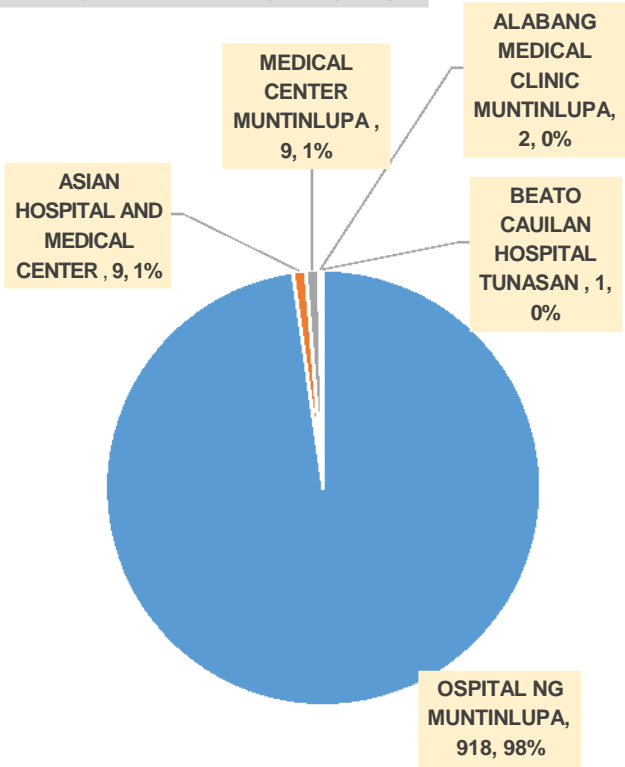

The majority of delayed Registrations come from Home births, representing 47% of the total cases (991). Hospital births account for a close 45% (939), while Births at lying-in or birthing comprise a smaller portion, approximately 8% (174 cases).

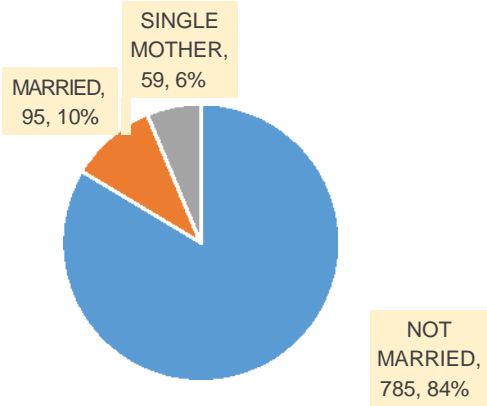


Figure 3.6.2. Pie Chart of 2024 Delayed Birth Registrations by Place of Occurrence - Hospital

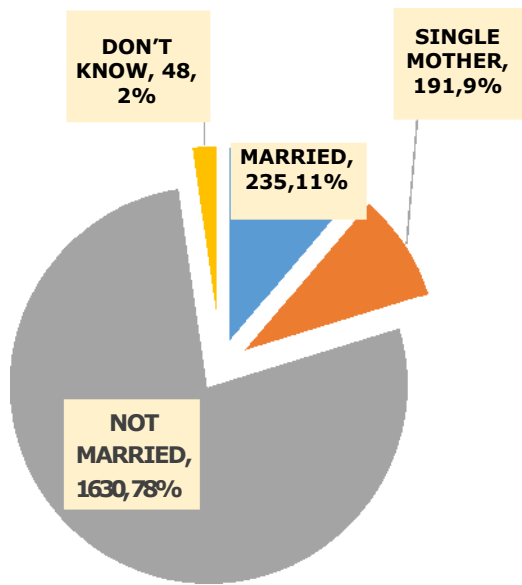

When it comes to delayed registrations, most cases—78% or **1,630**—involve parents who are **not married**. Married parents make up 11% (235 cases), and single mothers account for 9% (191 cases). A small 2% (48 cases) have an unknown marital status.

Overall, the data show that delayed birth registration happens most often with home births and when parents

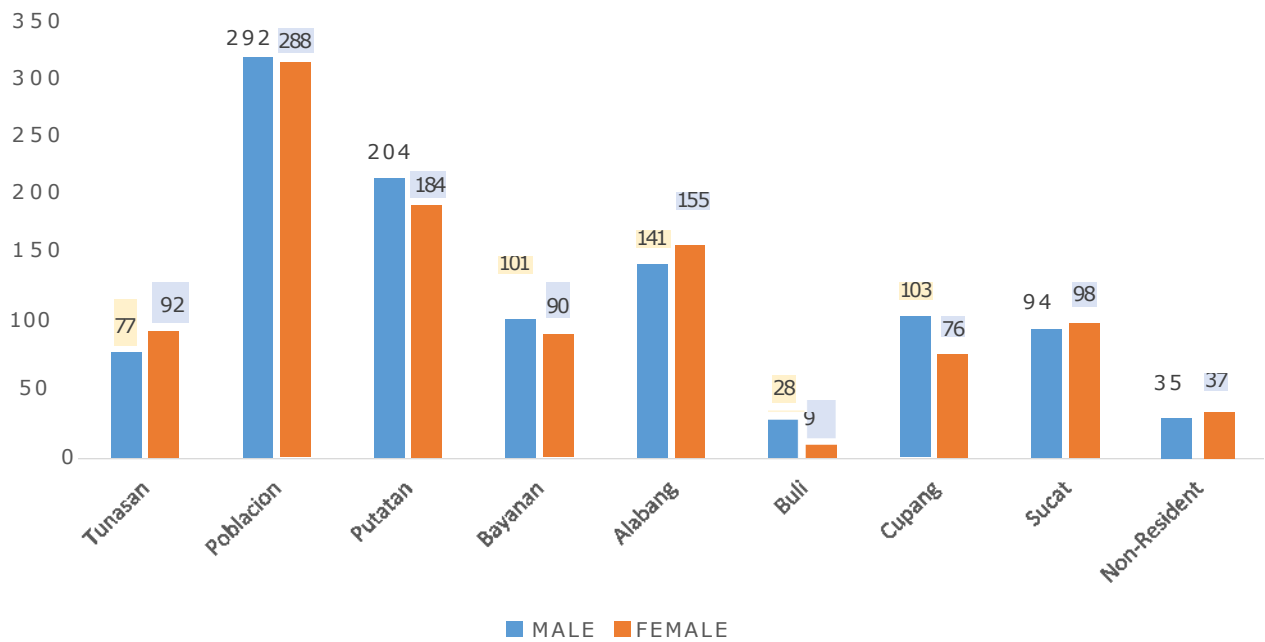
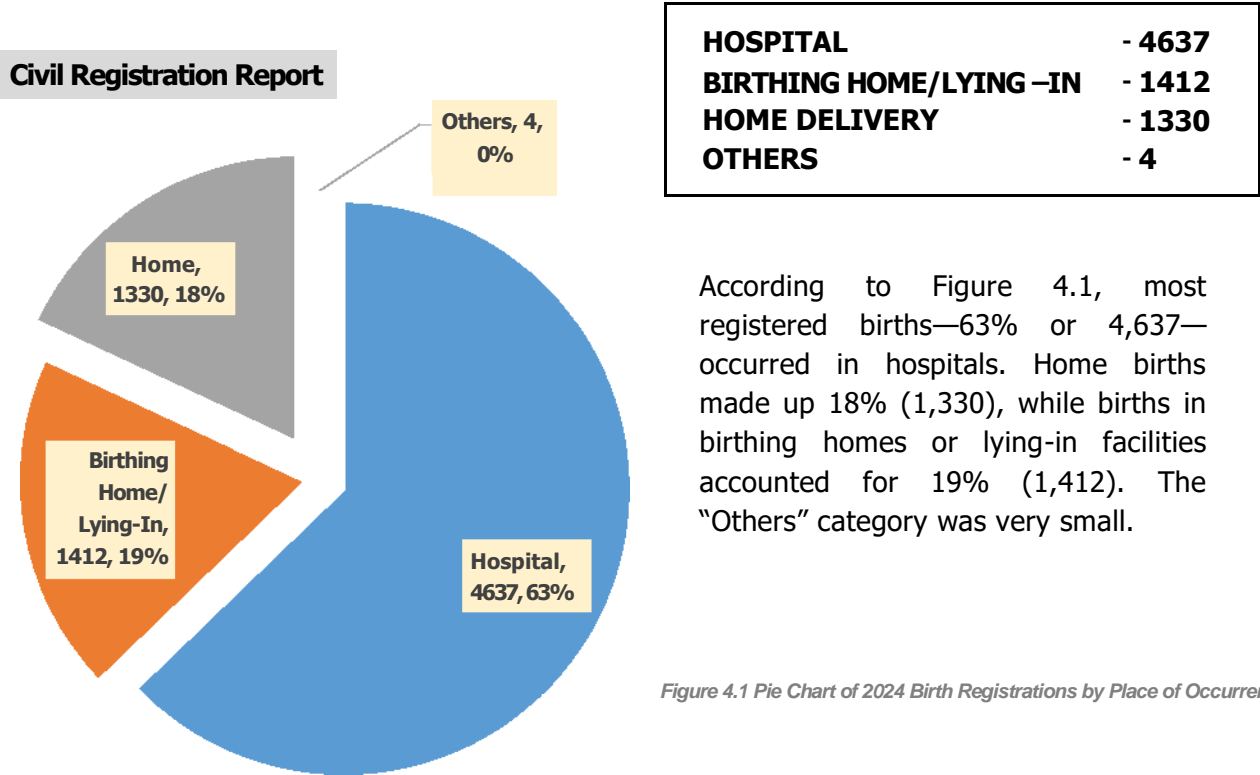


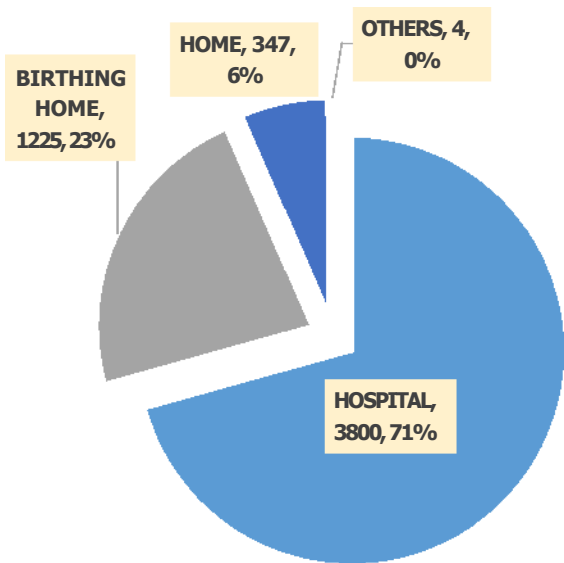
Figure 3.8 Bar Graph o1 2024 Delayed Birth Registrations by Barangay

As shown in **Figure 3.8**, Poblacion recorded the highest number of delayed birth registrations, followed by Putatan and Alabang. The numbers between males and females were fairly balanced across most barangays. Buli had the lowest number of cases, while a few were also recorded under non-residents.

4. Birth Registrations By Place of Occurrence



2024 Actual Birth Occurrence



Looking at the actual births in 2024, hospital deliveries again made up the largest share at 71% (3,800). Home births were 23% (1,225), and births in birthing homes dropped to 6% (347). The “Others” category stayed minimal.

Comparing the data, hospital births are the most common in both actual occurrences and registrations. Interestingly, home births make up a bigger share of actual births than their registration numbers suggest. This gap points to differences in how births are registered depending on where they occur.

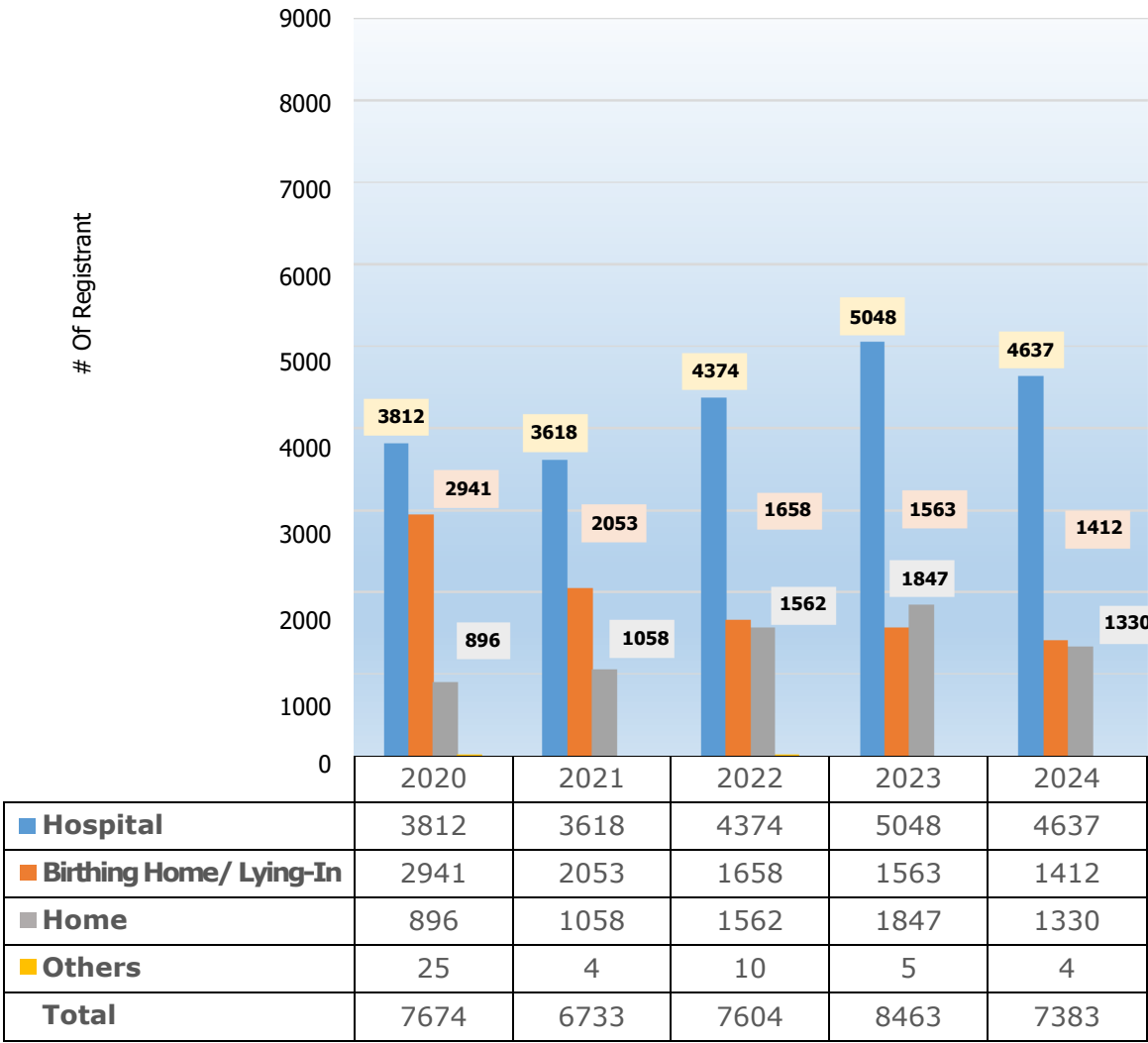


Figure 4.3 Bar Graph of 2020 - 2024 Birth Registrations by Place of Occurrence

Home birth registrations followed a similar pattern, rising through the early years, reaching a peak in 2023, then falling in 2024.

Overall, the total number of birth registrations in Muntinlupa fluctuated each year, reflecting these shifts across different birth settings.

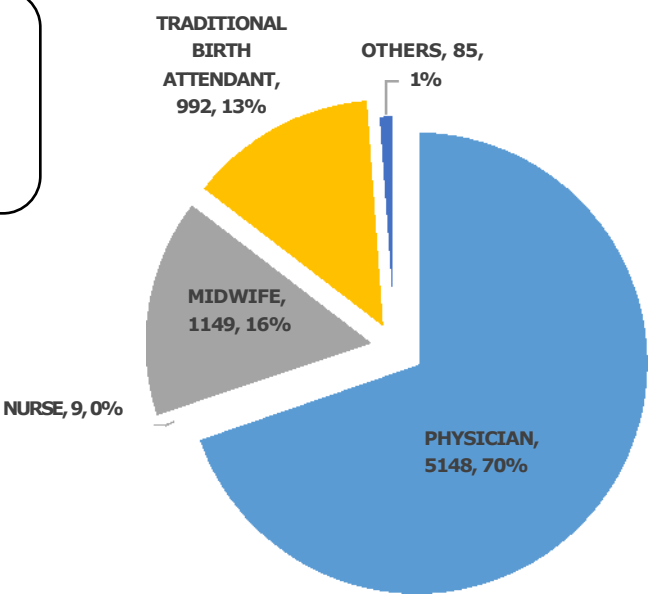


Figure 5.1 Pie Chart of 2024 Birth Registrations by Attendant at Birth

Figure 5.1 shows physicians attended the most registered births (70%), followed by midwives (16%) and traditional birth attendants (13%). Nurses and "Others" attended very few (0% and 1%).

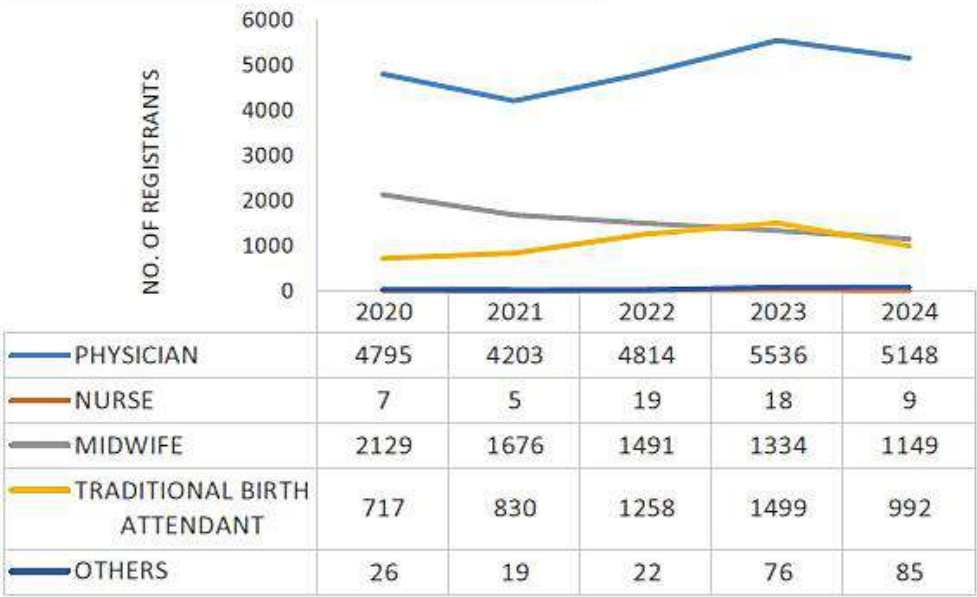


Figure 5.2 Line Graph of 2020- 2024 Birth Registrations by Attendant at Birth

The line graph from 2020 to 2024 shows that physician-attended births consistently make up the largest share. Births attended by midwives and traditional birth attendants are fewer but still significant, while those attended by nurses and others remain consistently low.

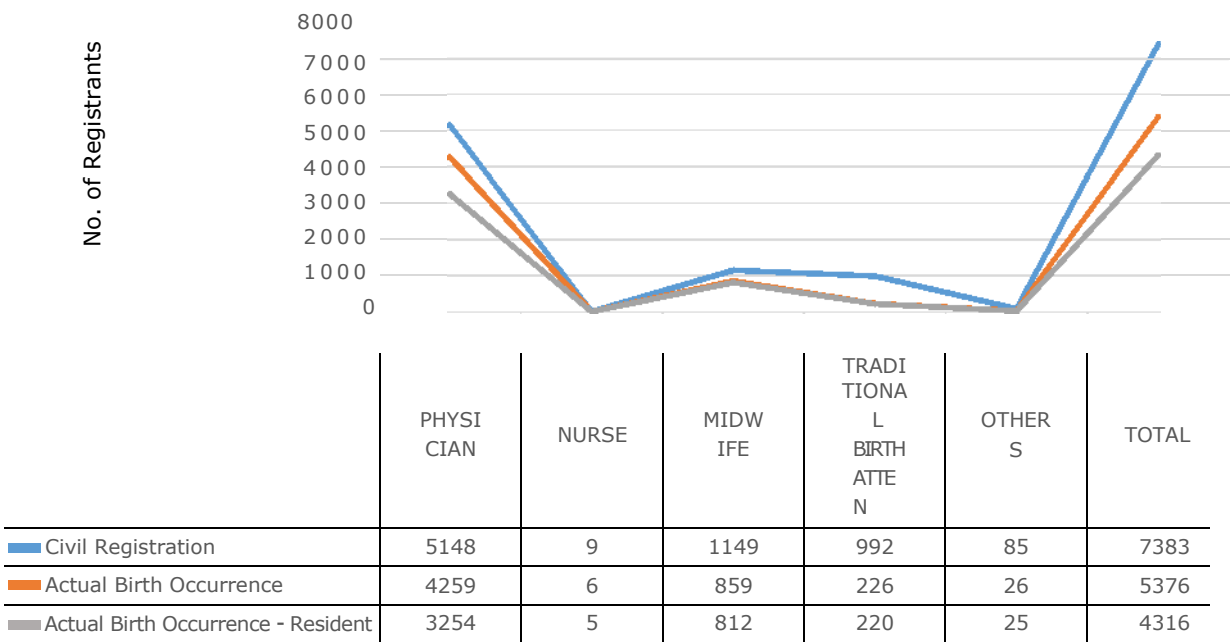


Figure 5.3 Line Graph of 2024 Birth Registrations, Actual Birth Occurrence and Residency disaggregated by Attendant at Birth

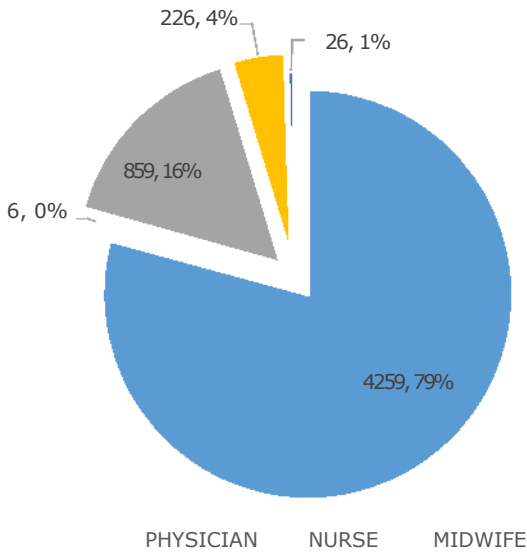


Figure 5.4 Pie Chart of 2024 Birth Registrations by Attendant at Birth – Born in Year 2024

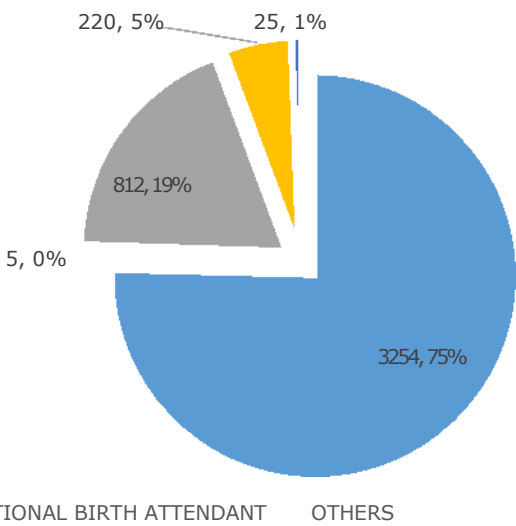


Figure 5.5 Pie Chart of 2024 Birth Registrations whose Mother is a resident of Muntinlupa and Born in Year 2024 disaggregated by Attendant at Birth

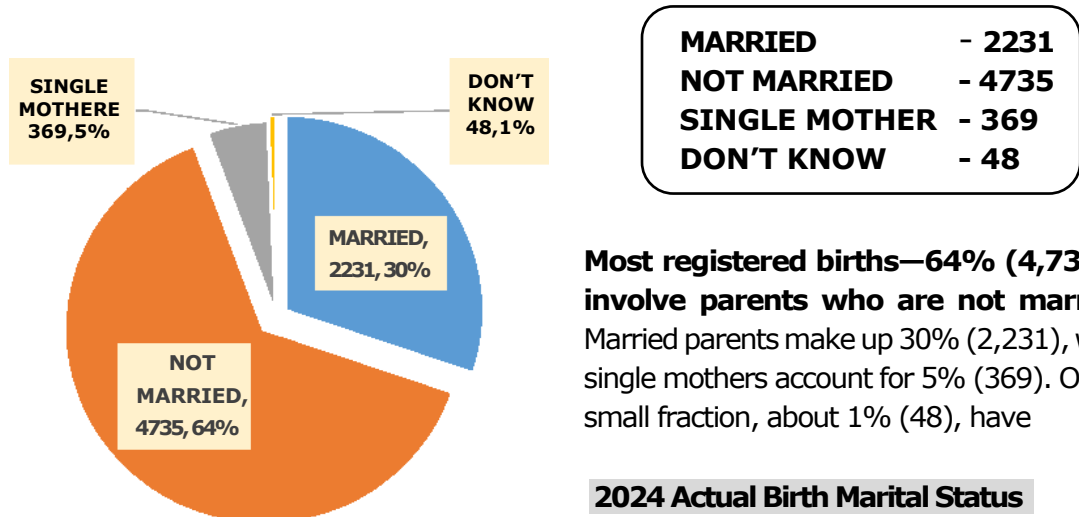


Figure 6.1 Pie Chart of 2024 Birth Registrations Classified by Parents’ Marital Status

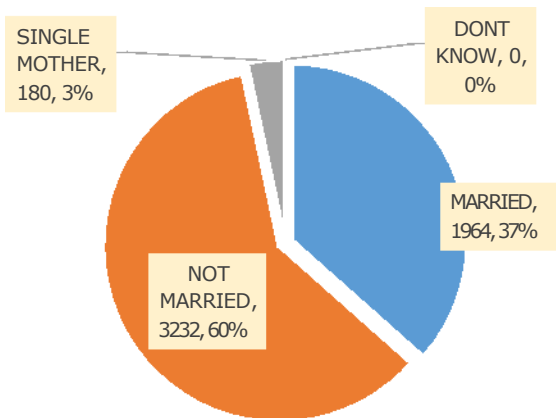


Figure 6.2 Pie Chart of 2024 Birth Registrations for Children Born in 2024 by Parents’ Marital Status

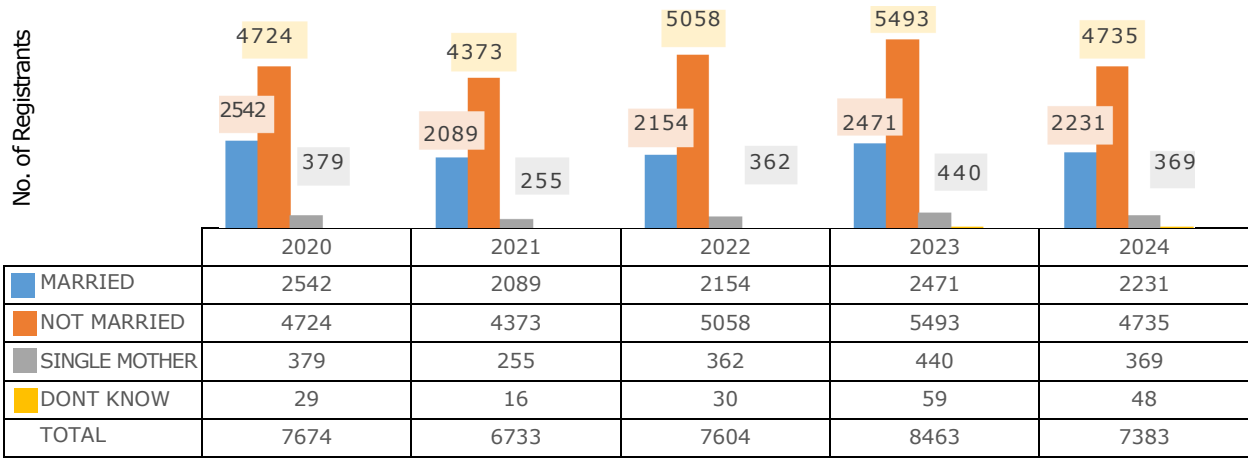


Figure 6.3 Bar Graph of 2020- 2024 Birth Registrations by Parents’ Marital Status

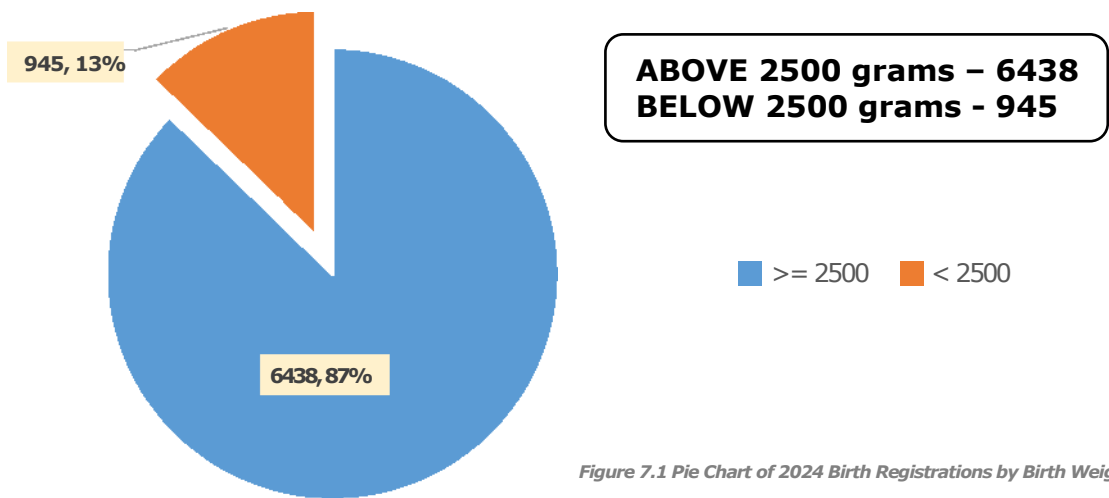


Figure 7.1 Pie Chart of 2024 Birth Registrations by Birth Weight

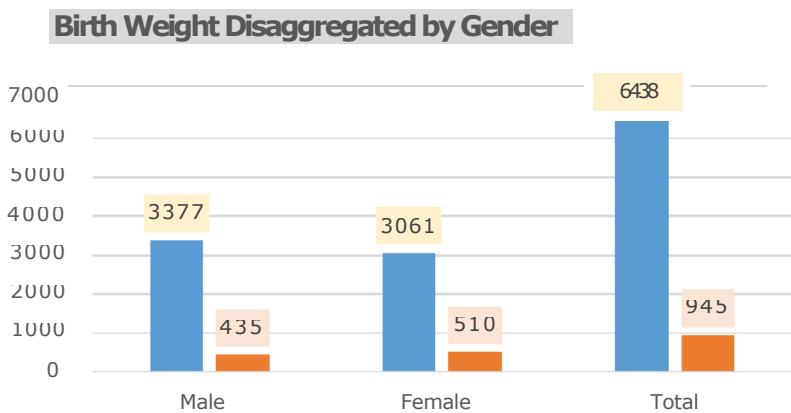


Figure 7.2 Bar Graph of 2024 Registered Births by Gender and Birth Weight

Most babies registered in Muntinlupa weigh over 2,500 grams, which is considered a healthy birth weight. While the number of these normal-weight babies goes up and down a bit each year, it generally stays quite high overall.

On the other hand, babies weighing less than 2,500 grams—often classified as low birth weight—are less common but have been slowly increasing over the past five years. Interestingly, there’s a small trend showing that female newborns are slightly more likely to have a lower birth weight compared to males.

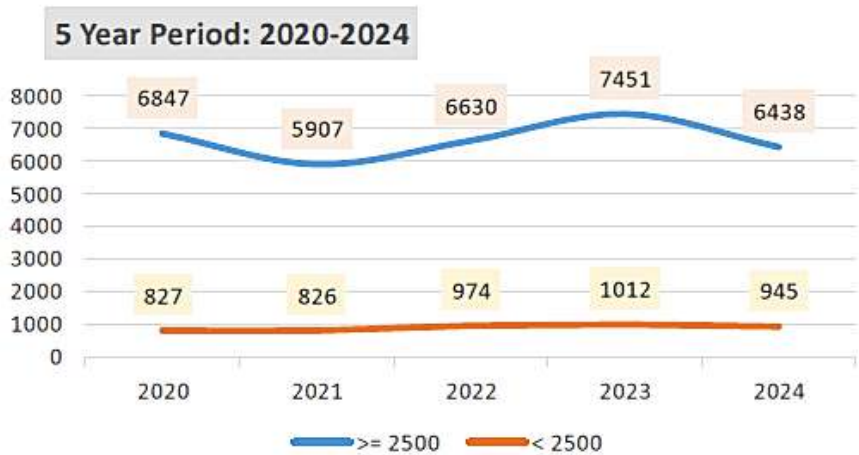


Figure 7.3 Bar Graph of 2020-2024 Registered Births by Birth Weight

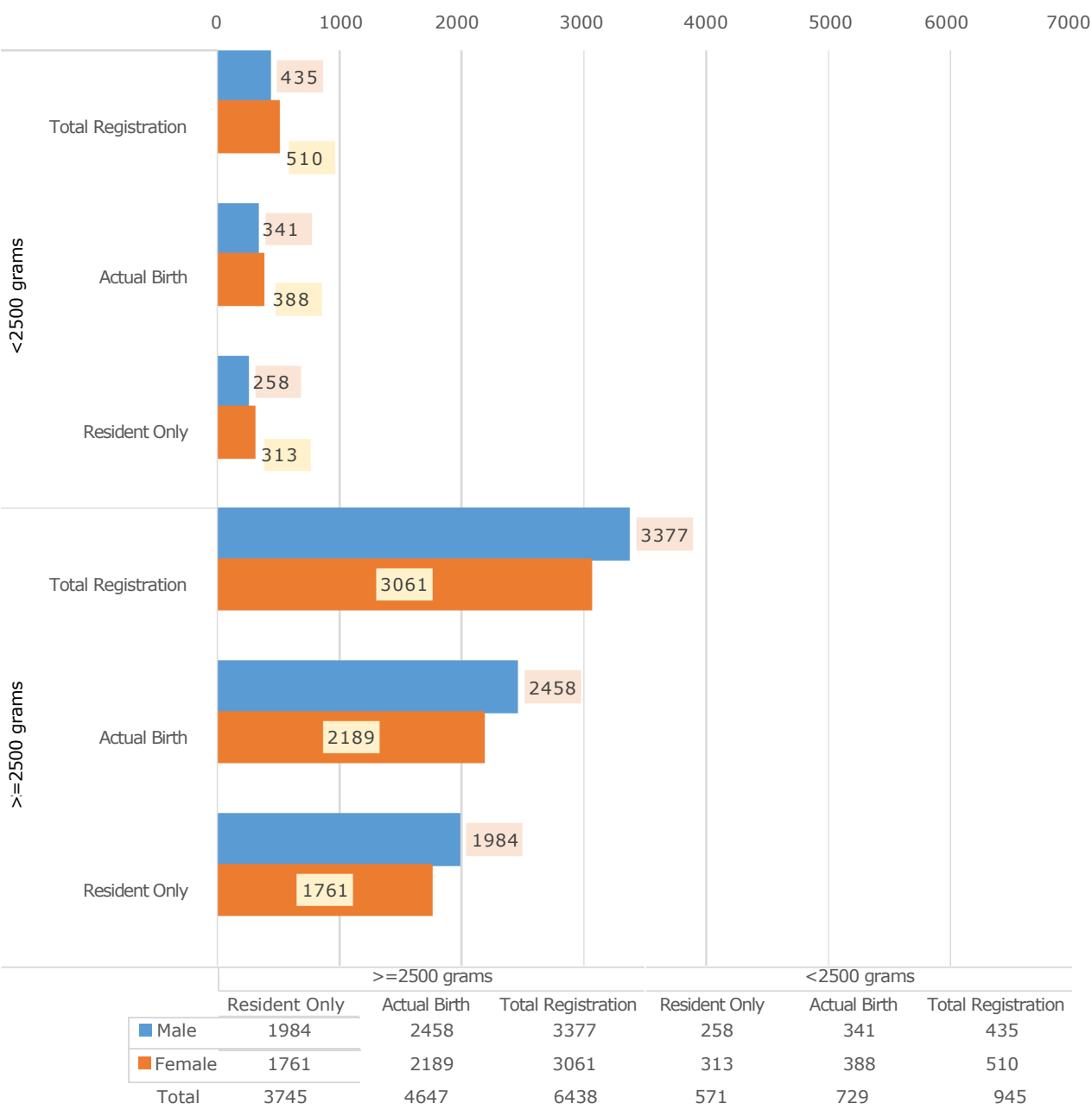


Figure 7.4 Bar Graph Of 2020-2024 Registered Births, Actual Birth Occurrences, and Residency by Birth Weight

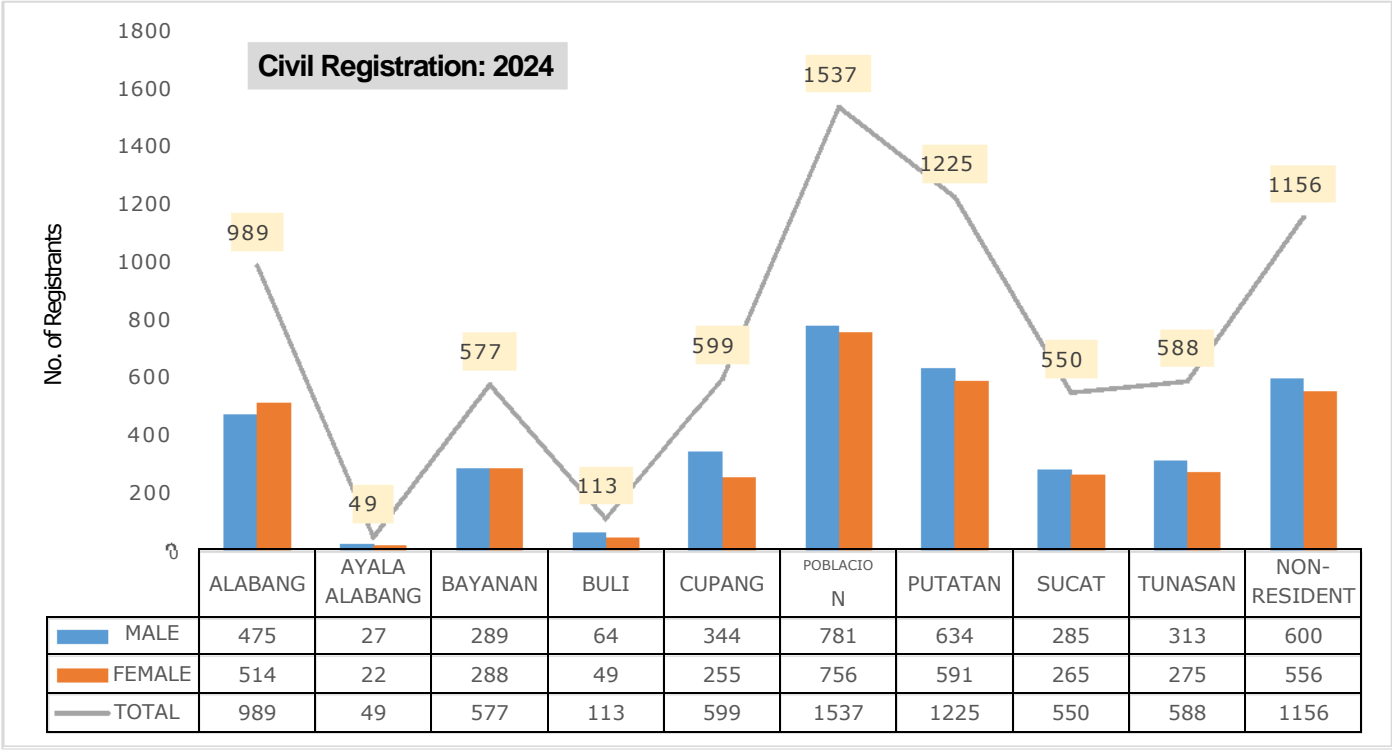


Figure 8.1 Bar Graph of 2024 Birth Registrations by Barangay and Gender

From the 2024 Birth Registrations among the listed Barangays, **Poblacion** recorded the highest number of total registrations with 1537. **Putatan** (1225) and **Alabang** (989) also exhibited substantial registration figures for the year. In contrast, **Ayala Alabang** continued to have the lowest number of birth registrations at 49. The **remaining** Barangays, including **Bayanan**, **Buli**, **Cupang**, **Sucat**, and **Tunasan**, showed moderate levels of total birth registrations, generally ranging from approximately 113 to 599.

Within most of these Barangays, the number of male and female registrants was fairly balanced in 2024. **Alabang** and **Poblacion** had slightly more female registrations, while **Buli** and **Cupang** had a slight male majority.

In summary, focusing solely on the specific Barangays within Muntinlupa, Poblacion had the highest number of birth registrations in 2024, while Ayala Alabang had the lowest. The gender distribution across these Barangays was generally even for the year.

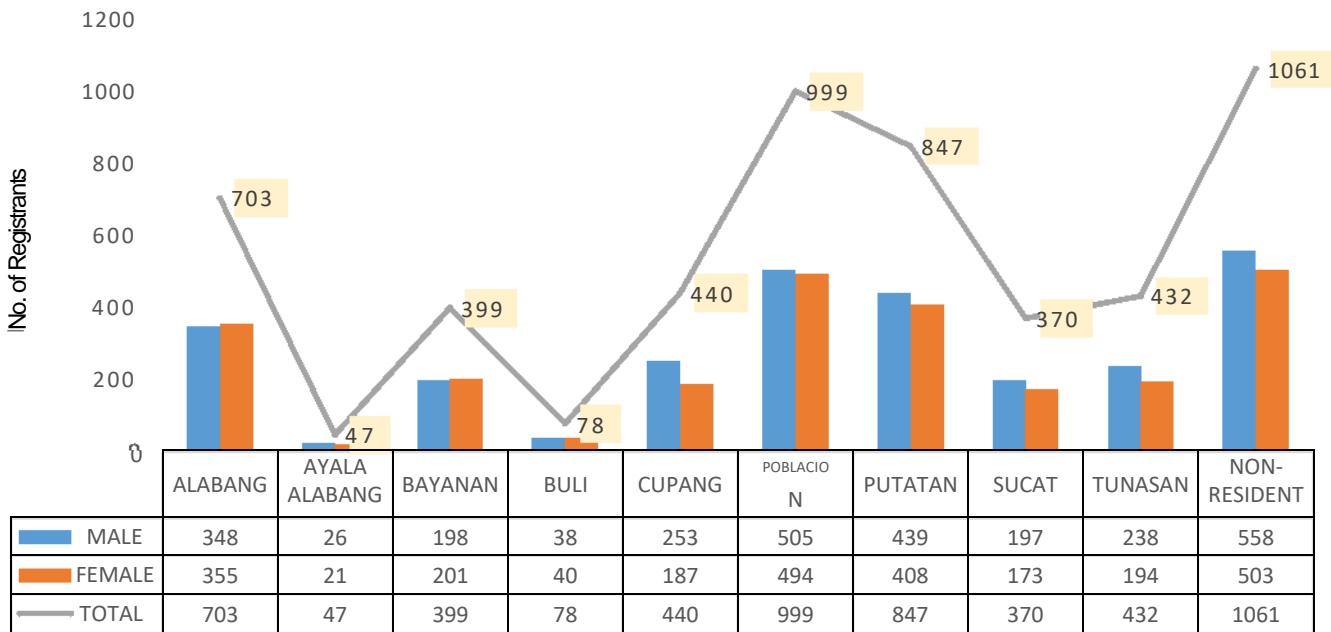


Figure 8.2 Bar Graph of Birth Registrations of Children Born in Year 2024 by Barangay and Gender

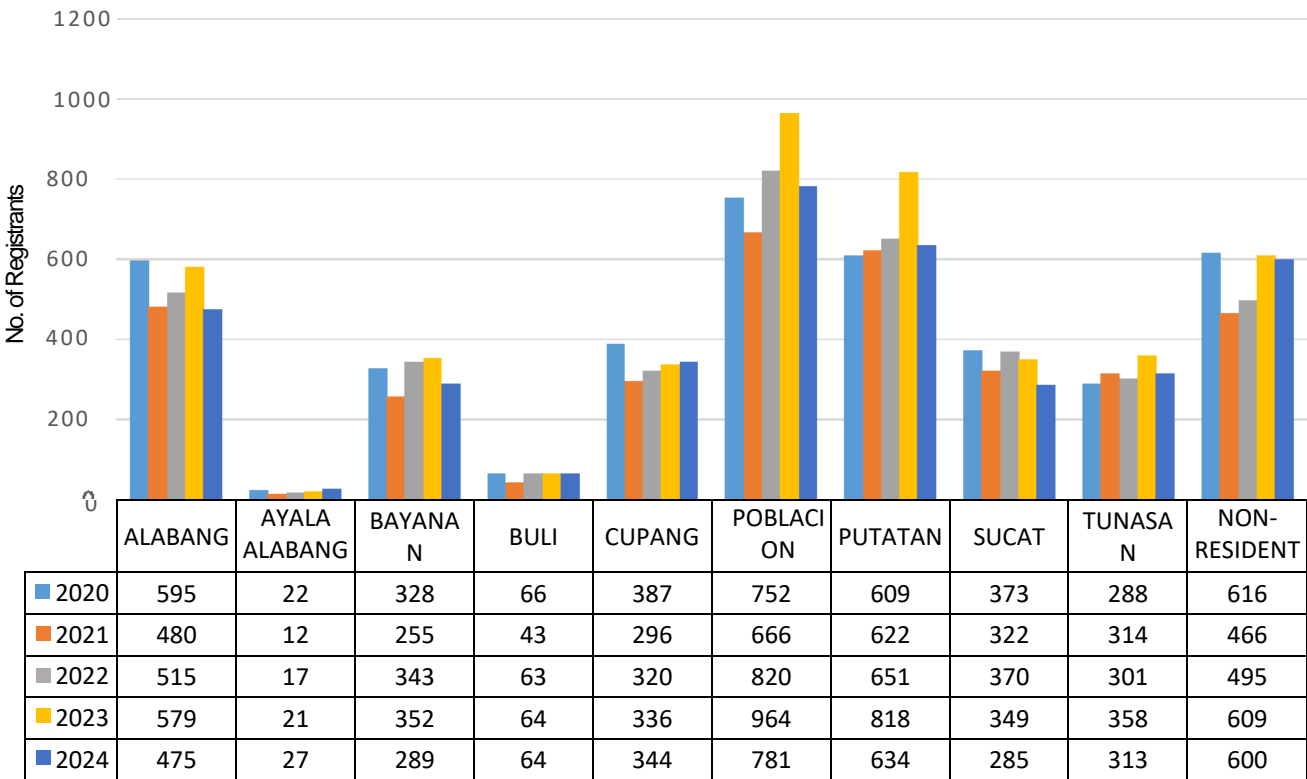


Figure 8.3 Bar Graph of 2020-2024 Birth Registrations by Barangay – Male Children

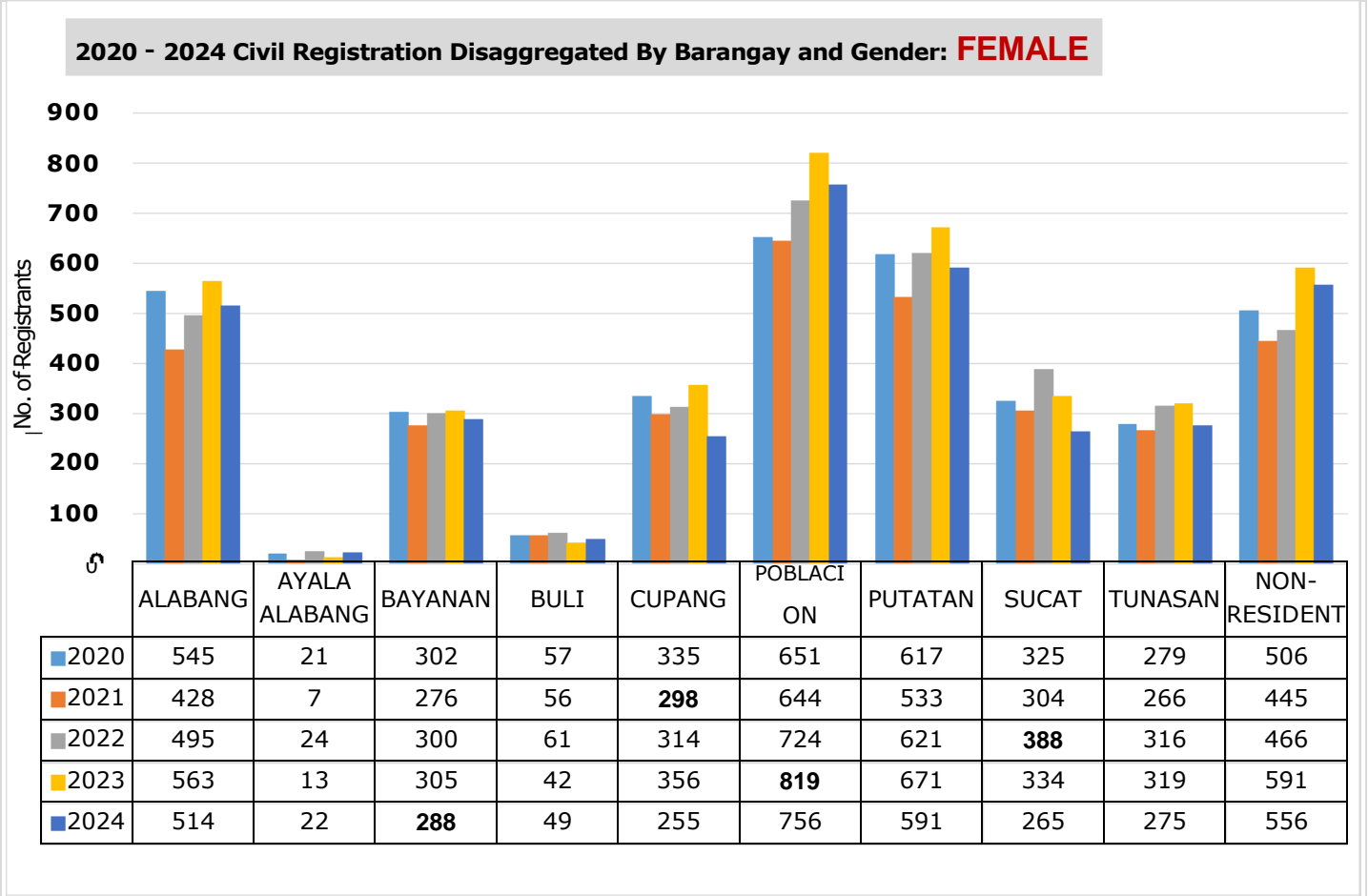
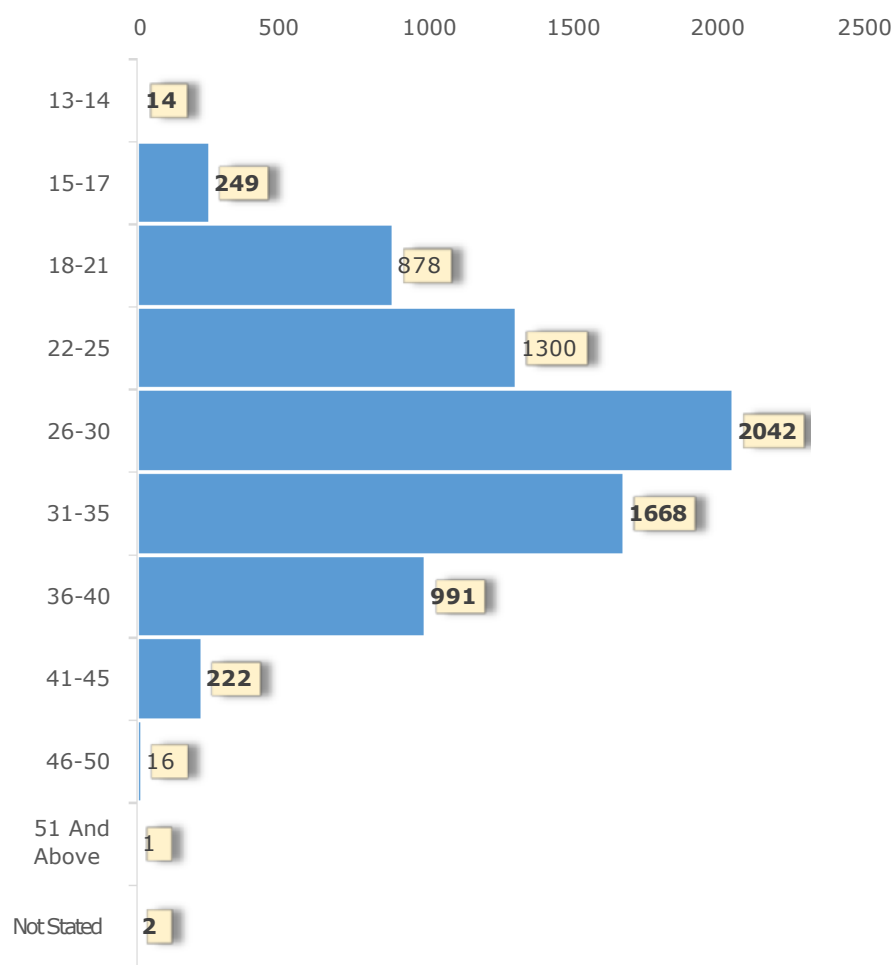


Figure 8.4 Bar Graph of 2020-2024 Birth Registrations by Barangay— Female Children

9. Birth Registrations By Age Group of Mother



**Figure 9.1** illustrates the distribution of birth registrations by the mother’s age at the time of birth. The majority of registered births come from mothers in their prime reproductive years, with **the highest numbers among women aged 26 to 30**. This is closely followed by mothers aged 31 to 35 and 22 to 25, showing that women in their late twenties and early thirties make up the largest share of births in Muntinlupa.

The number of births gradually decreases among both younger and older mothers. The 18 to 21 age group accounts for a moderate number of registrations, while the 41 to 45 group has noticeably fewer. Births to very young mothers aged 13 to 14 and 15 to 17 are quite rare, which is a positive sign. However, adolescent pregnancies still carry significant health and social risks, so continued efforts to prevent unintended pregnancies in these age groups are important. Even though the numbers are low, these young mothers need access to adequate support and resources.

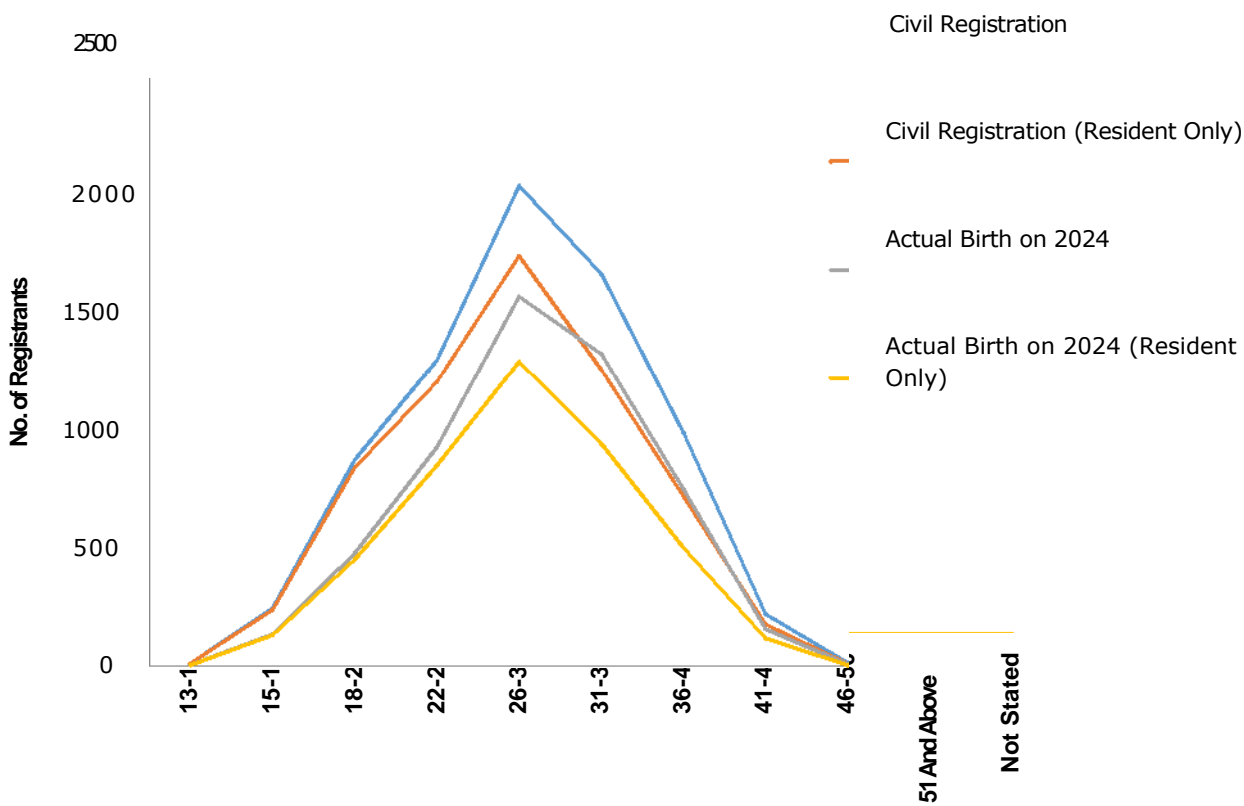


Figure 9.2 Line Graph of 2024 Birth Registrations, Actual Birth Occurrences, and Residency by Age Group of Mother

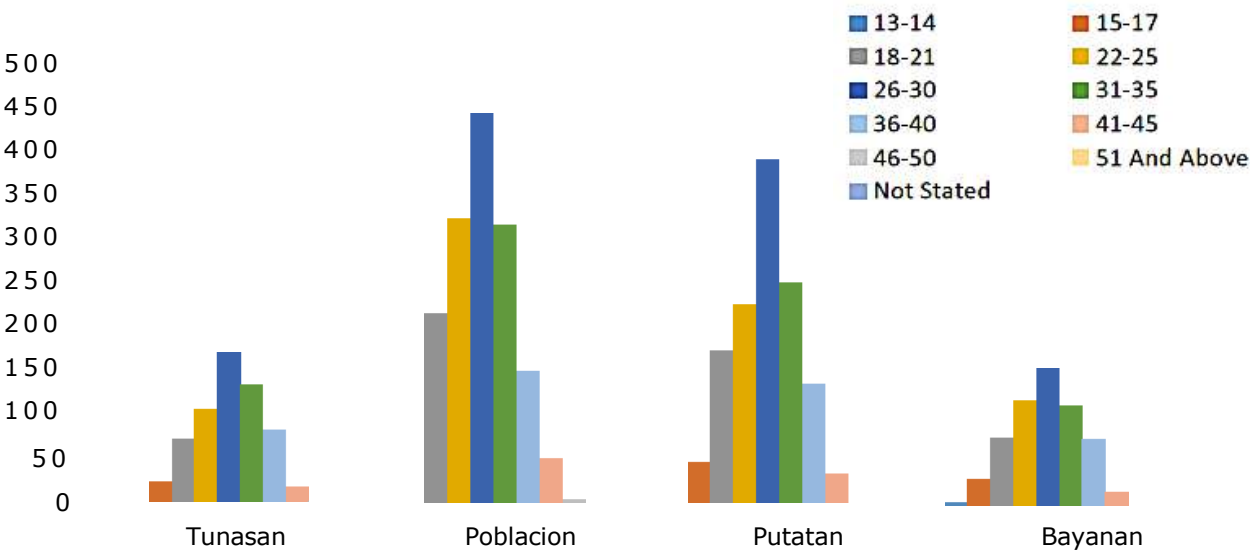


Figure 9.3 Bar Graph of 2024 Birth Registrations by Age Group of Mother and Barangay – District 1

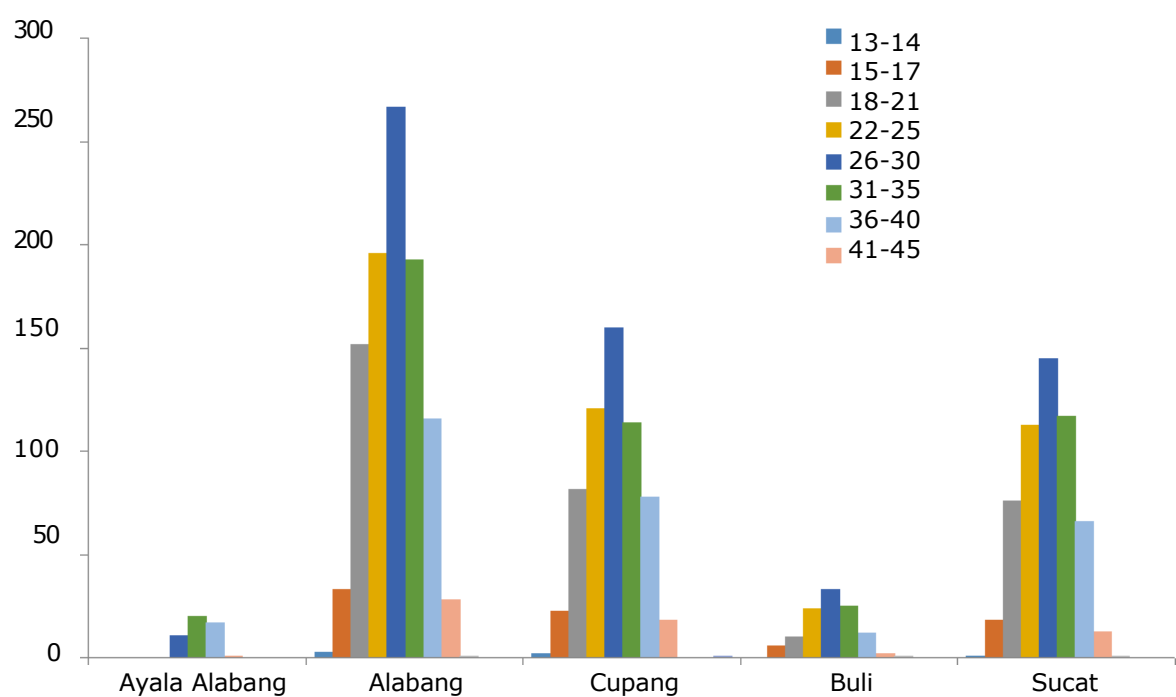


Figure 9.4 Bar Graph of 2024 Birth Registrations by Age Group of Mother and Barangay – District 2

Table 7.0 shows how birth order varies with the mother’s age. Overall, first and second births are the most common across all age groups. Younger mothers, especially teenagers aged 13 to 17, mostly have their first child. It’s important to note that adolescent pregnancy is generally discouraged due to the health and social challenges it can pose for both the mother and child.

As mothers get older, particularly through their twenties and thirties, we see a wider variety of birth orders, including many second, third, and even later births. For women in their late thirties and forties, while first and second births still happen, there’s a noticeable increase in third or higher-order births.

Table 10.0 shows the ages of mothers and fathers at the time of birth registration. Most births involve mothers in their late twenties and fathers in their late twenties to mid-thirties. Generally, parents tend to be close in age, though fathers are often older—especially when the mother is younger. For example, the data includes cases where mothers in their early to mid-teens (13–17) have partners who are much older, sometimes in their late teens, twenties, or beyond. As mothers get older, the age difference between parents usually gets smaller.

It’s also worth noting that quite a few registrations don’t include the father’s age, which is important to keep in mind when looking at these patterns. Overall, this data helps us understand the typical age combinations of parents at birth in Muntinlupa.

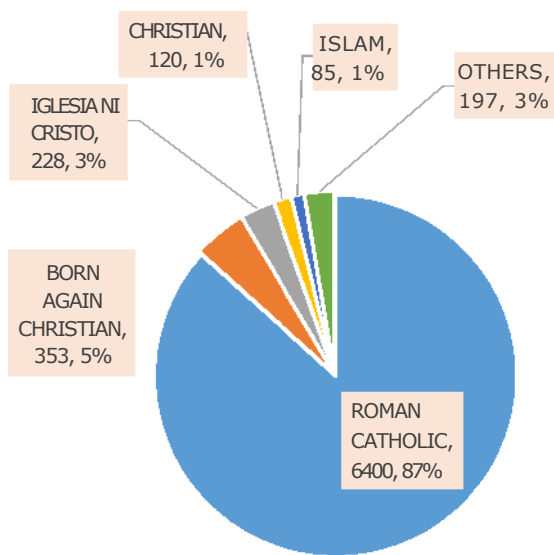


Figure 12.1. Pie Chart of 2024 Birth Registrations by Mothers' Religion

The Figure 12.1 illustrates the religious affiliations of children whose births were registered. **A significant majority, 87% (6400 cases), were registered as Roman Catholic.** This indicates a strong prevalence of Roman Catholicism among the registered births in Muntinlupa.

The next largest religious group is **Born Again Christian**, accounting for **5% (353 cases)** of the registrations. **Iglesia ni Cristo** represents **3% (228 cases)**. **Christian** (non-Born Again) and **Islam** each account for 1% of the registered births, with 120 and 85 cases respectively. The remaining religious affiliations are grouped under "**Others**," also comprising **3% (197 cases)**.

In summary, the religious breakdown of registered births in Muntinlupa is overwhelmingly dominated by Roman Catholicism. Other notable Christian denominations include Born Again Christian and Iglesia ni Cristo. Islam and non-Born Again Christians each represent a smaller proportion of the registered births.

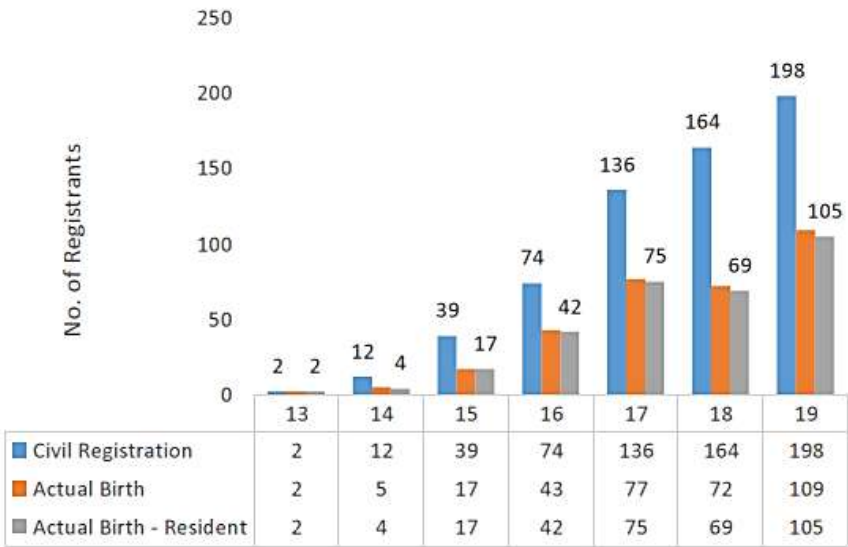

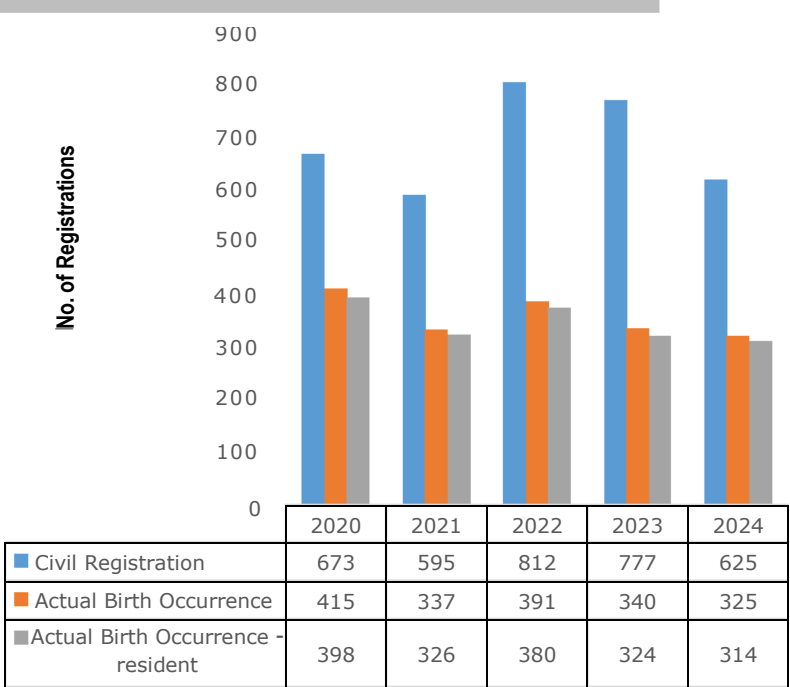

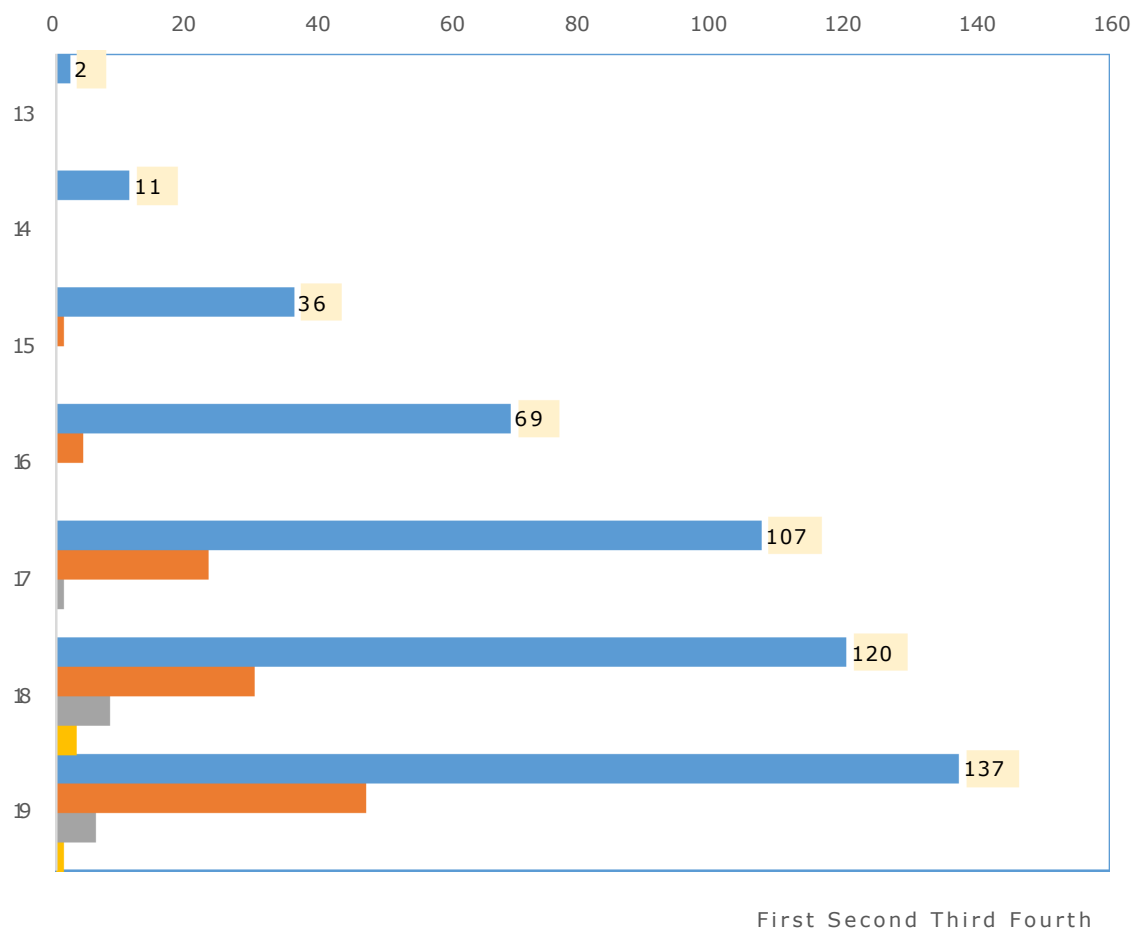


Figure 13.3. Bar Graph of 2024 Birth Registrations Among Adolescent Mothers by Birth Order

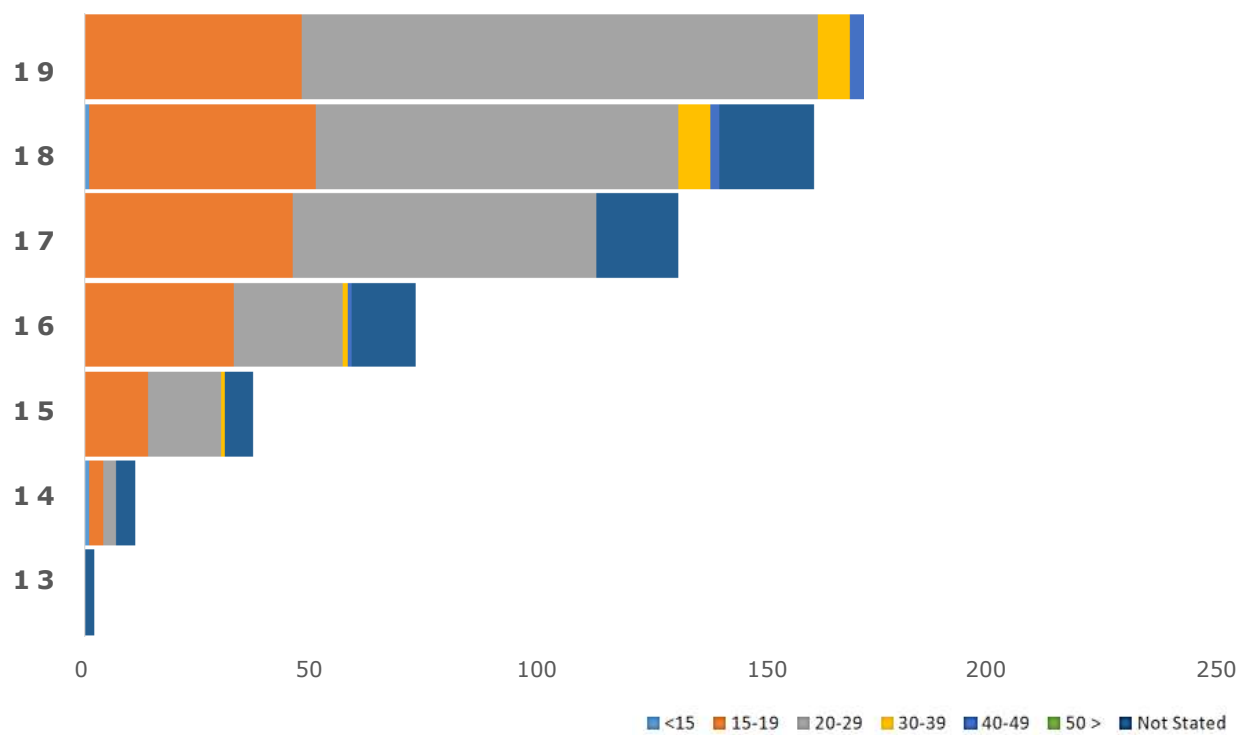


Figure 13.4. Bar Graph of 2024 Birth Registrations Among Adolescent Mothers by Age Group of Father

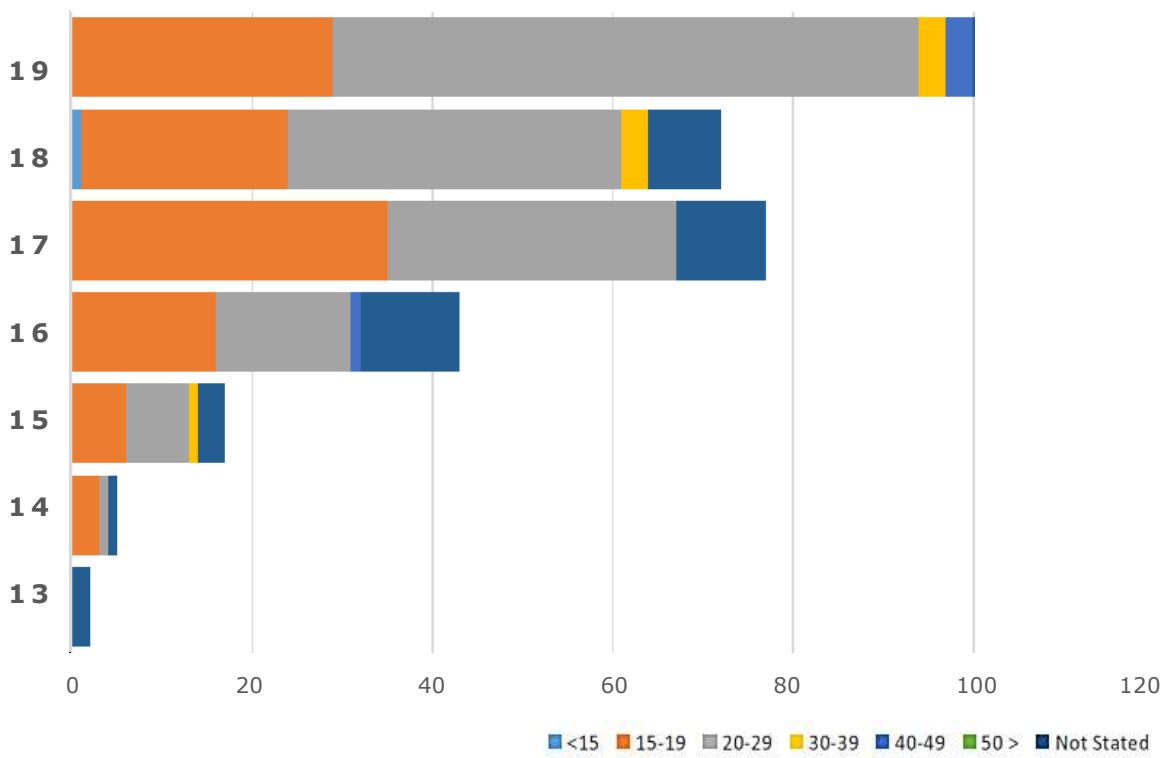


Figure 13.5. Bar Graph of 2024 Birth Registrations Among Adolescent Mothers by Age Group of Father (Children Born in 2024)

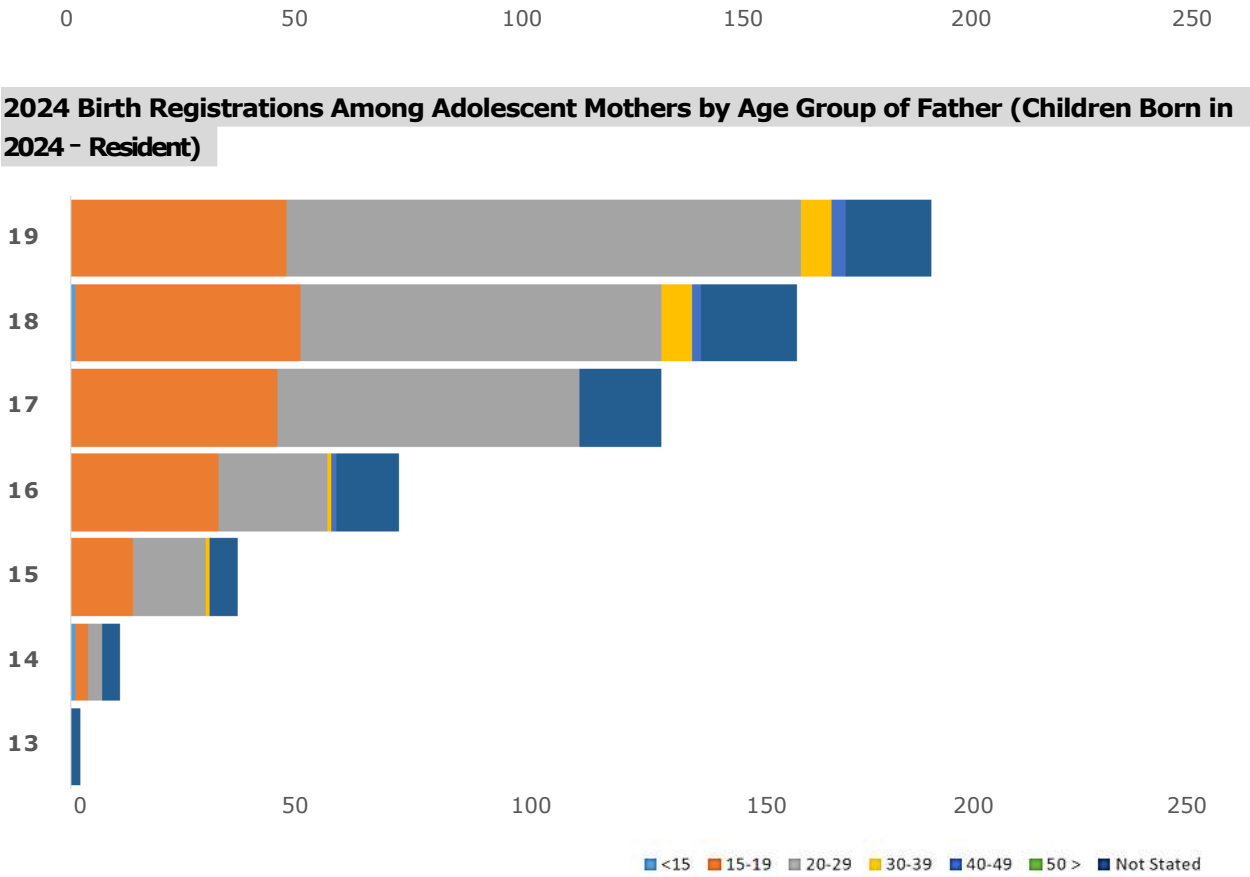


Figure 13.6. Bar Graph of 2024 Birth Registrations Among Adolescent Mothers by Age Group of Father (Children Born in 2024 - Resident)

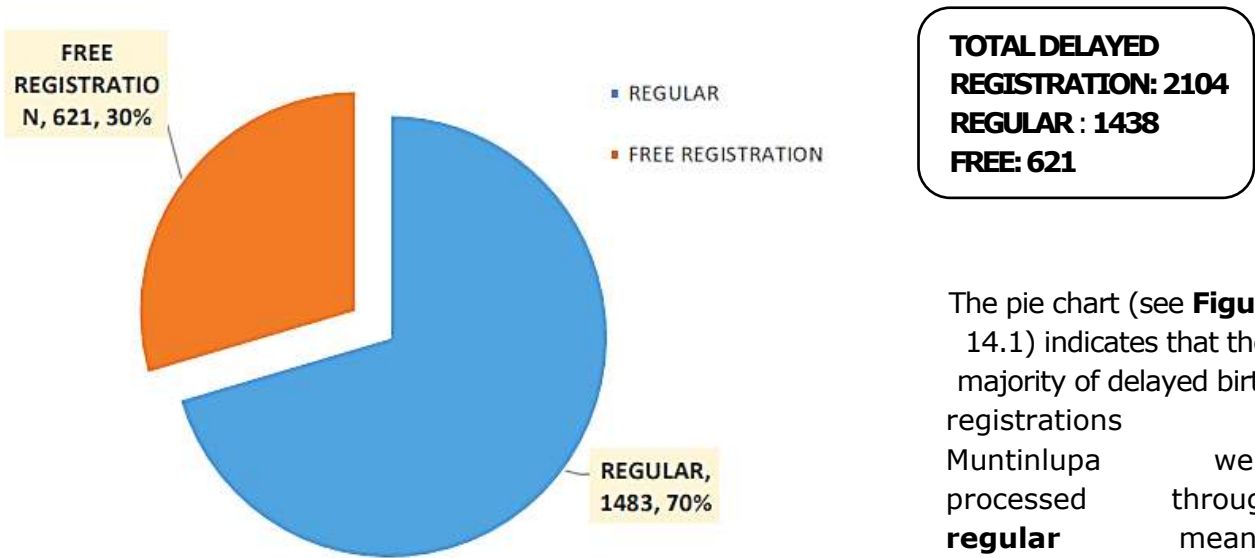


Figure 14.1. Pie Chart of 2024 Delayed Birth Registrations

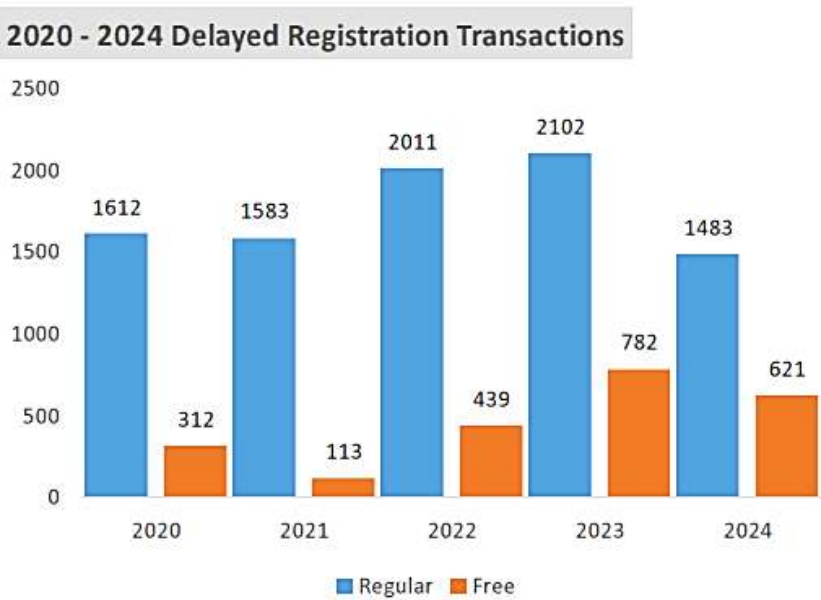


Figure 14.2. Bar Graph of 202-2024 Delayed Birth Registrations

Regular Delayed Registrations (2020-2024)

The number of **regularly delayed birth registrations** in Muntinlupa fluctuated over the five years. The highest number was recorded in **2023**, with **2,102 transactions**, while the lowest occurred in 2021, with **1,583 transactions**. In 2024, the number declined slightly to **1,483**. The initial drop observed in 2021 may be attributed to the

Free Delayed Registration Activities (2020-2024)

Free delayed registration activities exhibited a different pattern. The highest number of free registrations occurred in 2023 with 782 transactions, coinciding with the conduct of 28 community-based outreach activities. Significant numbers were also recorded in 2020 (312 transactions) and 2022 (439 transactions). In contrast, 2021 saw a sharp decline, with only 113 transactions, likely due to pandemic-related constraints.

In 2024, the number of free registrations rebounded to 621 transactions, supported by 27 community outreach activities conducted across various barangays and venues in Muntinlupa (see Annex 1). The strong correlation between the frequency of outreach events and the volume of free registrations underscores the effectiveness of local government initiatives in expanding access to civil registration services, particularly for indigent and underserved populations.

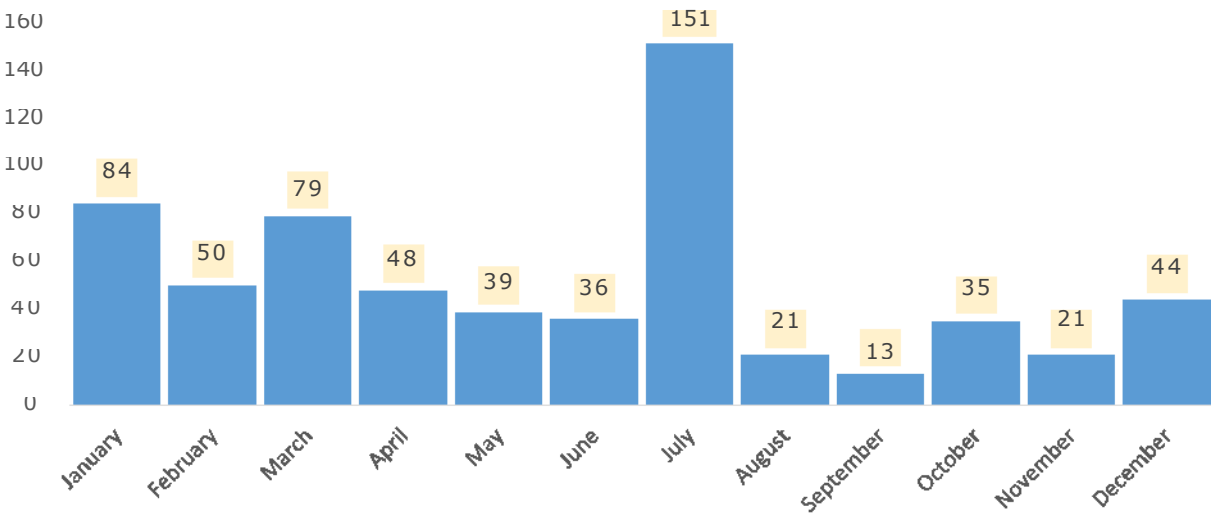
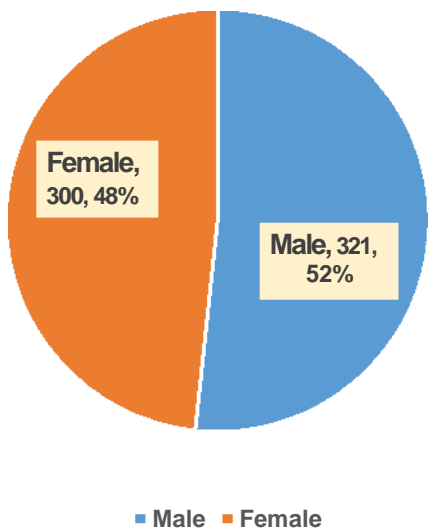


Figure 14.3. Bar Graph of 2024 Free Delayed Birth Registrations

Overall, the data indicate that **delayed birth registration remains an active and necessary service in Muntinlupa. While** the majority of these registrations are processed through **regular means, free registration initiatives—likely supported by local ordinances such as Sanggunian Panglungsod 11-56, which aim to assist indigent residents—play a vital role in** reaching underserved populations. The **success of these free programs is underscored by** the significant number of transactions recorded during years of **intensified community outreach, particularly in 2023 and 2024, when a high number of mobile registration activities were conducted.**

The data on free birth registrations shows a near-equal split between males (52%) and females (48%).

Looking at the age groups, the majority of those receiving free registration are children and adolescents. The largest group is children aged 1 to 5 years (44%), followed closely by those aged 6 to 17 years (41%). Infants under one year old make up a smaller portion (6%). Adults aged 18 to 59 account for 8% of the free registrations, and seniors 60 and older represent the smallest group at 1%.

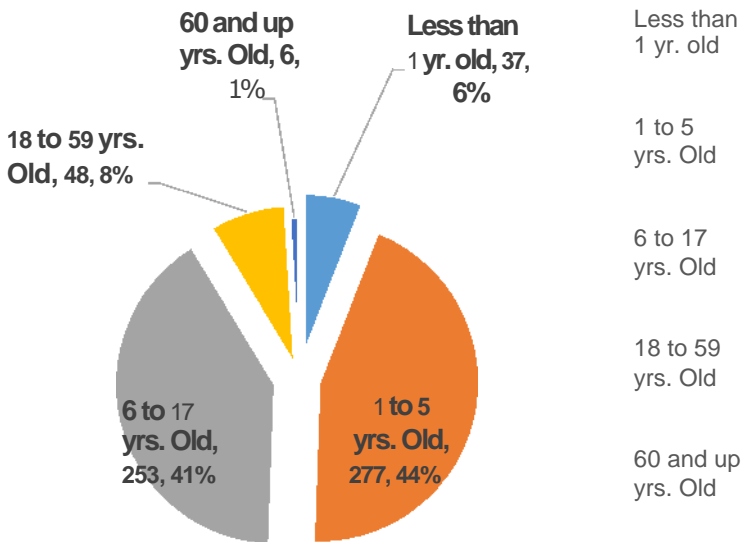


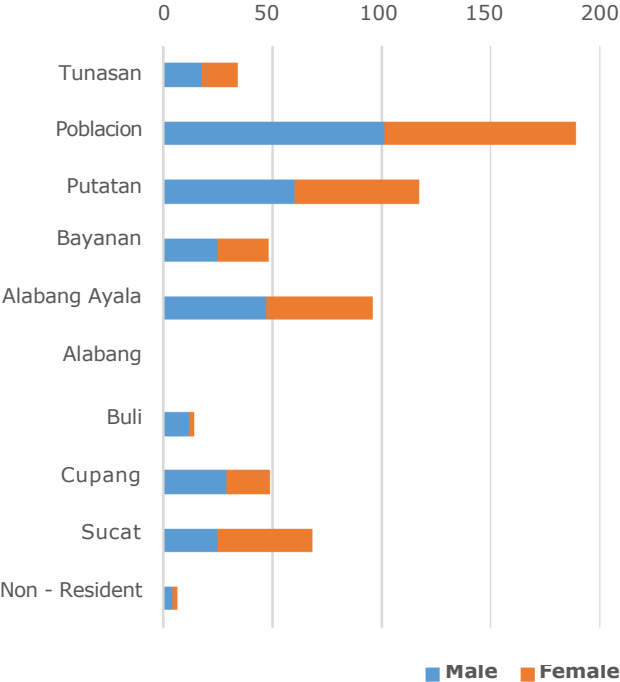

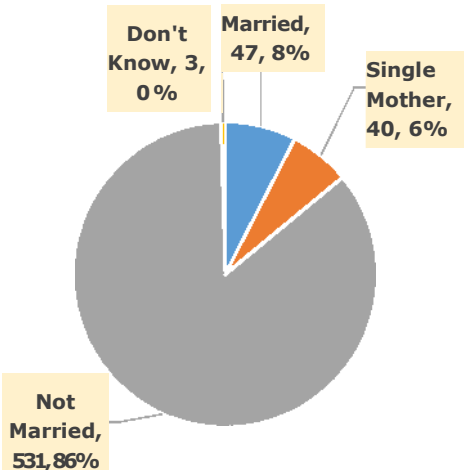
Looking at the **Barangays, Poblacion, and Putatan** have the highest number of beneficiaries, suggesting a greater **need or higher program uptake in these areas**. Other Barangays show varying levels of participation, **with Buli and Ayala Alabang having the fewest beneficiaries**. 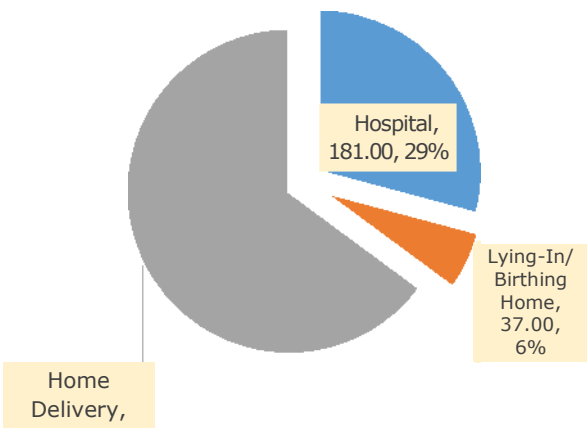

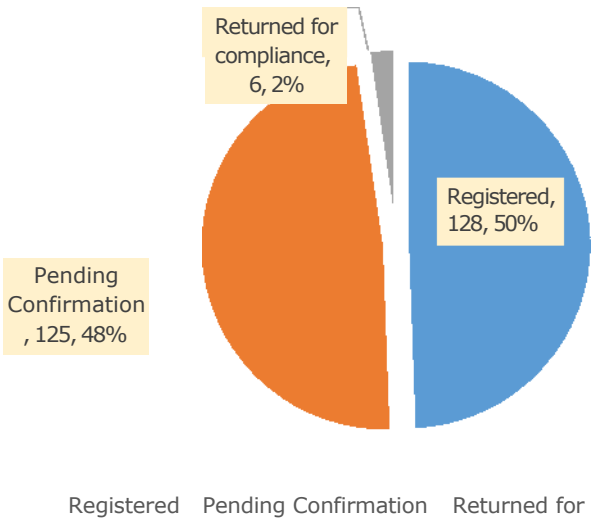

The data on where the births occurred for those who received free delayed registration indicates that the majority (65%, 403 registrations) were home deliveries. Hospital births accounted for a notable portion (29%, 181 registrations), while a smaller percentage (6%, 37 registrations) occurred in lying-in or birthing homes.

Overall, this information suggests that a significant number of individuals benefiting from free delayed registration were born at home. While hospital births also represent a substantial portion, births in lying-in or birthing homes were less common within this group.

Recent data on out-of-town delayed birth registrations reveal that approximately half (50%, or 128 cases) have been successfully registered. A slightly smaller share (48%, or 125 cases) remains pending confirmation, while a minimal number (2%, or 6 cases) were returned for compliance—indicating that additional requirements must be fulfilled before registration can proceed.

Overall, the majority of these applications are either completed or nearing final approval. The small proportion requiring further compliance suggests that Muntinlupa’s processing of out-of-town delayed birth registrations is relatively efficient.

# DEATH REGISTRATION

Death is the permanent disappearance of all evidence of life at any time after live birth has taken place.

A Death certificate is an official document setting forth particulars relating to a dead person, including the name of the individual, date of birth, and the date of death.

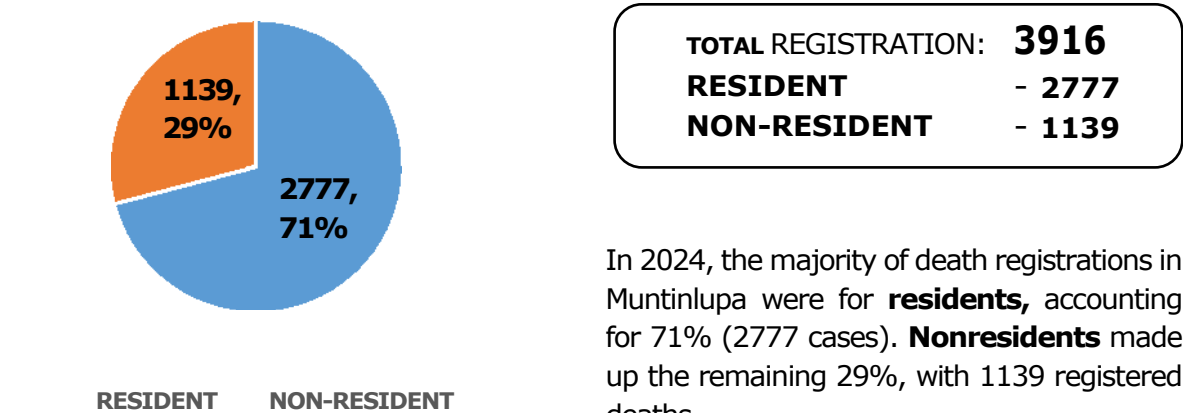


Figure 16.1. Pie Chart of 2024 Death Registrations by Residency

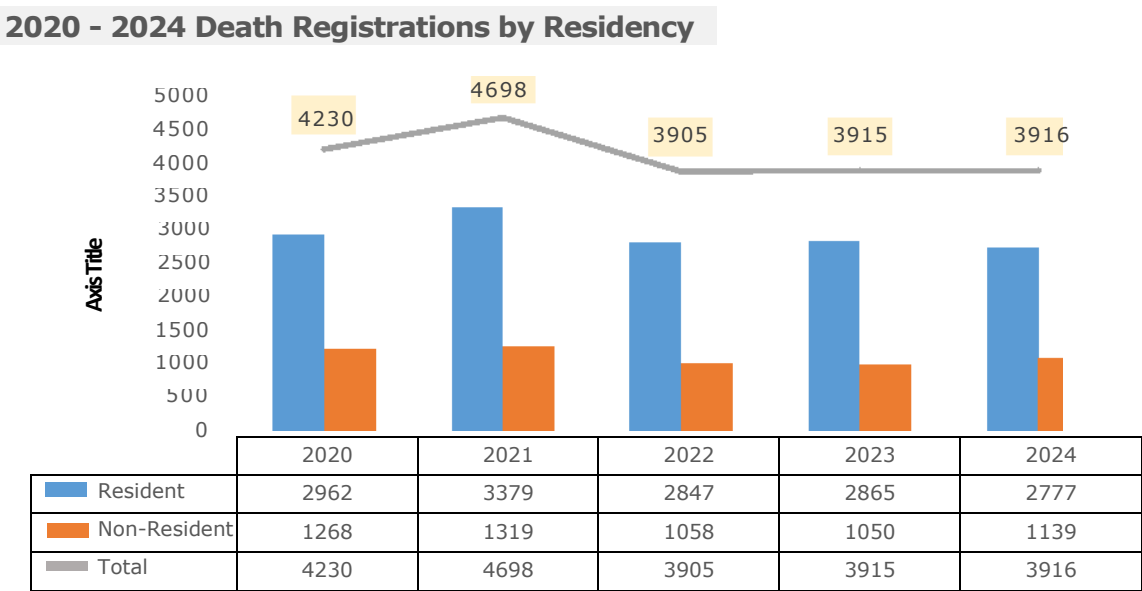


Figure 16.2. Bar Graph of 2020-2024 Death Registrations by Residency

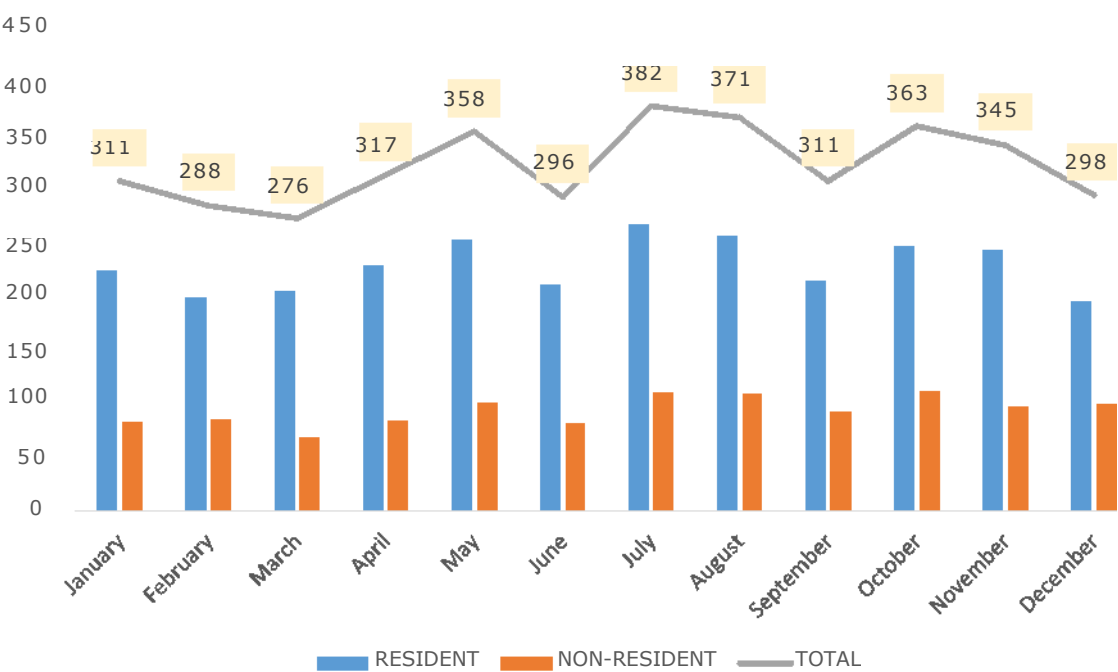


Figure 16.3. Bar Graph of 2024 Death Registrations by Residency and Month

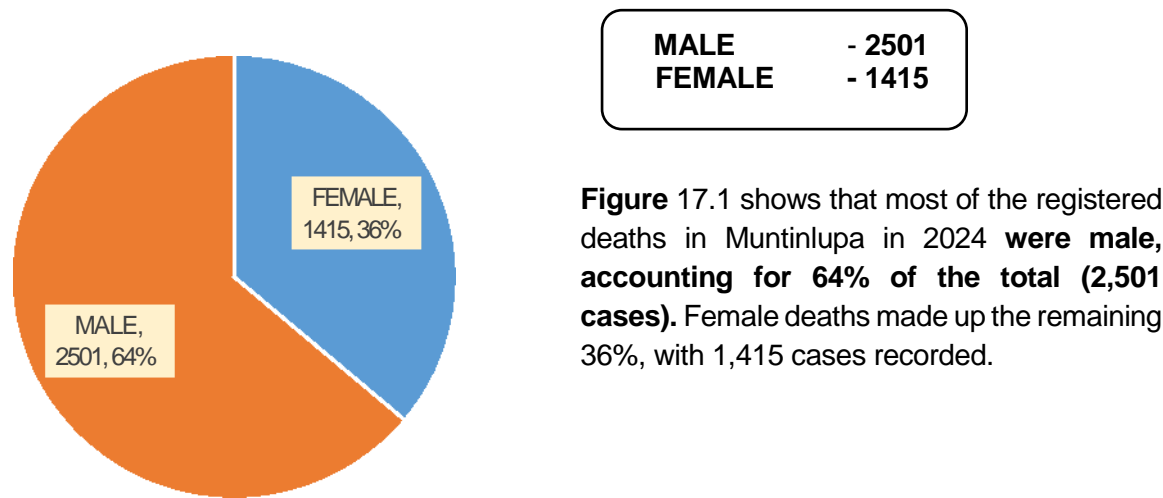


Figure 17.1. Pie Chart of 2024 Death Registrations by Gender

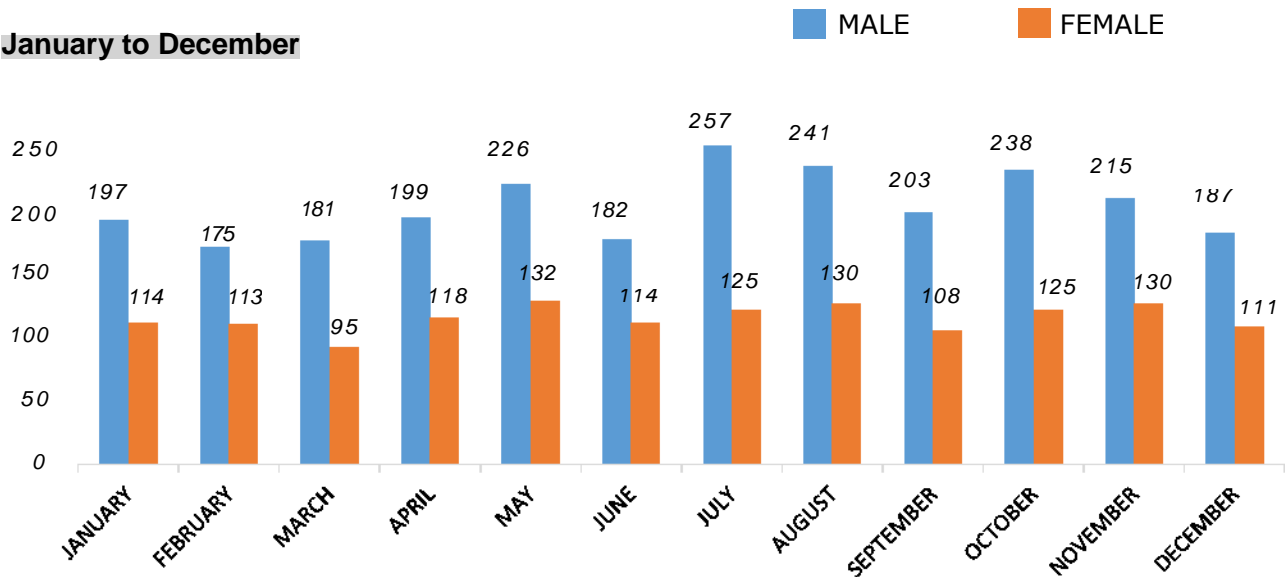


Figure 17.2. Bar Graph of 2024 Death Registrations by Gender and Month

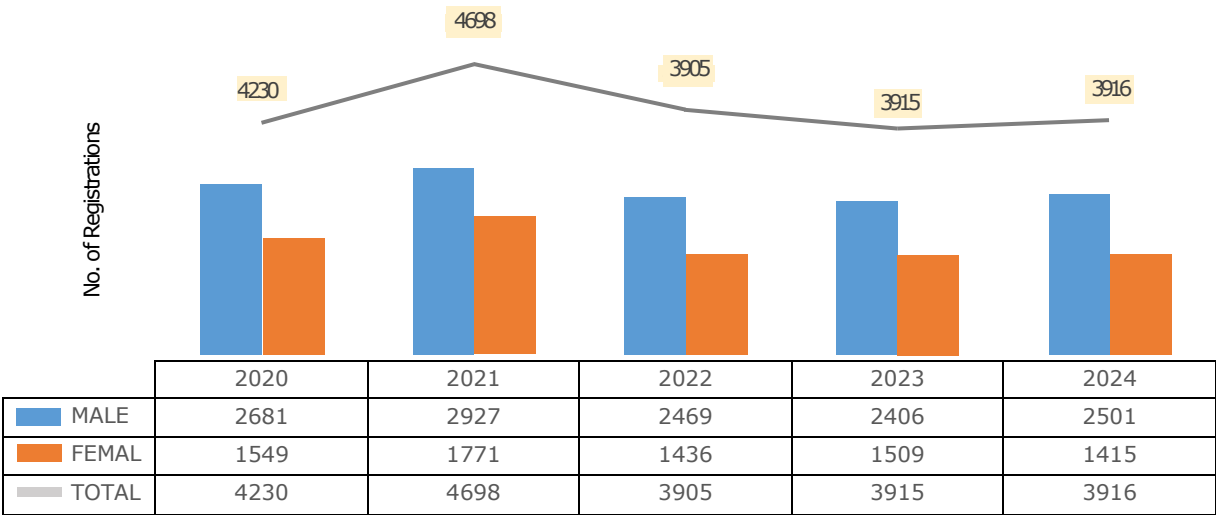
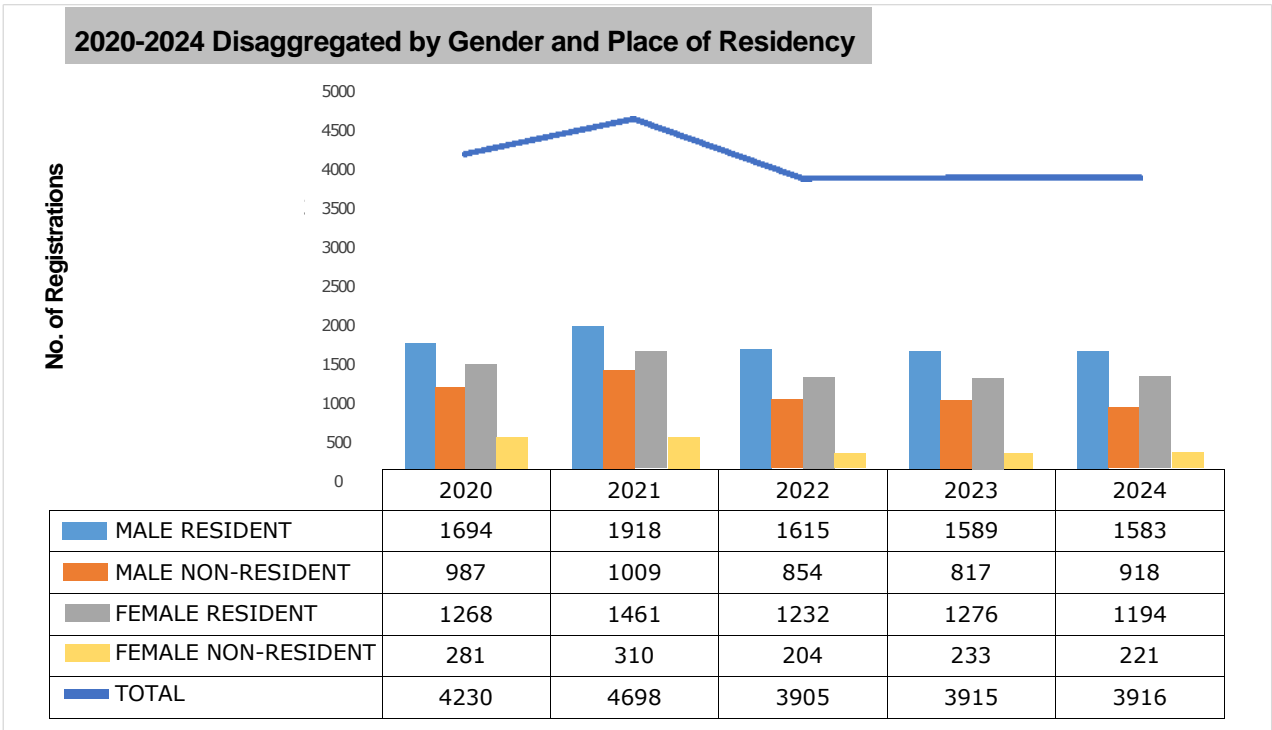


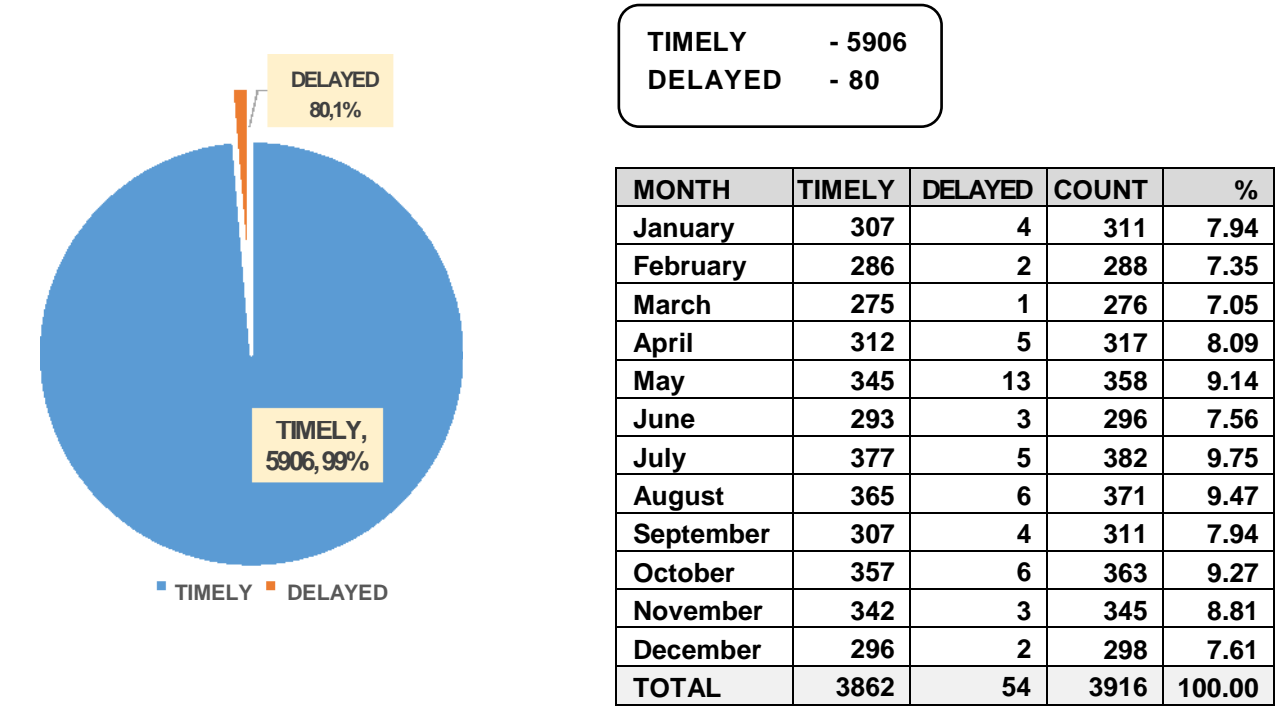
Figure 17.3. Bar Graph Of 2020-2024 Death Registrations by Gender

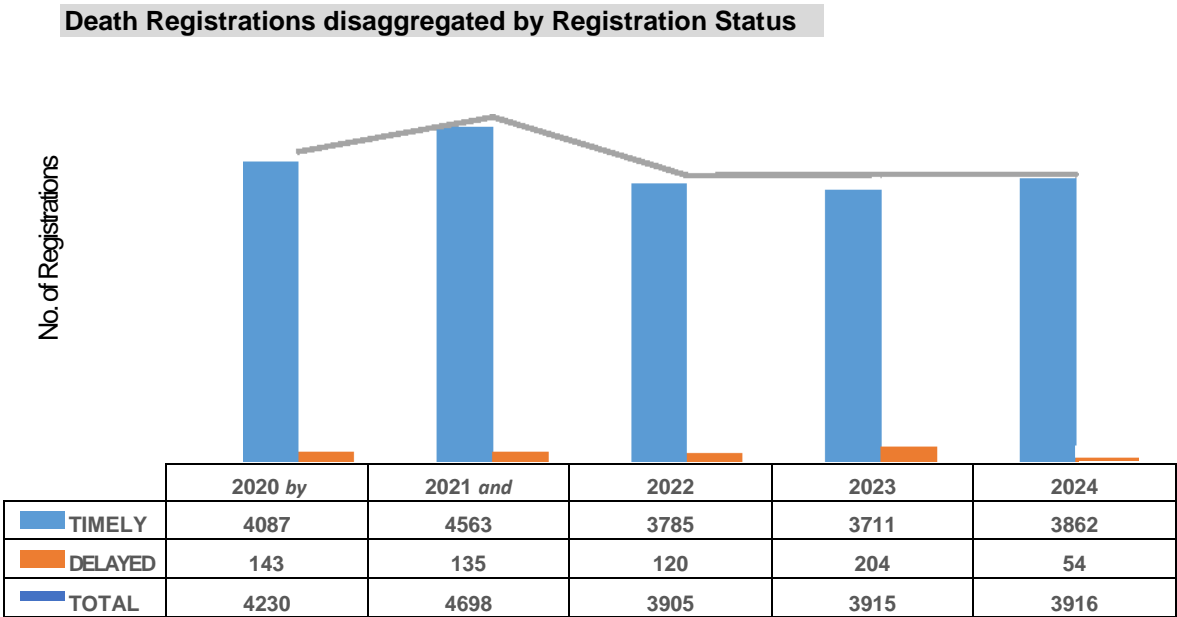
Figure 17.4. Bar Graph Of 2020-2024 Death Registrations by Gender and Residency

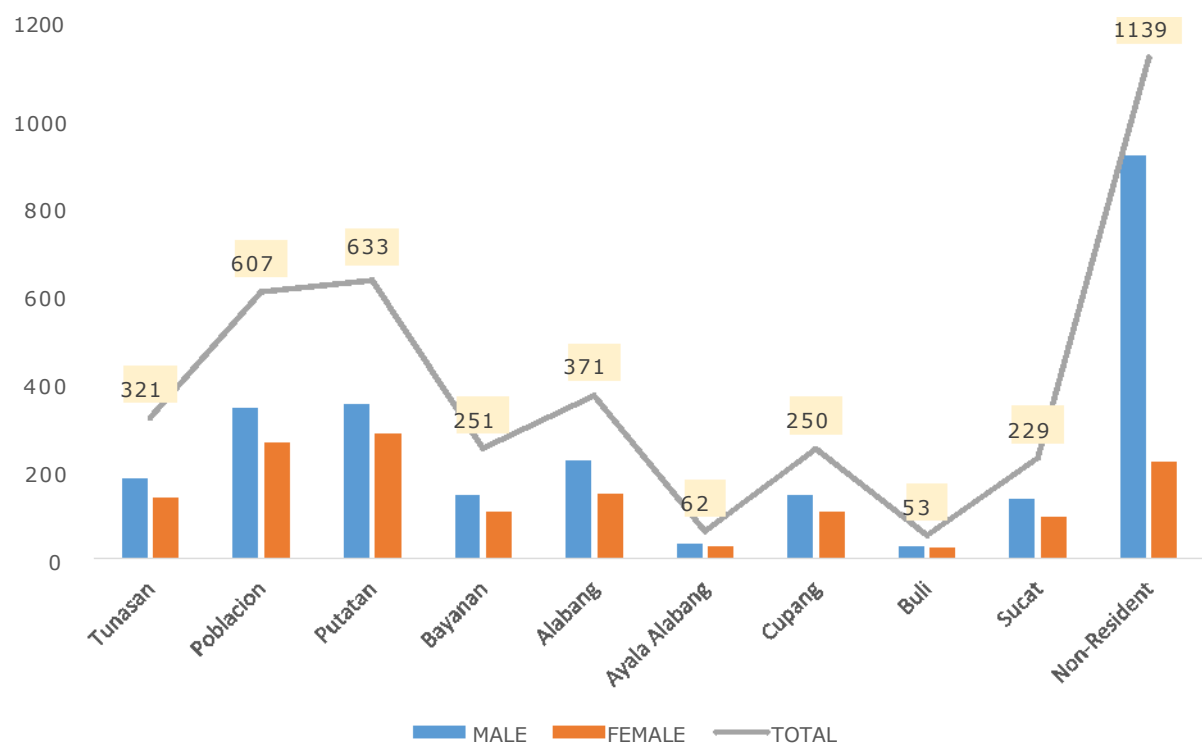


Figure 19.1. Bar Graph of 2024 Death Registrations by Barangay and Gender

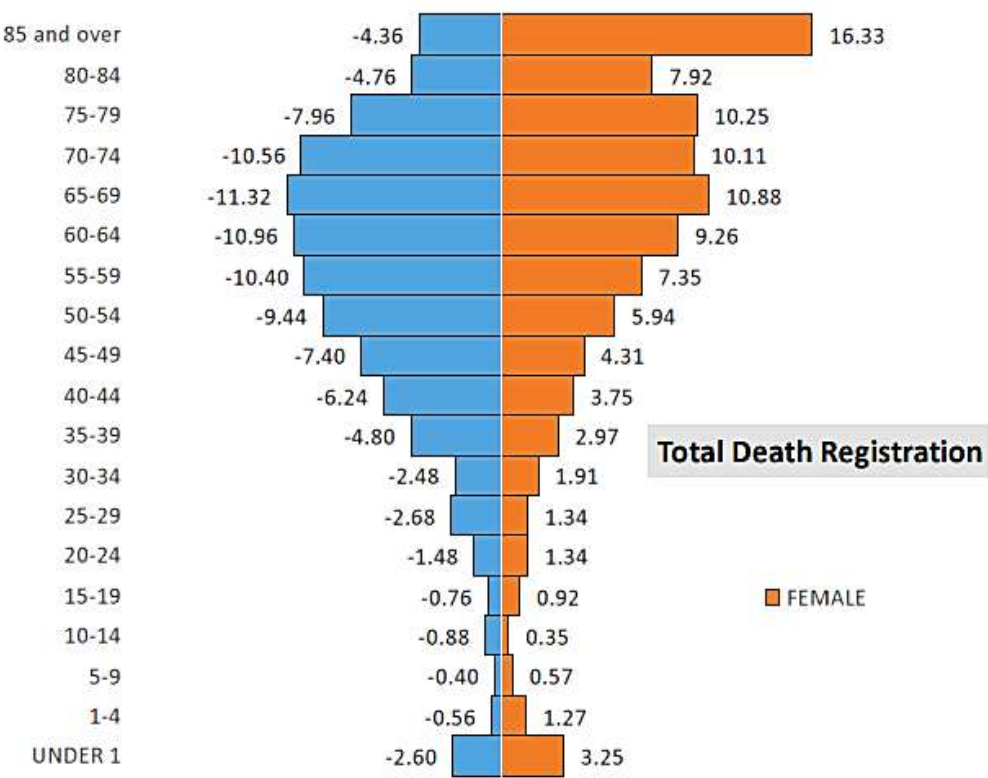


Figure 20.1. Population Pyramid of 2024 Death Registrations by Age Group and Sex

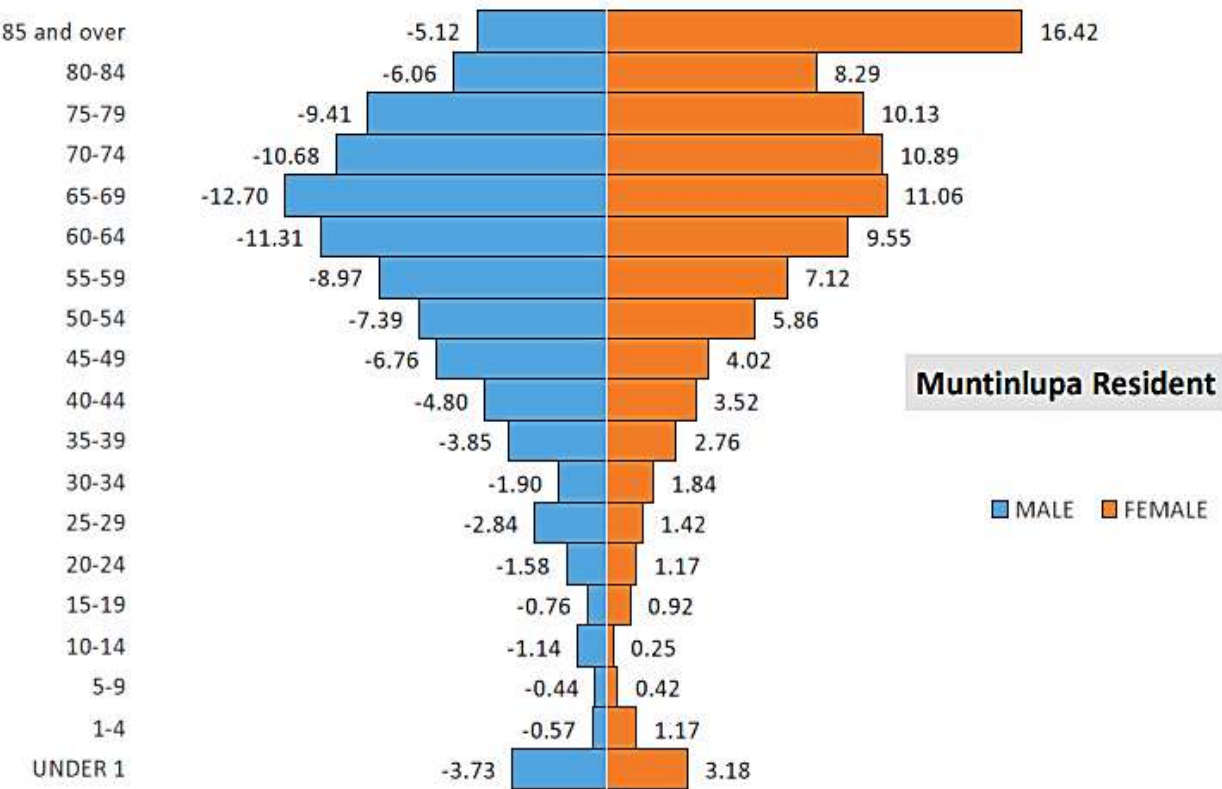


Figure 20.2. Population Pyramid of 2024 Death Registrations of Muntinlupa Residents by Age Group and Sex

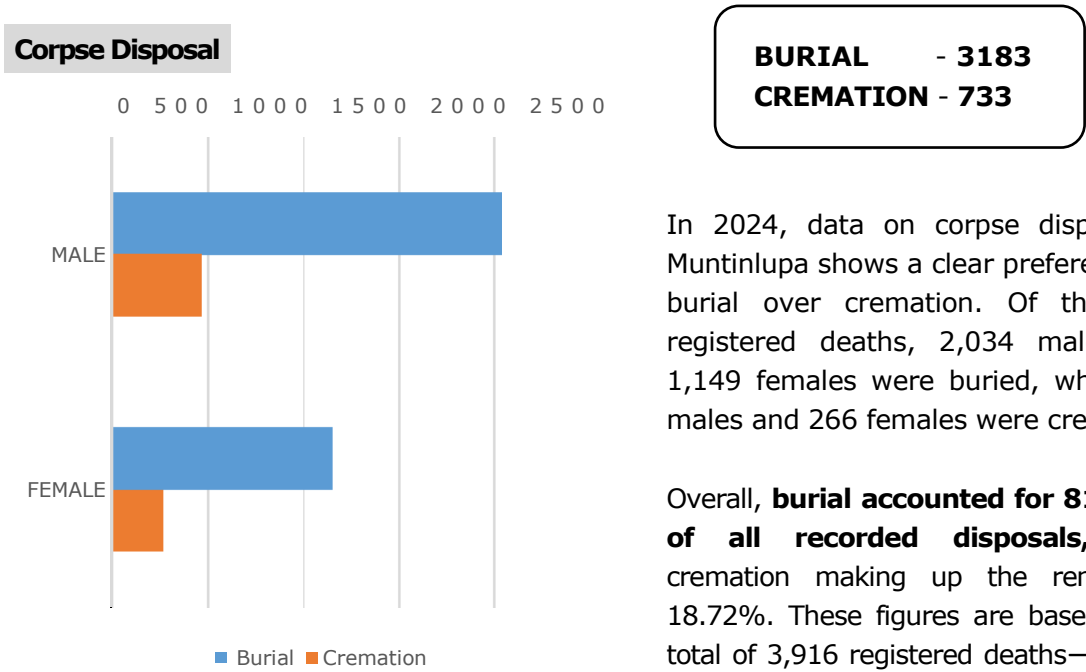


Figure 21.1. Bar Graph of 2024 Death Registrations by Corpse Disposal and Gender

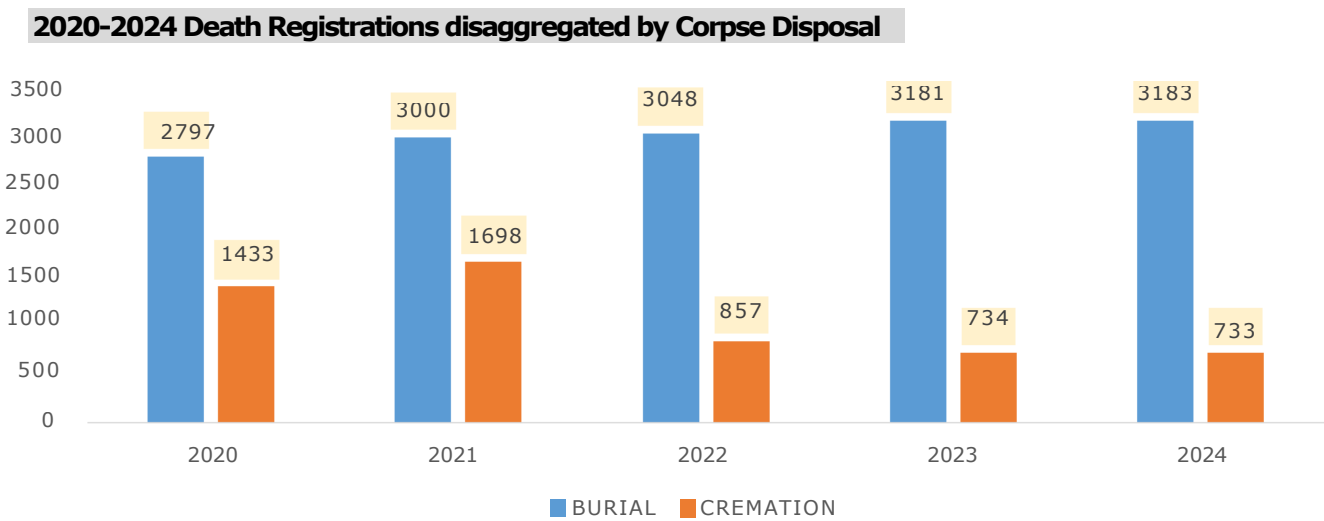


Figure 21.2. Bar Graph of 2020-2024 Death Registrations by Corpse Disposal

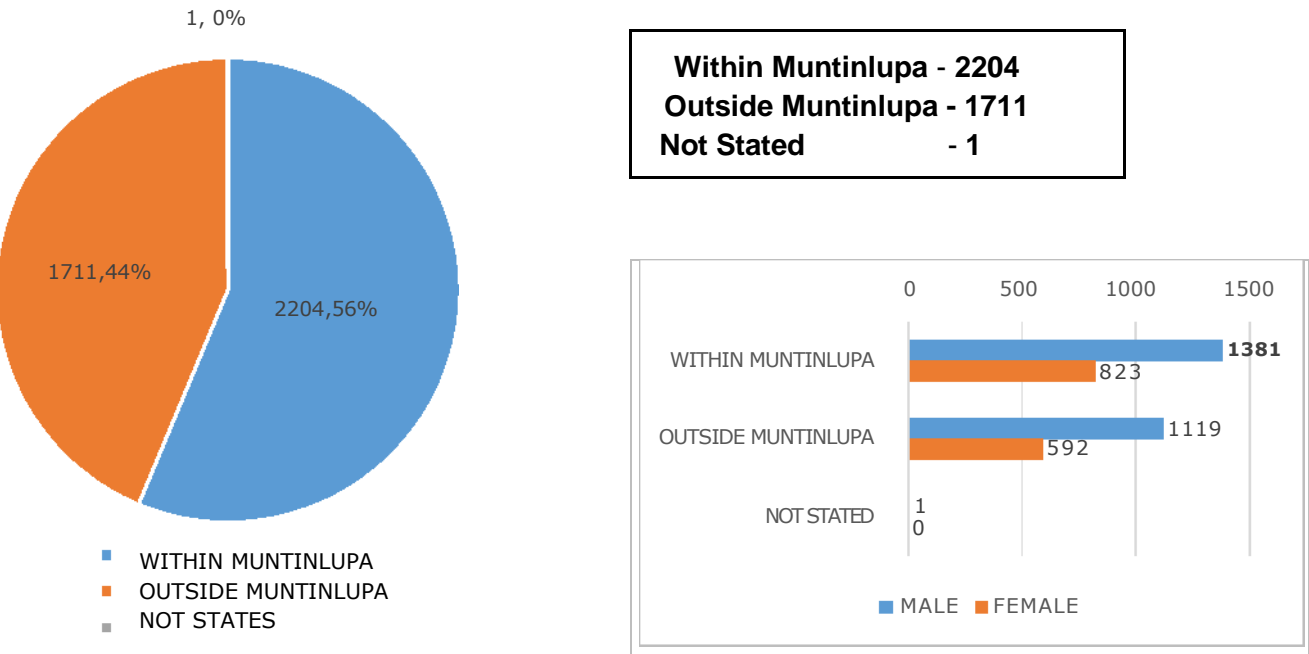


Figure 22.1. Pie Chart of 2024 Death Registrations by Place of Corpse Disposal

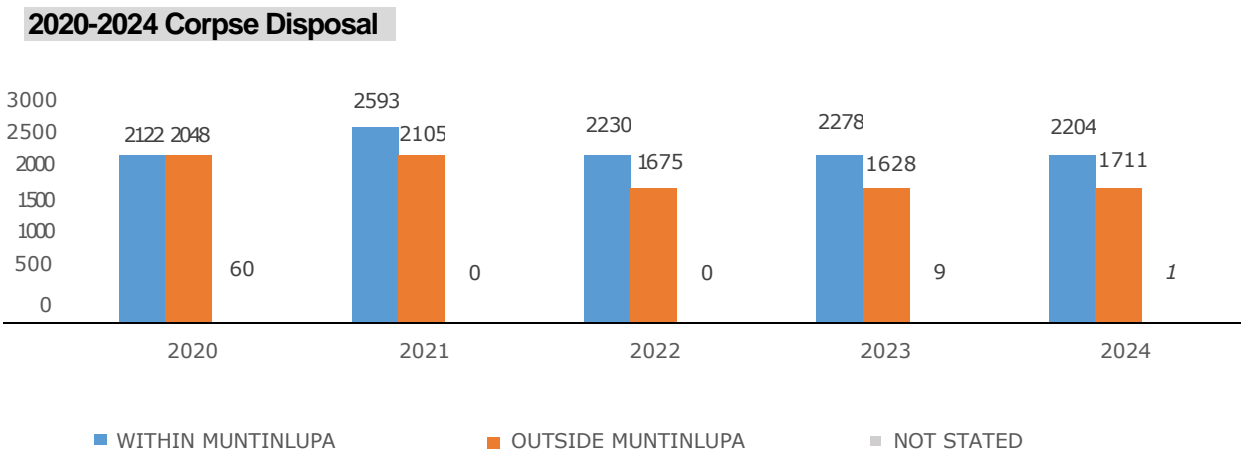
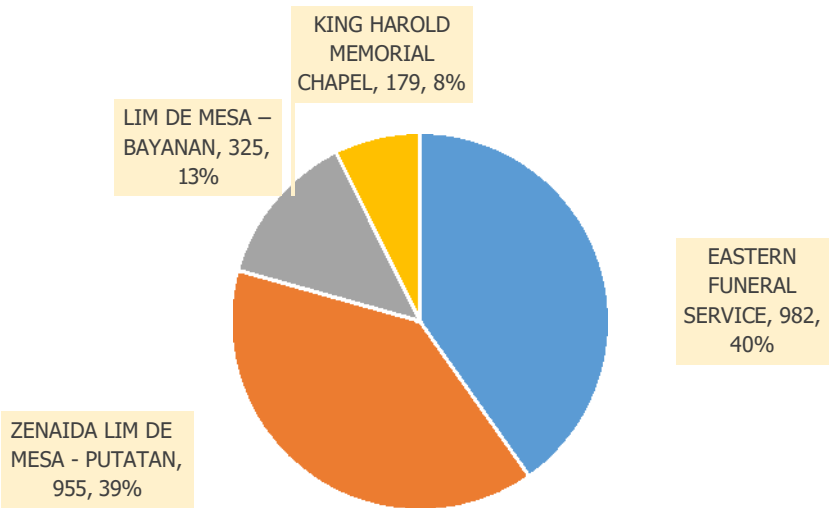


Figure 22.3. Bar Graph of 2020-2024 Death Registrations by Place of Corpse Disposal

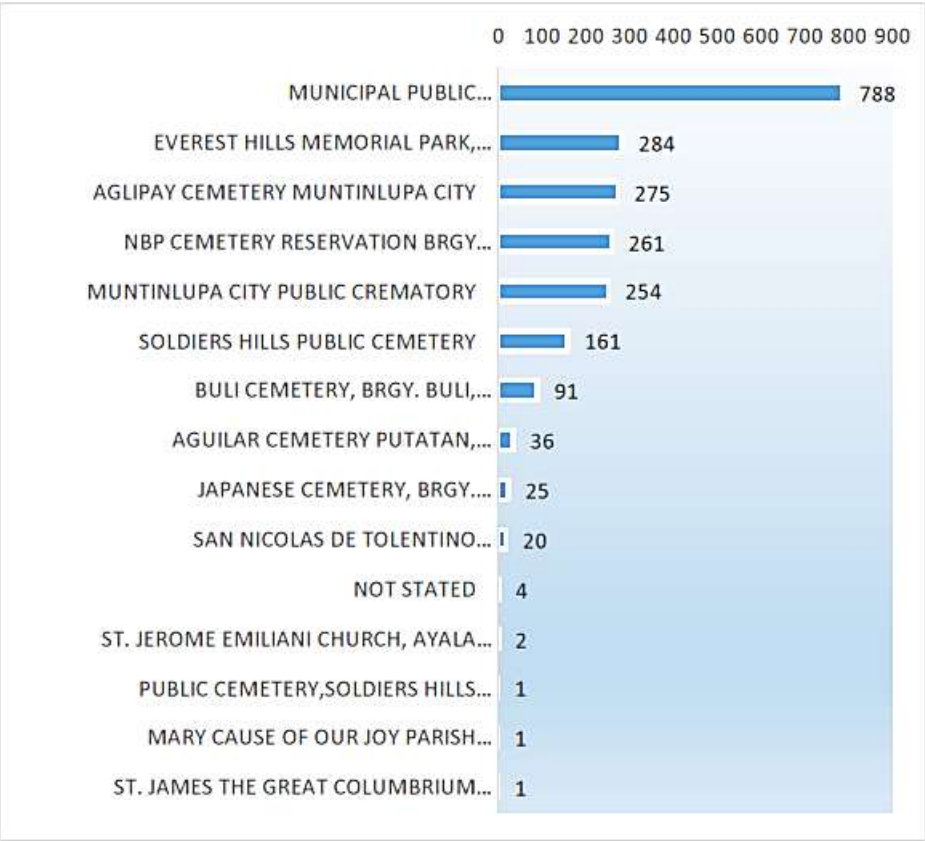


Figure 24.1. Bar Graph of 2024 Death Registrations by Place of Cemetery

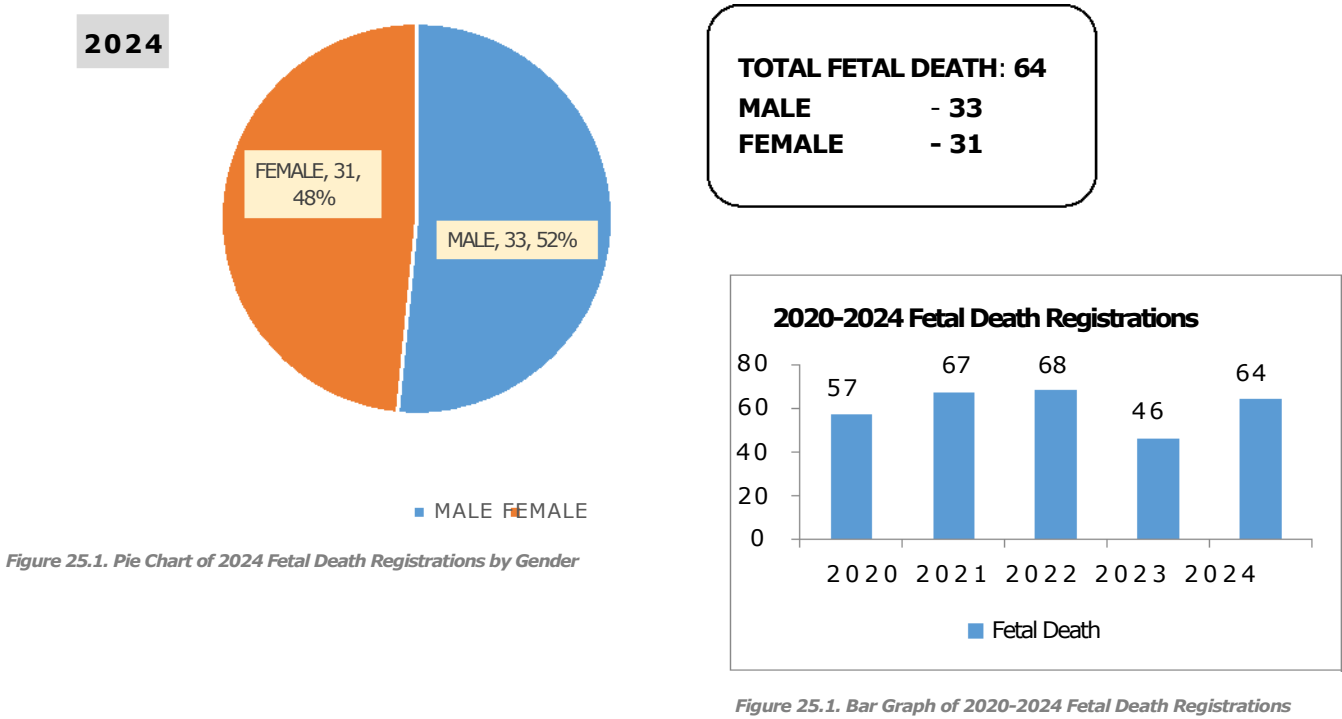

## MARRIAGE REGISTRATION

Marriage is a special contract of permanent union between a man and a woman entered into in accordance with law for the establishment of conjugal and family life. It is the foundation of the family and an inviolable social institution whose nature, consequence, and incidents are governed by law and not subject to stipulation, except that marriage settlements may fix the property relations during the marriage within the limits provided by this code.

- *Executive Order No. 209 also known as THE FAMILY CODE OF THE PHILIPPINES*

**Essential requisite:**

- a. Legal Capacity of the contracting parties who must be a male and a female;*
- b. Consent is freely given in the presence of the solemnizing officer*

**Formal requisite:**

- a. Authority of the solemnizing officer*
- b. Valid Marriage license except in the cases specially provided in the Family Code*
- c. A marriage ceremony takes place with the appearance of the contracting parties before the solemnizing officer and their declaration that they take each other as husband and wife in the presence of not less than two witnesses of legal age.*

**A. w/ Marriage License** - within 15 days from the date of marriage

**B. w/ Article 34 (Cohabitation)** - within 30 days

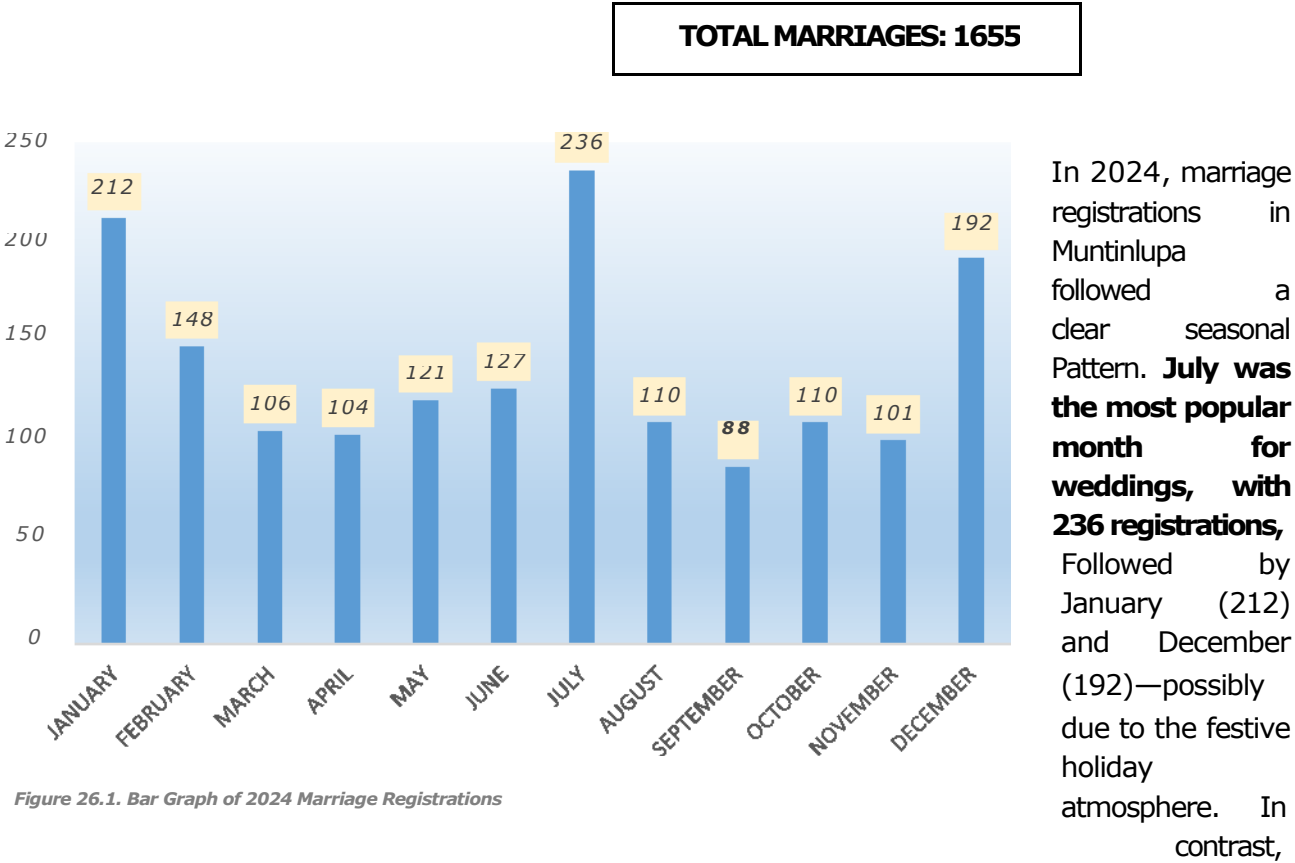


Figure 26.1. Bar Graph of 2024 Marriage Registrations

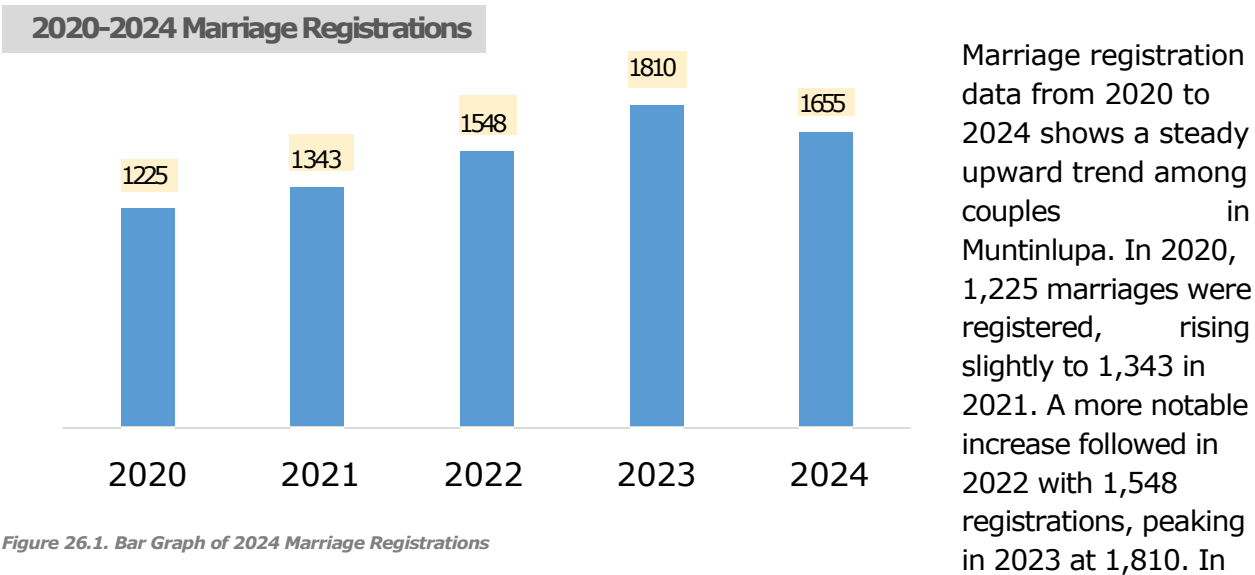


Figure 26.1. Bar Graph of 2024 Marriage Registrations

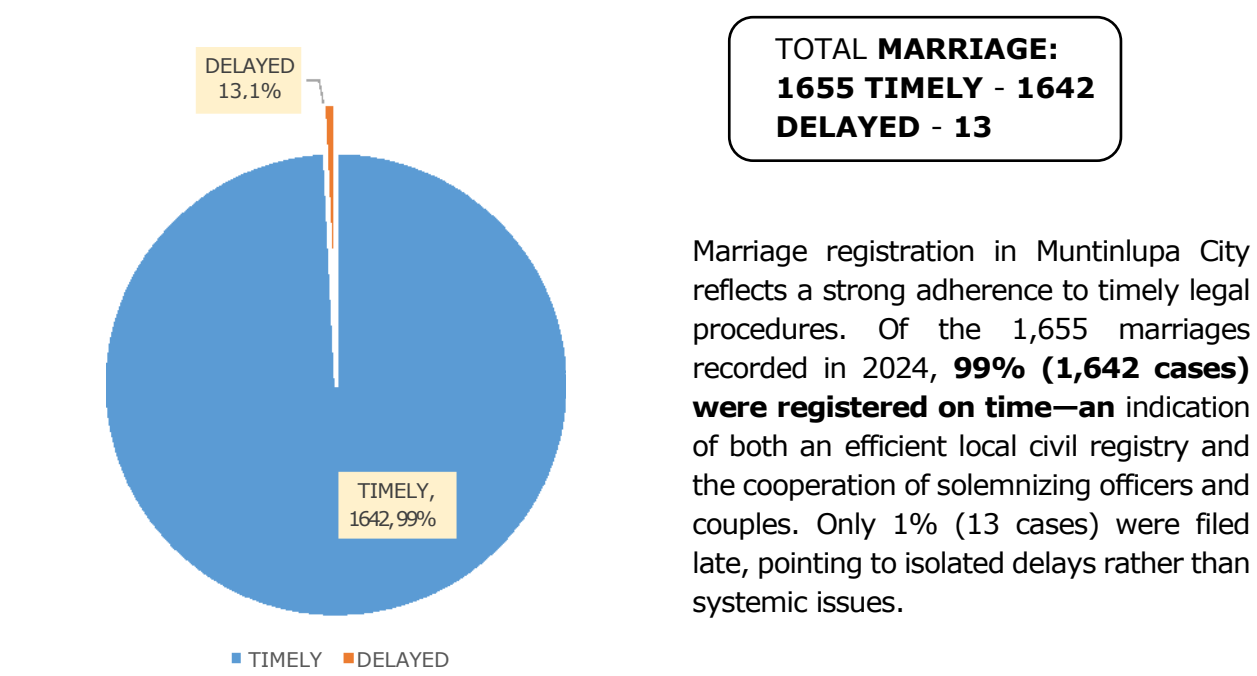


Figure 27.1. Pie Chart of 2024 Marriage Registrations by Filing Status

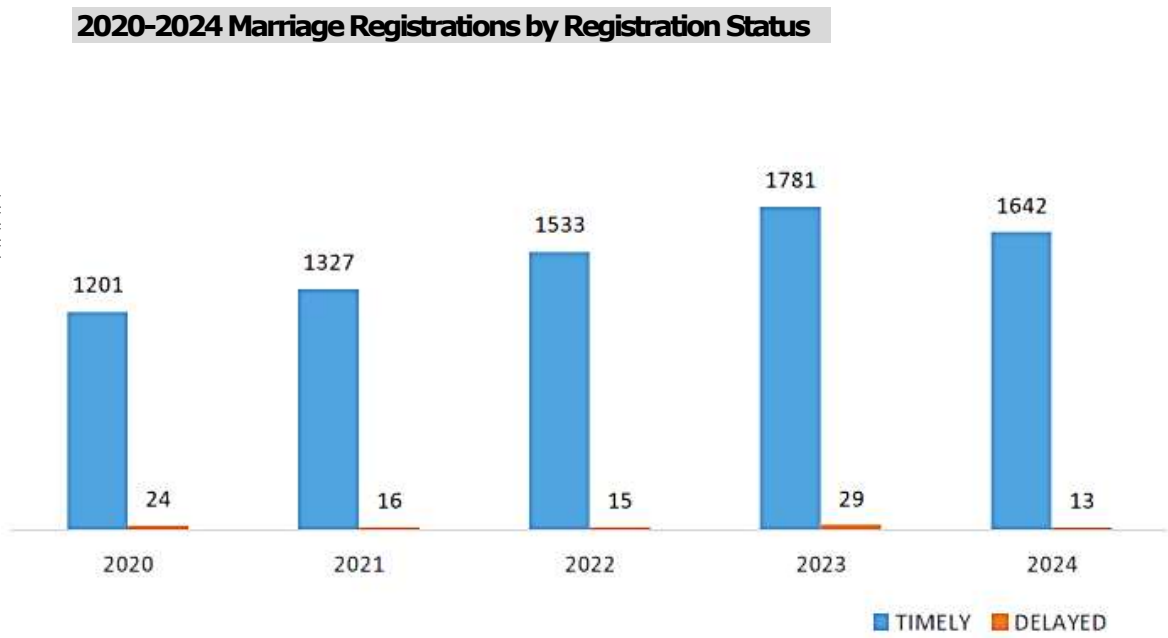


Figure 27.2. Bar Graph of 2020-2024 Marriage Registrations by Filing Status

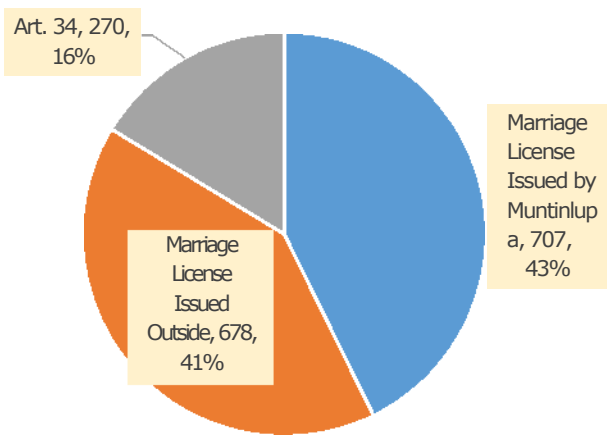


Figure 28.1. Pie Chart of 2024 Marriage Registrations by Certification of Solemnizing Officer

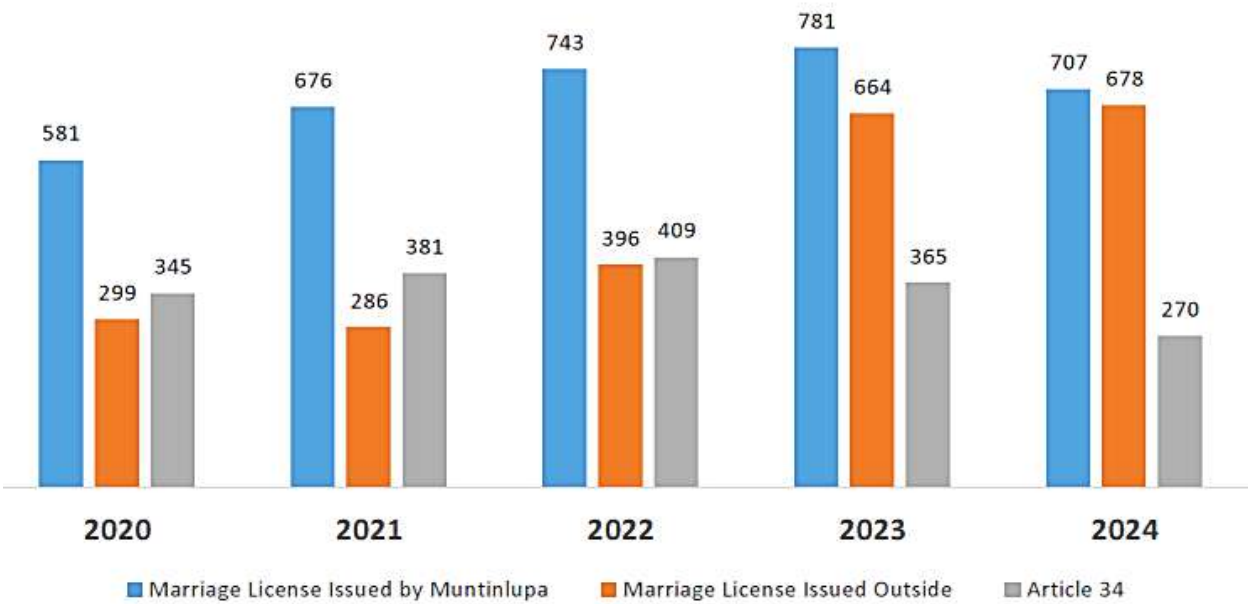
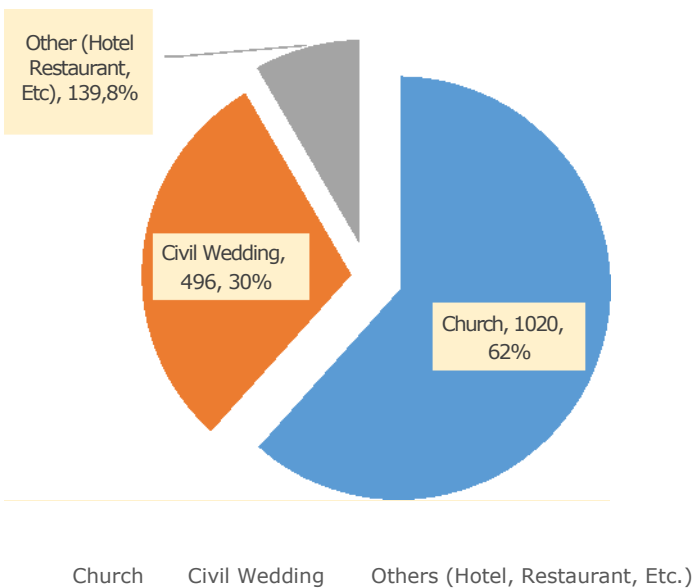


Figure 28.2. Bar Graph of 2020-2024 Marriage Registrations by Certification of Solemnizing Officer

Figure 29.1. Pie Chart of 2024 Marriage Registrations by Place of Ceremony

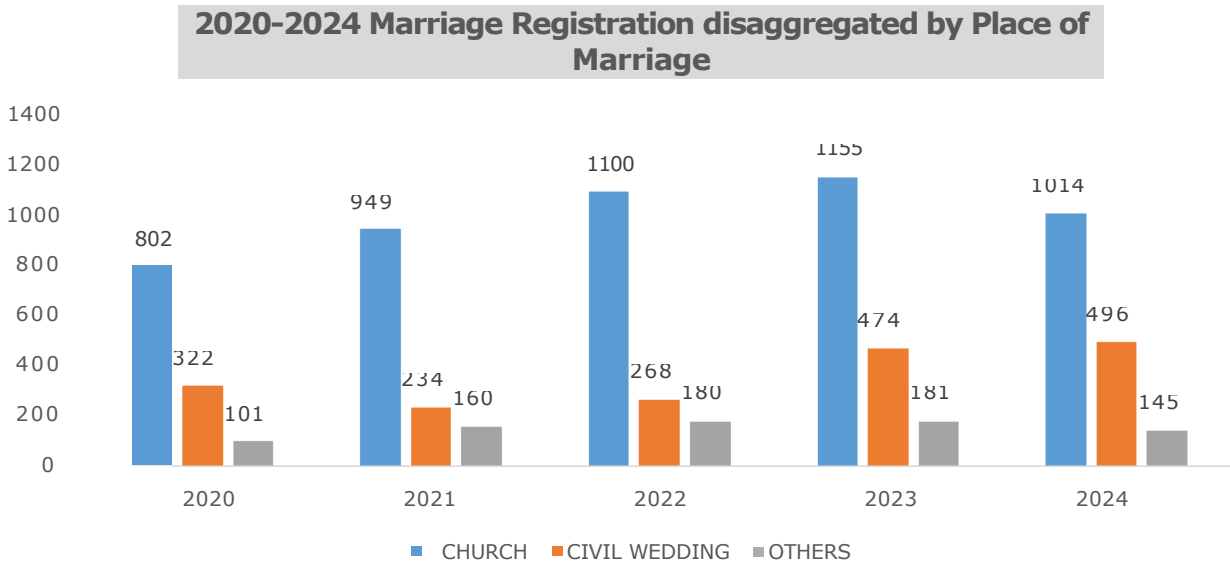


Figure 29.2. Bar Graph of 2020-2024 Marriage Registrations by Place of Ceremony

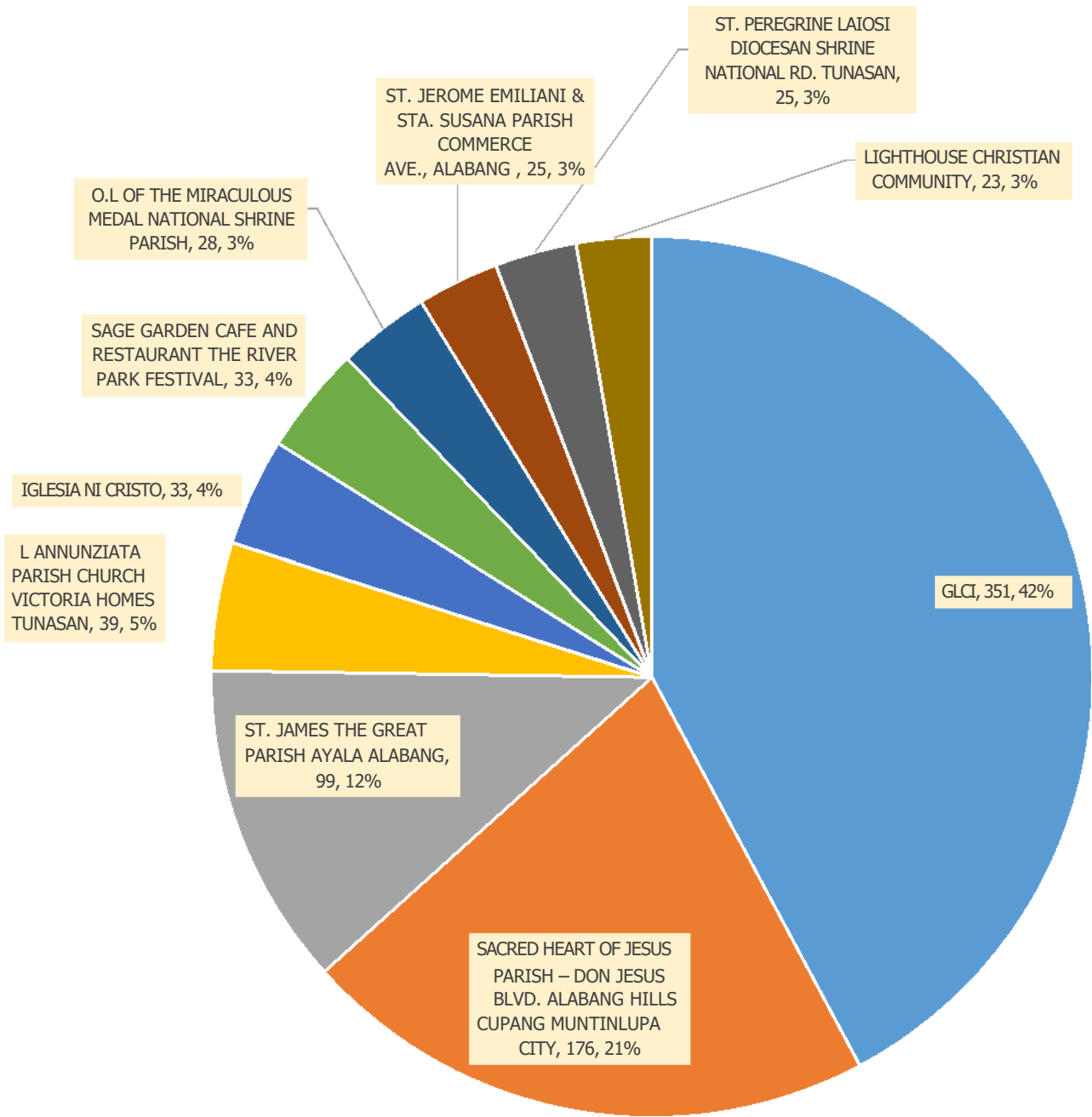


Figure 30.1. Pie Chart of 2024 Top 10 Church Wedding Place

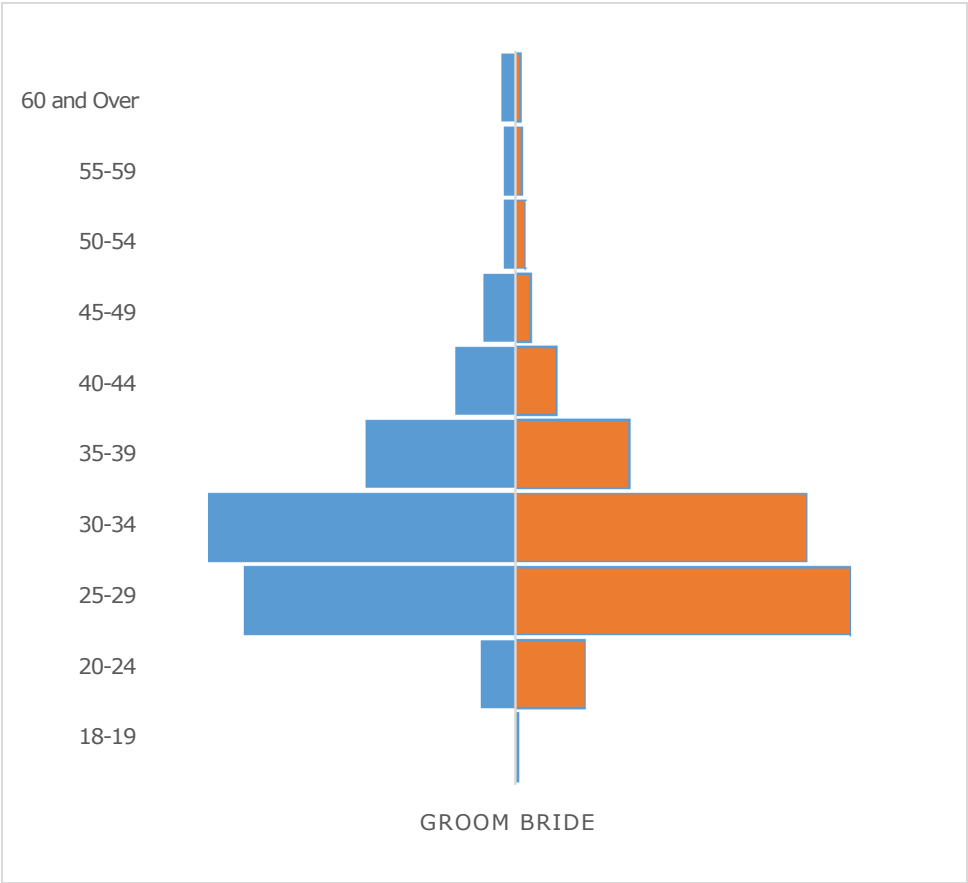


Figure 30.1. Population Pyramid of 2024 Marriage Registrations by Age Group and Sex

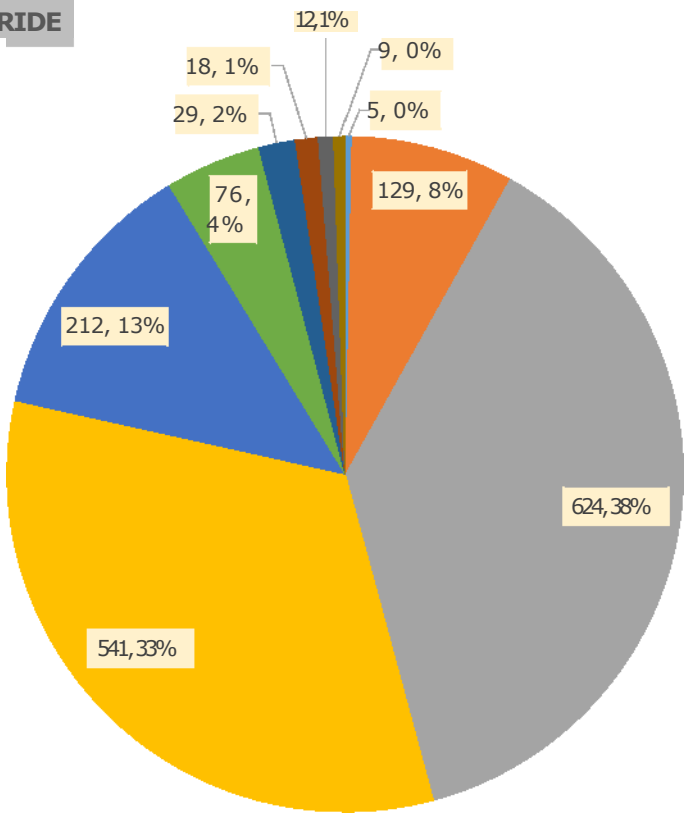


Figure 30.2. Pie Chart of 2024 Marriage Registrations by Age group of Bride

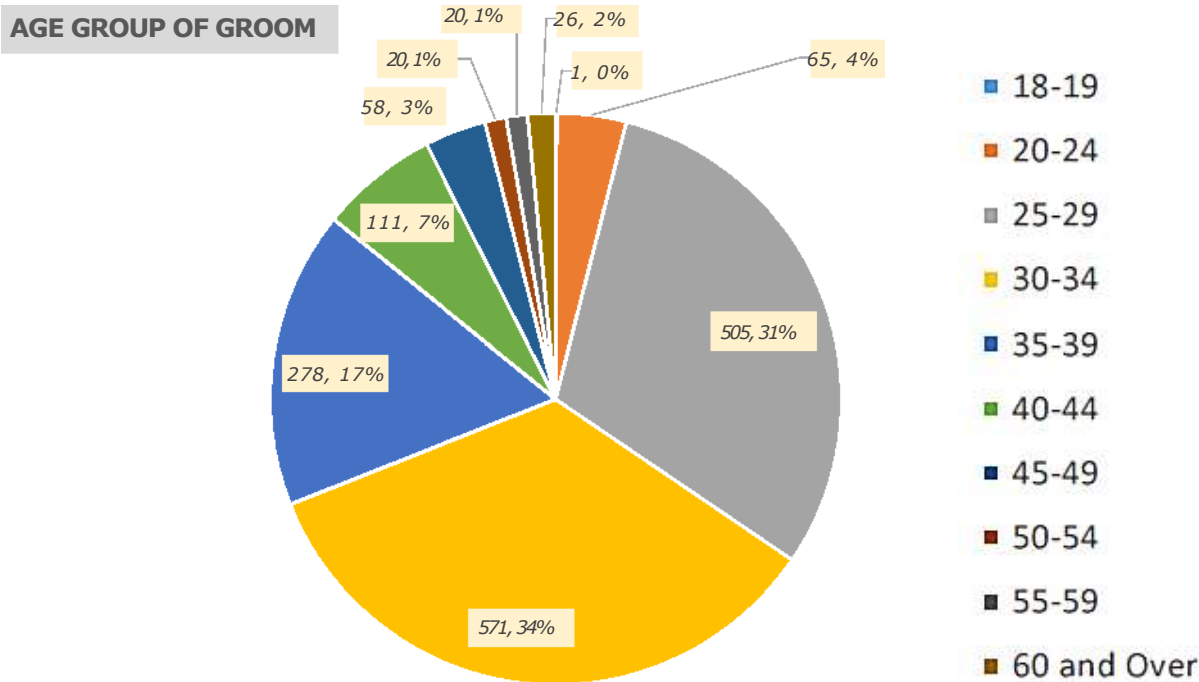


Figure 30.3. Pie Chart of 2024 Marriage Registrations by Age group of Groom

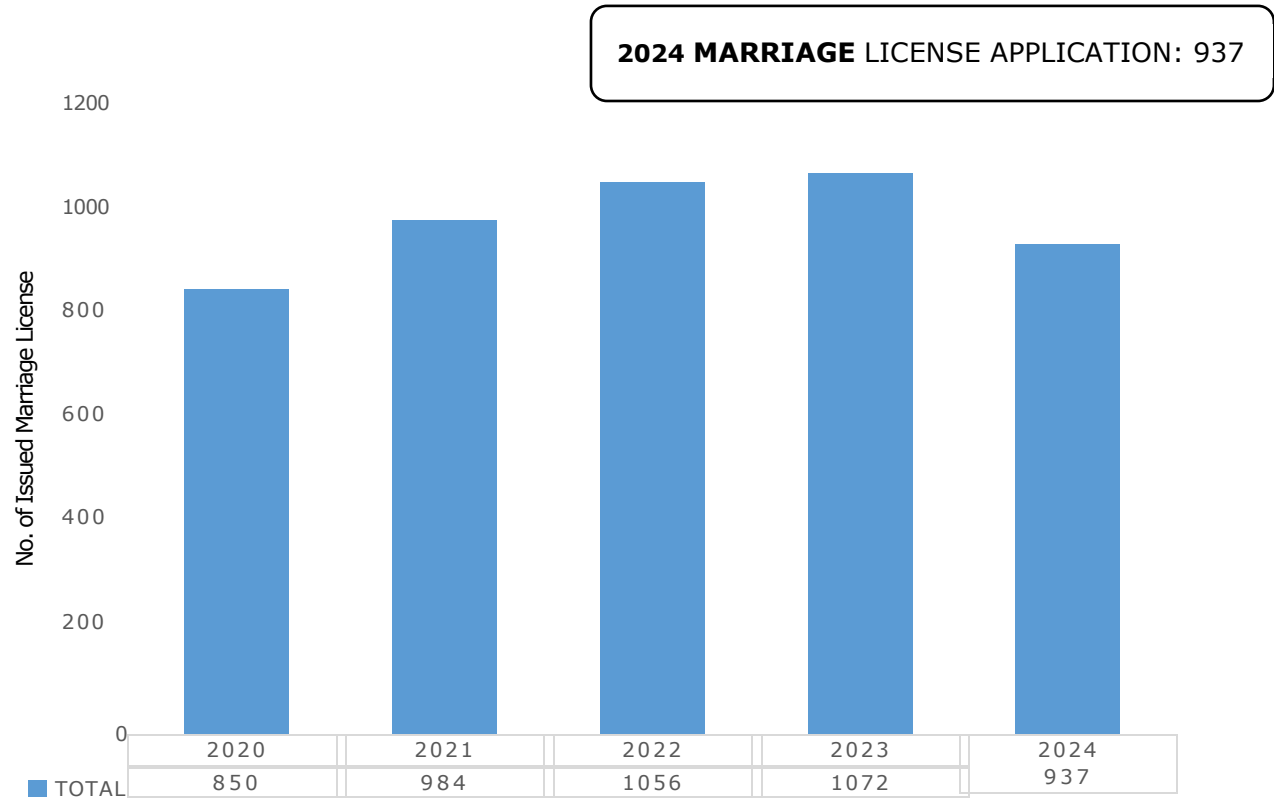


Figure 31.1. Bar Graph of 2020-2024 of Marriage License Applications

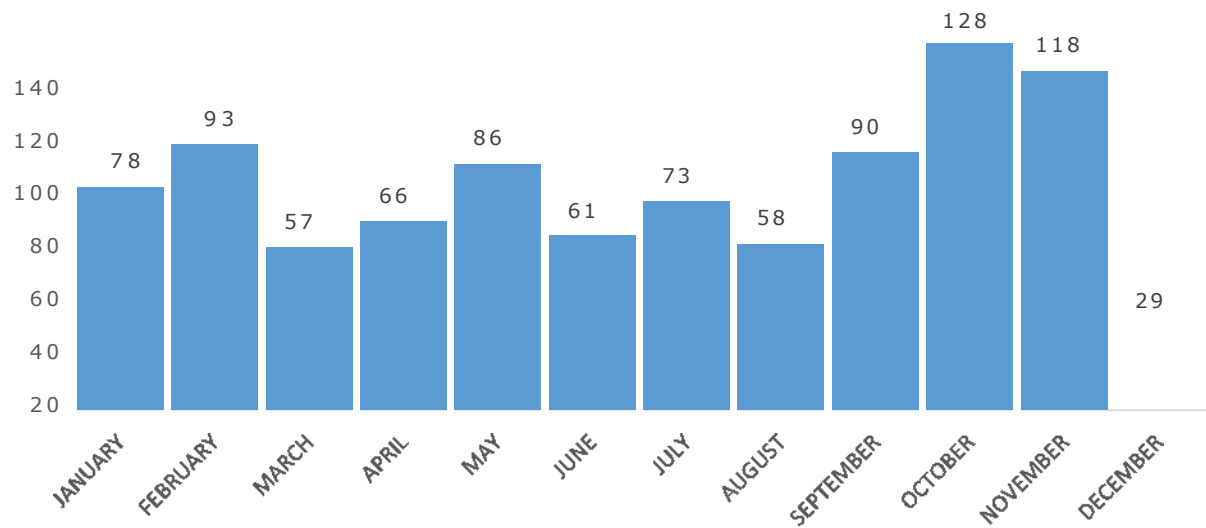


Figure 31.2. Bar Graph of 2024 of Marriage License Applications

In 2024, marriage license applications in Muntinlupa City showed a clear seasonal pattern. No entry in a civil register shall be changed or corrected without a judicial order, except for clerical or typographical errors and change of first name or nickname, the day and month in the date of birth or sex of a person where it is patently clear that there was a clerical or typographical error or mistake in the entry, which can be corrected or changed by the concerned city or municipal civil registrar or consul general in accordance with the provisions of this Act and its implementing rules and regulations."

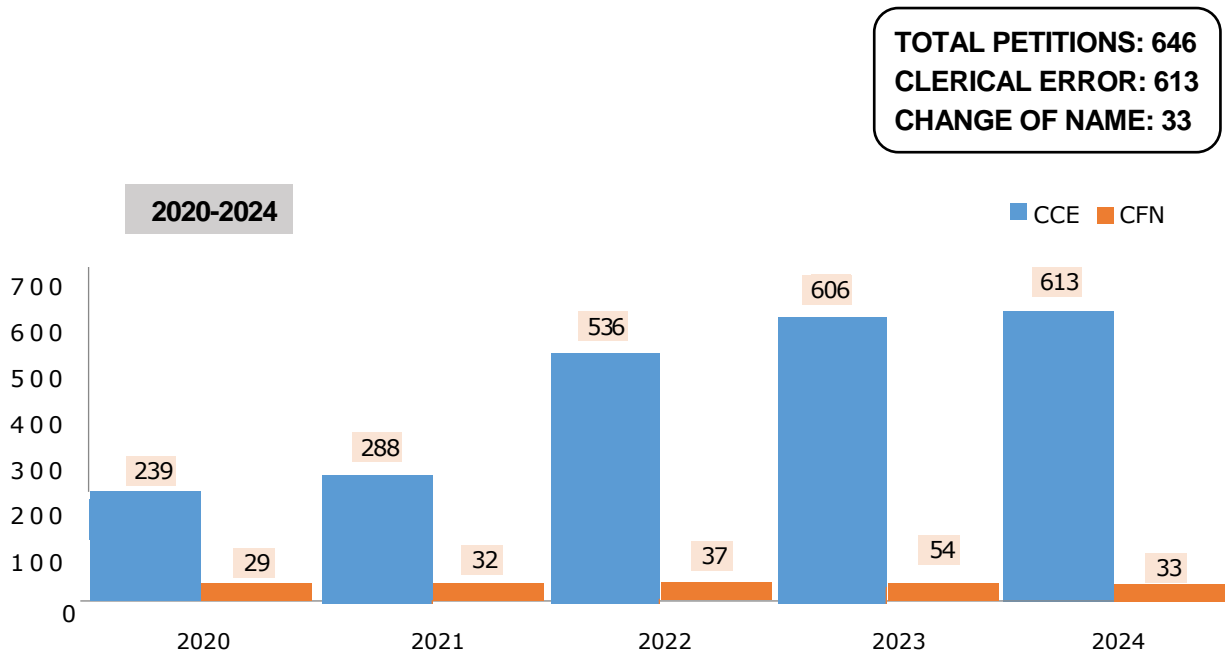


Figure 32.1. Bar Graph of 2020-2024 Total Number of R.A.9048 and R.A.10172 Petitions

From 2020 to 2024, Muntinlupa City recorded a steady increase in petitions for the **Correction of Clerical Error (CCE)**, rising from **239 in 2020 to 613 in 2024**. This upward trend points to a growing need to amend inaccuracies in civil registry documents. In contrast, **Change of Name (CFN)** petitions remained relatively low and inconsistent, peaking at **54 in 2023** before declining to **33 in 2024**. Over the five years, a total of **675 petitions** were processed, with **CCE filings making up the vast majority**. **Figure 32.1** illustrates these trends, highlighting the sharp rise in CCE cases compared to the more erratic pattern of CFN filings.

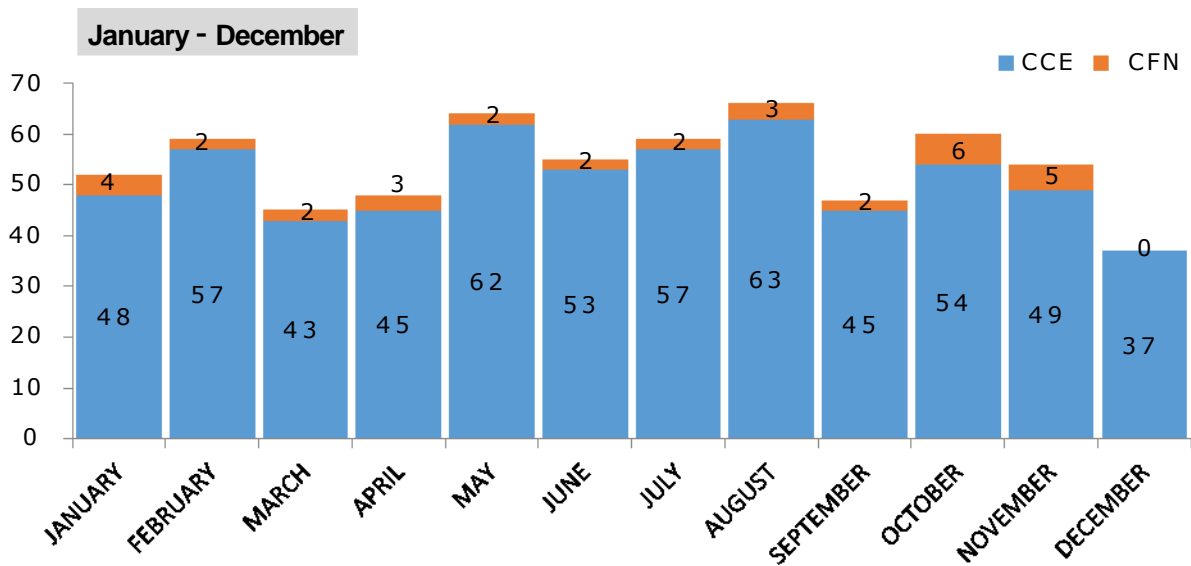


Figure 32.2. Bar Graph of 2024 Total Number of R.A.9048 and R.A.10172 Petitions

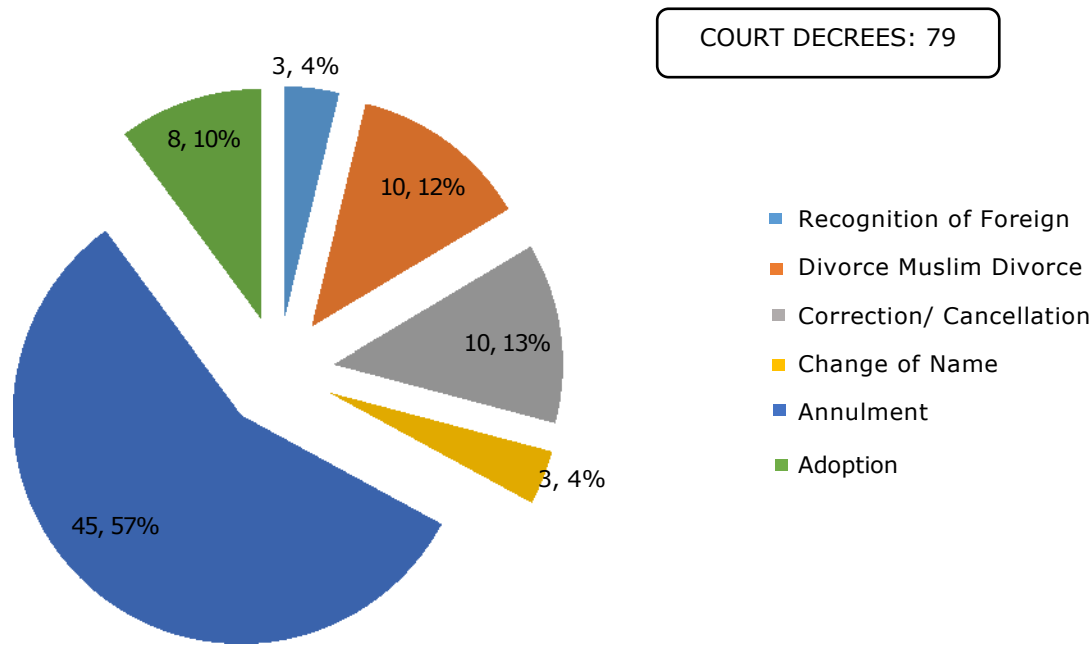


Figure 33.1. Bar Graph of 2024 Total Number of Judicial Decrees/ Court Orders

In 2024 alone, Muntinlupa City registered a total of **79 Judicial Decrees and Court Orders**. The most common were **Annulment cases**, making up 57% of the total, or **45 cases**. **Muslim Divorce** and **Correction or Cancellation** followed, with **10 cases each (13%)**. **Change of Name** came next with **8 cases (10%)**, while **Recognition of Foreign Divorce** and **Adoption** were the least common, with only **3 cases each (4%)**.

As shown in **Figure 33.1**, annulment cases dominated the court orders filed in 2024—possibly pointing to a steady demand for local legal remedies for marriage dissolution.

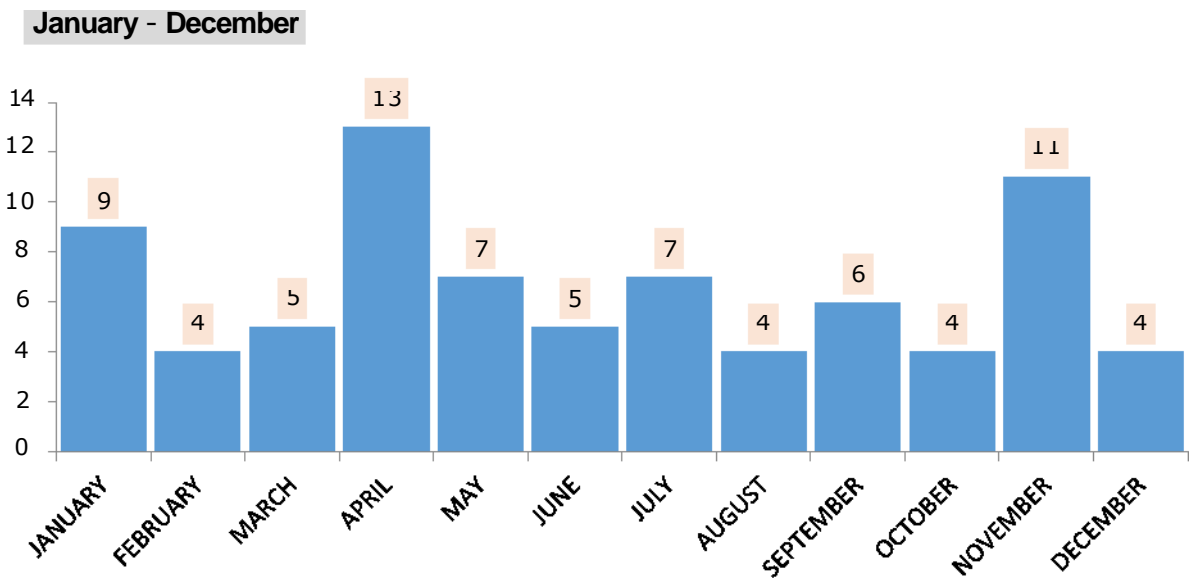
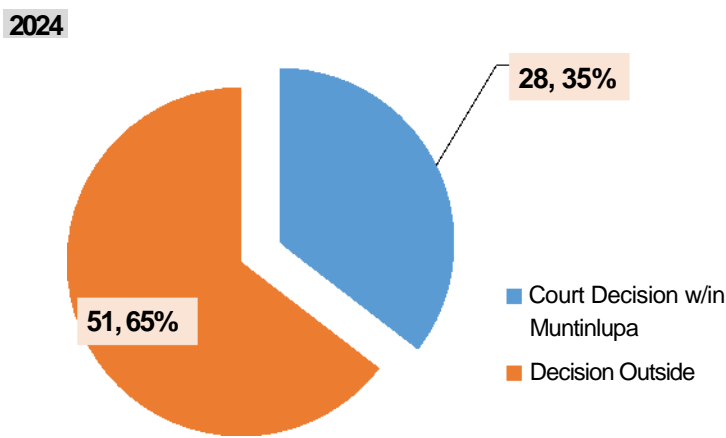


Figure 33.2. 2024 Bar Graph of 2024 Total Number of Judicial Decrees/ Court Orders by Month

2. Disaggregated by the Origin of Judicial Decision



In 2024, most of the judicial decisions registered in Muntinlupa City—65% or 51 cases—actually came from courts outside the city. Only 28 decisions (35%) originated from within Muntinlupa itself. As shown in Figure 32.3, this suggests that many residents are bringing in court rulings from other jurisdictions, perhaps due to residence changes or legal proceedings

2020-2024 Total Number of Judicial Decrees/ Court Orders by Origin

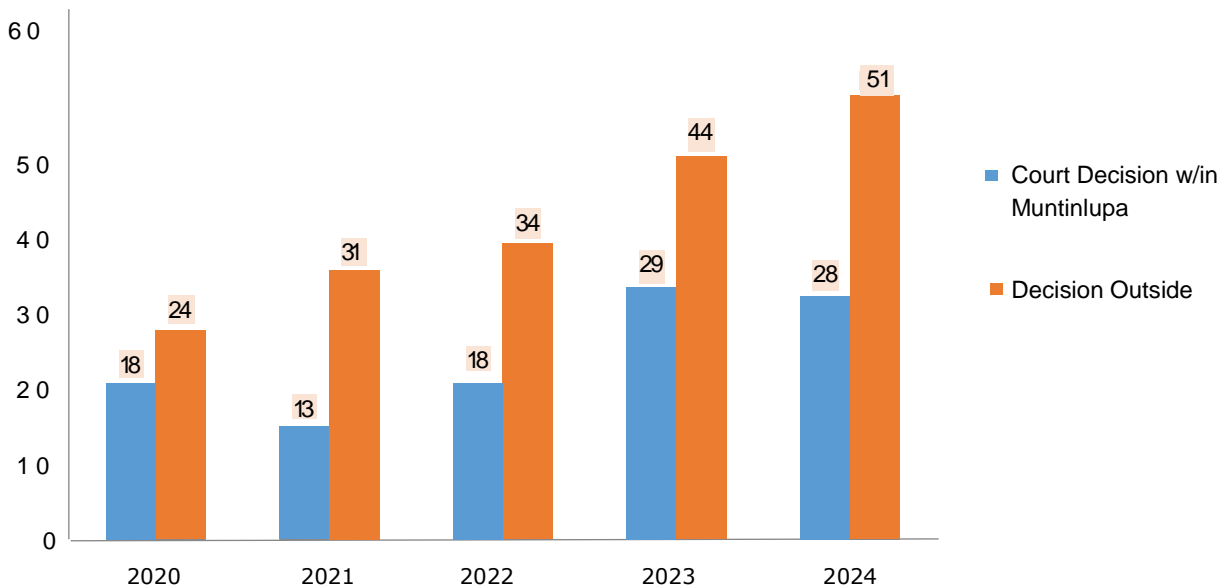


Figure 33.3. 2024 Bar Graph of 2024 Total Number of Judicial Decrees/ Court Orders by Month

From 2020 to 2024, more judicial decisions registered in Muntinlupa City came from outside the city than from local courts. While locally issued decisions varied year to year—dropping to 13 in 2021 and peaking at 29 in 2023—those from outside Muntinlupa steadily climbed, starting at 24 in 2020 and reaching 51 in 2024.

As shown in Figure 33.3, this trend points to a growing number of court rulings from other areas being brought in for registration, possibly due to residents undergoing legal proceedings outside the city.

## REGISTRATION OF LEGAL INSTRUMENTS (L.I.)

AS A GENERAL rule, all legal instruments concerning civil registry documents must be registered in the civil registry of the place where they were executed. The following, however, may be registered in the following places:

- Affidavit of Reappearance – where the parties to the subsequent marriage are residing;
- Marriage Settlement – where the marriage was recorded
- Admission of Paternity; and
- Acknowledgement; Legitimation; Voluntary Emancipation of Minor; Parental Authorization or Ratification of Artificial Insemination – where the birth of the child was recorded

Not falling under the aforementioned exceptions are the following registrable instruments:

- Acknowledgement
- Acquisition of citizenship
- Certificate of legal capacity of contract marriage
- Option to elect Philippine citizenship
- Partition and distribution of properties of spouses and delivery of the children’s legitimate; and
- Waiver of rights interests of absolute community.

All legal instruments executed abroad shall be registered in the **civil registry office of Manila.**

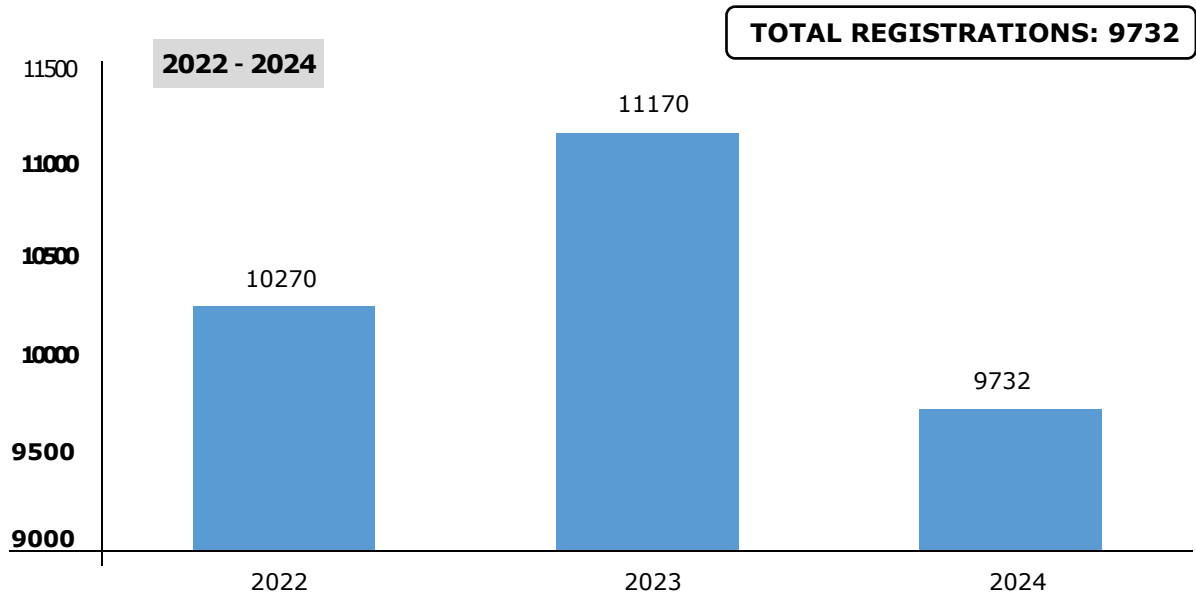


Figure 34.1. Bar Graph of 2022-2024 Total Number of Registered Legal Instruments

**Figure 34.1** shows how the **number of legal** instruments registered in **Muntinlupa City** **changed** from **2022 to 2024**. There was a noticeable increase in 2023, with registrations rising from **10,270** in 2022 to **11,170**. But in 2024, the numbers dipped to **9,732**, **even** lower than they were two years earlier.

So while there was some growth at first, the drop in 2024 suggests a possible slowdown in registrations that year.

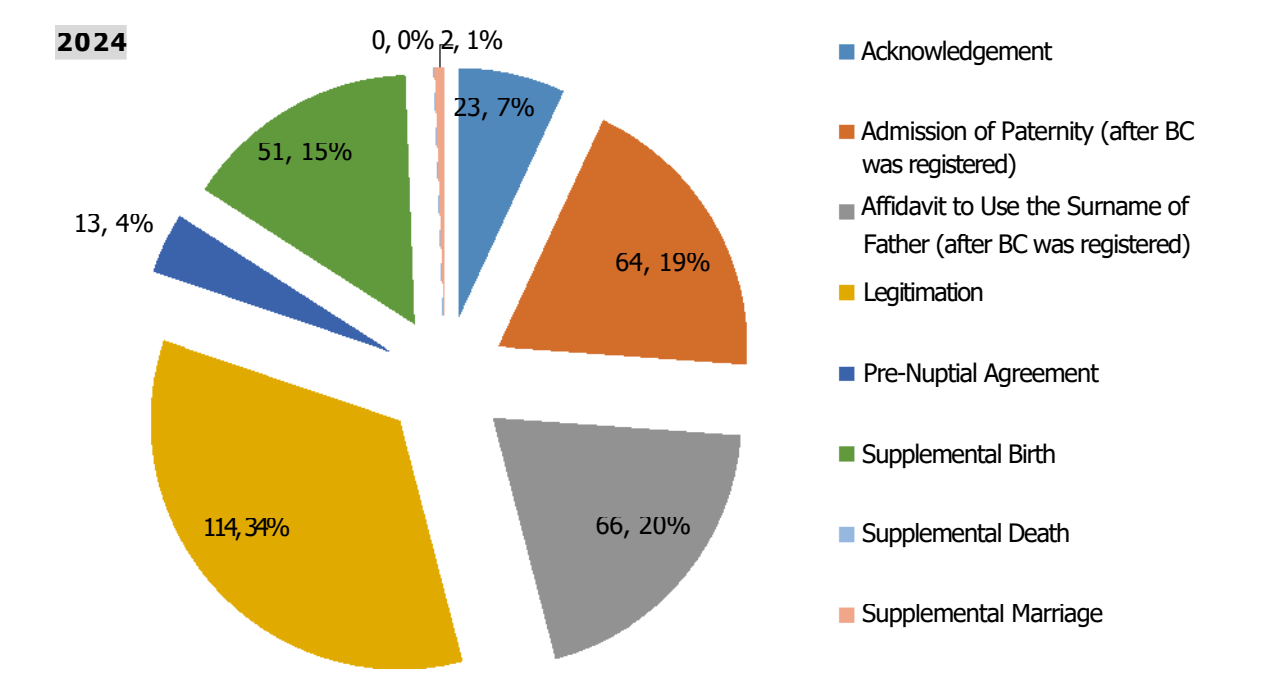


Figure 34.2. Pie Chart of 2024 Total Number of Registered Legal Instruments

In 2024, various legal instruments were registered in **Muntinlupa City**, excluding timely birth registrations.

**Legitimation** made up the largest share, with **114 cases** or **34%** of the total. Next were **Affidavits to Use the Surname of the Father** and **Admissions of Paternity**—filed after birth registration—accounting for **66 cases (20%)** and **64 cases (19%)**, respectively.

**Supplemental Birth registrations** followed with **51 cases (15%)**, while **Acknowledgements** and **Pre-Nuptial Agreements** made up smaller portions, at 7% (**23 cases**) and 4% (**13 cases**). As for the rest, only **2 Supplemental Death** entries and **no Supplemental Marriage** registrations were recorded.

Overall, most legal instruments filed in 2024 were related to correcting or completing birth records after registration—particularly through legitimation and paternal acknowledgment.

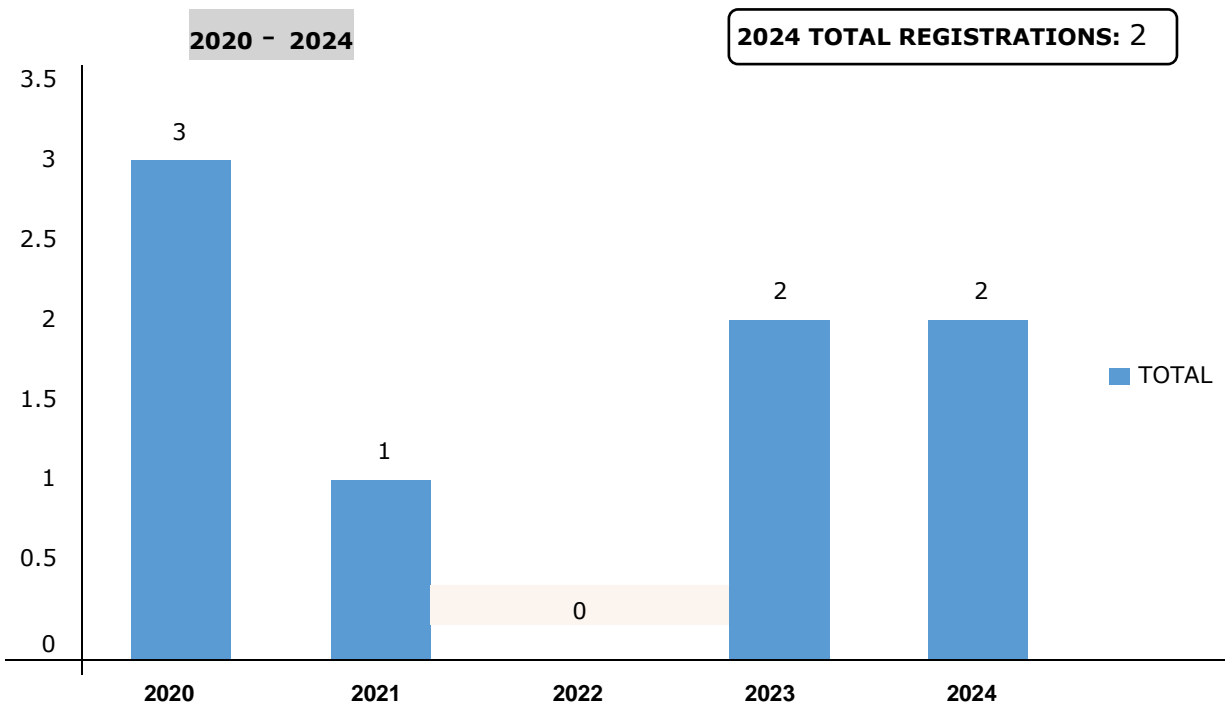


Figure 35. Bar Graph Of 2020-2024 Foundling Registrations
